A. Call to Order and Introductions

The meeting was called to order by President Dady at 1:03 pm CST. President Dady read the Board of Pharmacy mission statement, followed by introductions of Board Members, Board Staff and meeting attendees. Roll call was taken; a quorum was present.

B. Consent Agenda

Executive Director Shanard-Koenders briefly reviewed the components of the consent agenda noting that any item could be removed from the consent agenda for discussion. Motion to approve consent agenda was made by Board Member Rave and seconded by Board Member Somsen. Roll call vote and motion carried unanimously.

C. Staff Reports

1. Staff Reports

The Executive Director introduced Tyler Laetsch, Pharm. D., the newest addition to the Board of Pharmacy staff addition. Tyler will assume the position of Board Inspector and is currently training with retiring Board Inspector Gary Karel. Tyler is from Atkinson, NE, a 2009 Creighton University graduate, has worked in hospital and retail settings, and has just recently moved to Sioux Falls with his wife and two children.

2. Inspector Reports

a. Gary Karel

Reported the following observances/items during inspections:

- Outdates found in compounding area
- Staff pharmacist had expired immunization certificate
- Various compounding of powders with no powder hood for compounding
- Piles of dust and lint in pharmacy areas
- "Do no crush" list was not located by staff in a long-term care facility
- Pharmacy technicians with expired State of South Dakota registrations
- Unit dosing (repackaging) greater than one year from dating
- DEA 222 not attached to invoice/Pyxis refill report

- More chains are moving to computerized perpetual inventory for controlled substances; improved method for better tracking and auditing of prescriptions

b. Paula Stotz, Inspector

Reported the following observances/items during inspections:

- Currently revising/updating existing inspection forms
- Noted in pharmacies where audit inventories are conducted every other year, items are unaccounted for at higher rates; emphasizes/promotes conducting annual inventory, audits and perpetual inventories of all controlled substances.
- Pharmacies need to improve/be more exact when estimating tablet/capsule counts in bottles of 1,000; highly recommend exact counts for certain specific drugs (i.e. tramadol).

c. Carol Smith, Inspector

Reported the following observances/items during inspections:

- Continue to discuss with pharmacists what a “patient/client relationship” is as well as emphasize a relationship must be established/in place in order for a practitioner to access Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) information
- PDMP records/reports should never be printed or shared

d. Tyler Laetsch, Inspector

Reported the following observances/items during inspections:

- DEA numbers of both buying and selling pharmacies not on controlled substance invoices
- Medication outside of overwrap not dated in various locations
- Multiple outdates in fridge area
- Mislabeling of items-products outdates before date on label by pharmacy
- Open soda bottles in med room at long-term care facility not in fridge
- ISMP Med Alert (Feb '2018) - Zostavax versus Shingrix; errors made with storage and injections of immunizations

3. PDMP Report

Director Melissa DeNoon reported the following updates:

- In 2017, SDCL 34-20E-21 established the requirement that the Board of Pharmacy shall report on the use and monitoring of prescription opioids every January. On January 11 and 12, 2018, the PDMP Director presented to the SD Senate and House standing committees on health and human services.
- Noted the number of opioid prescriptions continue to decrease while the number of PDMP prescriber queries increase – an encouraging and positive trend. Factors contributing to increased utilization include: mandated prescriber registration, Avera Meditech/PDMP integration, PDMP system enhancements (clinical alerts and prescriber reports).
- For the past three years, opioid prescriptions have decreased in three key parameters: prescription count, total quantity, and total days of supply.
- With mandated enrollment completed, PDMP staff is shifting focus to program utilization.
- Number one error reported is prescriptions submitted under the wrong prescriber DEA number. Residents should use their own DEA number not hospital's DEA number.

- Pharmacies with a dispensing system not connected to point-of-sale have to complete an additional step to correct reporting errors to PDMP.
- Receiving positive feedback regarding takeback program
- Rolled-out two, new PDMP AWARe enhancements - **Clinical alerts** (provides alerts to practitioners on patients that meet one or more of three thresholds and **Prescriber reports** (a quarterly summary listing prescriber's last six months prescribing activities).
- Upcoming presentations – South Dakota Dental Association and South Dakota Police/Sheriffs Counsel.

Agenda Adjustment (Section F. Other Reports)

1. SDSU College of Pharmacy – Jane Mort, Pharm.D., Acting Dean and Professor, College of Pharmacy and Allied Health Professions
 - A total of 77 P4 students will graduate this spring. The number of graduates is the same as last spring.
 - Revised Pharm.D. curriculum is at the Board of Regents for approval with implementation scheduled for fall, 2018.
 - Remodeling plans are underway for two labs to provide better simulation spaces and enhance collaborative/active learning opportunities.
 - In January, the College hosted a strategic planning workshop, and currently is working on details of the plan through goals, strategies and procedures.
 - Work is underway on the self-study for CEPH accreditation for the MPH program. MPH curriculum is under revision from a 42 credit program increasing the elective hours from six to 12.
 - Faculty Position Update
 - i. Jordan Baye joins the College as Ambulatory Care Pharmacist at Sanford's Imaginetics clinic
 - ii. Sharrel Pinto will join the College on April 2 as Hoch Family Endowed Professor in Community Pharmacy Practice.
 - iii. Dean interviews completed; new Dean installed by July 1, 2018.
 - iv. Recruitment underway for Haarberg Chair in Oncology Research.
 - v. Currently recruiting for Avera Brookings Clinic Ambulatory Care position as well as Grant Proposal Specialist search.

E. SD Pharmacists Association – Amanda Bacon, SDPhA

1. Activity Report
 - The 2018 Legislative session was active. While the Association did not sponsor legislation this year, their Commercial and Legislative Branch actively engaged in monitoring several bills affecting the practice including the temporary licensure compact, controlled substance scheduling, telemedicine, and opioid prescribing limits. A bill summary was provided to attendees.
 - SDPhA, again this year, provided influenza immunizations for legislators.

- Forty-one SDSU Pharmacy students participated in Legislative Days January 23-24. Students provided over forty wellness checks in both the House and Senate lobbies. A great opportunity for lawmakers to see future pharmacists in action.
- Reviewed the dates and locations of upcoming spring district meetings.
- SDPhA Executive Director Amanda Bacon and SDPhA Board President Eric Grocott attended the APhA and NASPA Annual meetings March 16-19th in Nashville, TN.
- The National DEA Take-Back Event is scheduled for April 28th; pharmacists were encouraged to participate in locally-held events.

2. Financial Report provided in attendee informational packet.

South Dakota Board of Pharmacy Executive Director Kari Shanard-Koenders thanked Amanda Bacon and her team for their continued engagement in legislative measures and advocacy efforts as SD BOP could not participate in the legislative process this year.

3. SD Association of Pharmacy Technicians – Jerrie Vedvei, CPhT

Board Executive Director Shanard-Koenders reviewed handout provided by Jerrie Vedvei who was not in attendance. SDAPT conference date is October 6, 2018 and offered in three locations - Pierre (primary site) and Sioux Falls and Rapid City via digital network. Continuing Education credits will be offered for those with National Certification.

G. Old Business

1. UPS <797> proposed revisions – Update Gary, Tyler
 - Encouraged review of last newsletter which lists the comment dates for both
2. USP <800> NIOSH 2016 – Paula, Carol
 - Last published in 2016; open for public comment period now
 - Per Tony Lee, meeting attended from AT Analytical in Baltic, South Dakota, USP <800> suggests parties complete a cradle to grave walk through in their pharmacy
 - Looking to add 22 new drugs to the list many are biologics and oral cancer drugs
 - Check handout for compounding standards revision timeline
3. Office Software RFP Update

- A contract for an e-licensing software platform was signed with vendor I-Gov Solutions.
- The platform offers online-licensing, inspections, verifications, discipline tracking and credit card payment.
- Board staff is excited about the new possibilities; timeline and implementation date are pending.

4. Report from Hy-Vee Pilot Project – Justin Manning, Pharm. D.

- Technician Product Verification (TPV) implemented at three Sioux Falls Hy-Vee locations.
- Staff training levels vary by location. Sioux Falls #3 – two technicians-in-training but not completed so no TPV performed; Sioux Falls #4 – one technician fully trained, added new full-time technicians in September and looking for third technician for program; Sioux Falls #5 – newest location to join pilot program has one full-time technician-in-training and recently hired two additional.
- As reported by Justin Manning, the Hy-Vee TPV pilot program in Iowa is in the final phase and recently reported a 97% technician-in-training error rate at verification compared to a 96% Pharmacist error rate for the same period.
- Express Scripts used Hy-Vee's TPV project as the model for their Arizona TPV pilot. Pharmacists were resistant initially. Technicians-in-training wear a badge stating they perform final verification.

Board member Tom Nelson made a motion that the Hy-Vee Pilot Project (TPV) program to report to the Board at the time of variance renewal only instead of quarterly. Motion seconded by Board member Lisa Rave. Roll completed; motion carried.

5. Report on Alchermes/Aristada Pilot Project Minnehaha County Jail – Dave Hilbrands
Dave Hilbrands provided the following updates:

- Overall program results are good/positive.
- To date, 25 patients, usually non-violent offenders, have been discharged on Aristada;
- One patient in group returned to jail (4%). National recidivism rates are between 70 -80%.
- There are many challenges when treating the target group (i.e. obtaining a diagnosing of schizophrenia is a slow process and can take up to six months; connecting and coordinating services can be difficult; trying to identify potential patients in the jail system; working with facility staff; and discharge.
- Program continues to enroll as many patients as possible with Nurse Navigators to help keep them on track; participation in Nurse Navigator program is voluntary. Patients are signing waivers to allow contact /information sharing with patient's family, caregivers, and support services staff.
- Alchermes submitted a request for extension/renewal of the variance allowing the Aristada Pilot Project at the Hughes County Jail facility to continue. In addition, a request was also made to use Aristada 1064 at the location to increase flexibility with patient treatment. 1064 is a time-released, two month duration medication. Alchermes pays for two doses covering four months of treatment.

Board member Lisa Rave made a motion to requirement Alchermes/Aristada Pilot Project to come before the Board annually at the time of variance renewal to report on the program. Motion seconded by Board member Tom Nelson. Roll completed; motion carried.

6. SB 75 – Biosimilar Legislation Update, Executive Director Kari Shanard-Koenders

- Senate bill 75, allowing the substitution of a biosimilar for a biologic if approved by the FDA, passed and was signed into law by Governor Daugaard during the 2018 session.
- The FDA has not deemed any biosimilar product as "interchangeable" to date.

7. HB 1319 – Licensure Compact Legislation Update, Executive Director Kari Shanard-Koenders

- Bill would have eliminated the National Association of Boards of Pharmacies (NABP) role in vetting potential pharmacists hoping to license in South Dakota.
- Bill was defeated but most likely will be proposed in future legislative sessions.
- Legislature would not entertain opt-outs or bill revisions.
- Licensing associations in South Dakota will actively track compact legislative conversations/trends; permissive legislation allowing individual professions to opt-in is preferred.

H. New Business

1. Talyst (Swisslog) in Edgewood Assisted Living Facility (ALF), Spearfish-Regional LTC Pharmacy request

- Director of Nursing at Edgewood ALF requested the Board allow the ALF to use a Talyst (Automated Medicine Dispensing Device) to fulfill and package medication for assisted living facility tenants. The Talyst machine aggregates all medicines for a specific individual into a package which is provided to the tenant to take.
- Department of Health authorized facility to pursue use of an AMDD in the assisted living facility. Machine helps to achieve better med security, less med waste, and increases patient safety.
- To date, a Talyst machine has not been utilized in an assisted living facility in South Dakota. Similar machines are currently used in South Dakota long-term care facilities.
- Machine would be considered "a pharmacy not within a registered location" and therefore would be required to obtain a license from the Board of Pharmacy.

A motion to approve the request to use a Talyst (Swisslog) machine in Edgewood Assisted Living Facility (ALF) was made by Board member Lisa Rave and seconded by Board member Dan Somsen. Board member Tom Nelson made a substitute motion to approve the use of a Talyst (Swisslog) machine in the Edgewood ALF with an additional requirement to come before the Board six months after implementation to report/update members. Motion seconded by Board member Dan Somsen. Roll call taken, Board member Lenny Petrik abstained from voting; motion carried.

2. 2019 Association Funding

- Topic extensively discussed during fall Board meeting
- Confirmed funds from the Board do not go toward Commercial and Legislative endeavors.

Motion was made by Board member Dan Somsen to approve/authorize the payment of 80% of all the funds the Board receives from pharmacist renewals to the Association (36:11:6 Use of Funds by Pharmacists Association). Motion seconded by Board member Tom Nelson. Roll taken; motion carried.

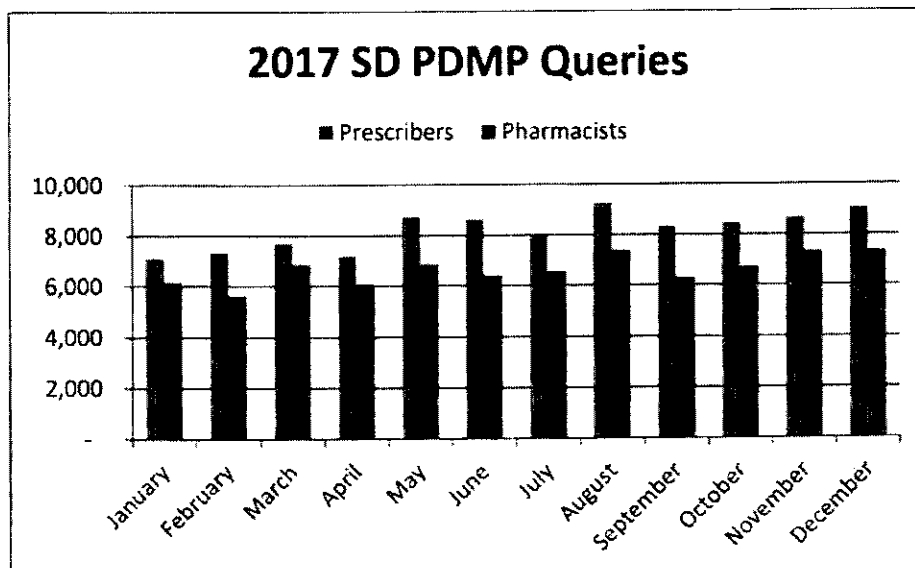
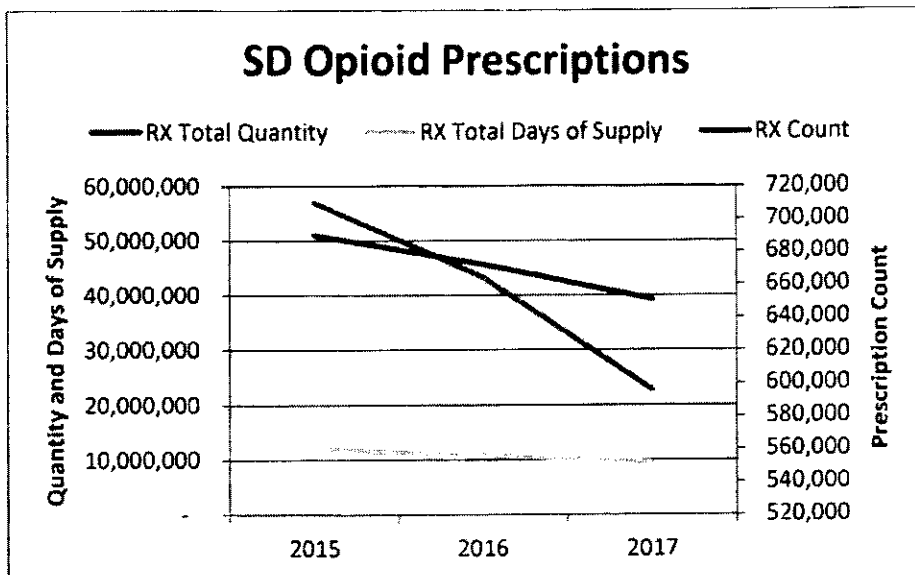

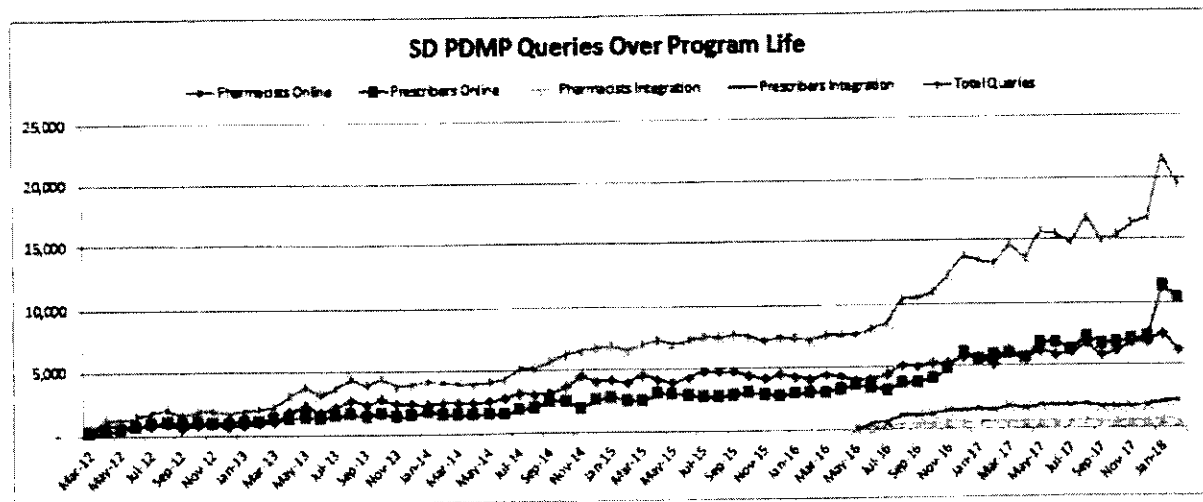

South Dakota Prescription Drug Monitoring Program Update March 22, 2018

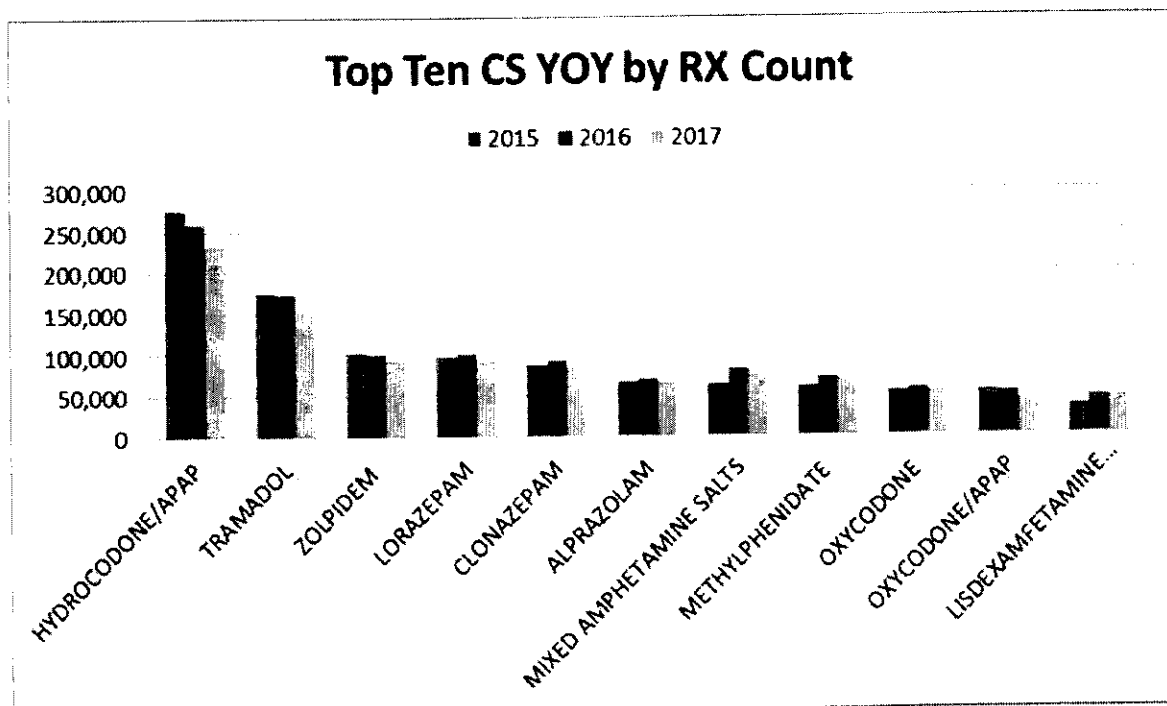
2018 began with presentations by PDMP Director, Melissa DeNoon, of the new statutory annual PDMP report on the monitoring and use of prescription opioids to the SD Legislature's Senate and House standing committees on health and human services. The report included a brief history of the SD PDMP and program highlights; percentages of prescribers registered with the program informing of compliance with last year's mandated prescriber registration; opioid prescription data for the previous three years including total prescription counts, total quantities, and total days of supply; prescriber and pharmacist query data for the previous year; and descriptions of the two new enhancements to PMP AWA_{Rx}E, Clinical Alerts and Prescriber Reports.



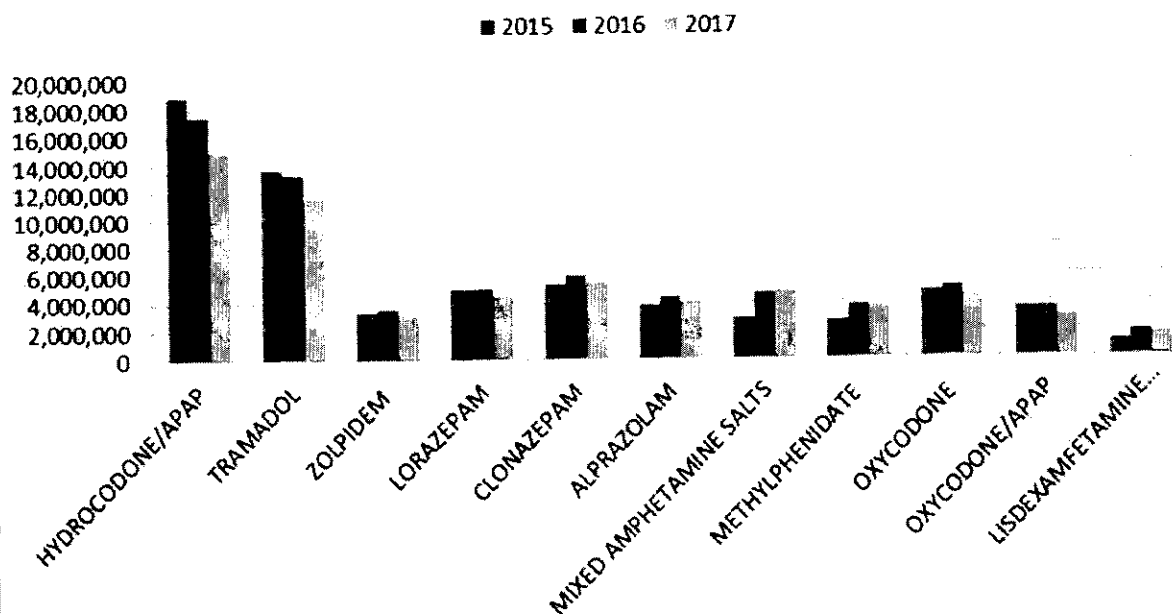
The Board of Pharmacy is encouraged by the trends shown in both opioid prescriptions and number of queries. Opioid prescriptions have decreased in our state over the last three years in all three parameters: prescription count, total quantity, and total days of supply. The 2017 mandated prescriber registration significantly increased the PDMP's number of approved users. This increase along with the Avera Meditech/PDMP integration and recent program enhancements have all contributed to increased utilization of this valuable tool. This is a real win as increased utilization of PDMPs has been shown to directly affect patient care and impact the misuse, abuse, and diversion of controlled prescription drugs, all of which are goals of the SD PDMP.



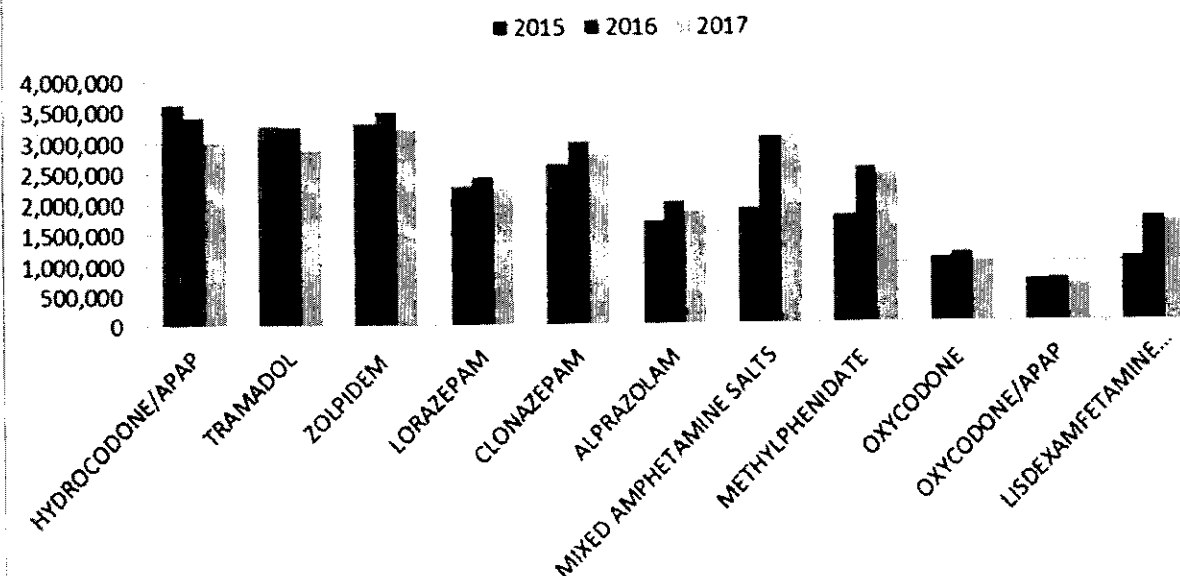
Year Over Year Top Ten Most Prescribed Controlled Substances

Hot Button PDMP Issues

- Number One error reported is prescriptions submitted under the wrong prescriber DEA. Pharmacies must be vigilant with similar prescriber names, verifying the prescriber if the signature is illegible, and resident use of their own DEA vs. a hospital DEA.

- Data submission errors **MUST** be corrected through PMP Clearinghouse by the pharmacy as correction within the pharmacy software system does not automatically correct the database. If a prescriber has contacted your pharmacy regarding an error, please contact PDMP staff.
- Pharmacies that have pharmacy software NOT connected to point-of-sale **MUST** remove prescriptions from the database that were "ready" but returned to stock **AND** remove a prescription's first "ready" submission date record if that prescription is changed for any reason on a future date (made "ready" again) so when the updated record is submitted there is not a duplication on the patient's PDMP report.
- SD requires submission of schedules 2, 3, 4, **AND** 5 as in SD, schedule 4 includes 5.

PMP AWARe Enhancements

- Clinical Alerts
 - Provides alerts and/or notifications to practitioners on patients that meet one or more of the following thresholds: 1) multiple prescribers and dispensers within a time period, 2) daily active MME set by the Advisory Council at the December 2017 meeting, and/or 3) concurrent opioid and benzodiazepine prescribing
 - Rolled out in January 2018
- Prescriber Reports
 - Provides prescriber users with a quarterly report on the previous six month period; a healthcare specialty must be in the prescriber's account profile to receive a report
 - Each report will inform the prescriber on their own prescribing history including: 1) comparing prescribing behavior to red flag indicators, 2) comparing prescribing behavior to peers in their specialty field and statewide, 3) summarizing patient and prescription volumes, 4) information on potential multiple prescriber/dispenser patients, and 5) summarizing PMP AWARe usage by the prescriber and their delegates
 - Rolled out in December 2017 for Q2 and Q3 2017, next cycle is April 2018 for Q4 2017 and Q1 2018
- Startup and year one fees for both enhancements were funded through the DOH's CDC DDPI Grant and the DSS's SAMHSA STR Grant

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SDPhA Update – Spring 2018 *Submitted March 19, 2018*

Legislative Session

The 2018 Legislative Session has been active for SDPhA's Commercial and Legislative Branch, engaging in and monitoring several bills affecting the practice.

- SB 141 – This legislation aims to create greater pricing transparency, and aid pharmacists in the ability to talk freely to patients about all their options when paying for prescriptions. We strongly supported this legislation. Eric Grocott, SDPhA president, testified on this patient-friendly legislation in both the House and Senate Health and Human Services Committee, explaining to legislators why pharmacists may not always be at liberty to address all patient payment options. Gov. Dennis Daugaard signed SB 141 Feb. 8.
- HB 1319 – Temporary Licensure Compact. This legislation sought to adopt a Temporary Licensure Compact for Professionals. The measure raised serious patient and pharmacy team safety concerns. SDPhA testified against the bill and worked hard to ensure state lawmakers understood the unintended consequences to both patients and pharmacists. The bill was soundly defeated in the House of Representatives Feb. 20.
- SB 172 - Temporary Licensure Compact Opt Out. This legislation provided for an opt out by certain professions (including pharmacists) from the Interstate Compact for the Temporary Licensure of Professions established by HB 1319. The legislation was tabled after HB 1319 failed.
- Other legislation SDPhA tracked this session included: controlled substance scheduling, methamphetamine distribution and penalties, biosimilars, telemedicine and telehealth, opioid prescribing limits, removal of the sales tax exemption on prescription drugs.

Legislator Flu Shot Clinic

The Legislative Research Council once again reached out to SDPhA to ask us to assist lawmakers by providing influenza immunizations. We encouraged them all to receive their vaccinations prior to heading to Pierre, but we are happy to be there for those who look to us to help them. A huge "thank you" to Kristen Carter, Pharmacy Manager at Dakotamart and Trent Merkwon, also of Dakotamart in Pierre who took time out of their busy schedules to represent the profession and provide protection for our lawmakers. The pair, gave about 15 immunizations to legislators, interns and pages. We received a very nice thank you from House and Senate leadership with an ask to return again next year. It's a unique opportunity to showcase one of the many ways pharmacists are, "More Than a Count."

Legislative Days

Legislative Days was back in full force Jan. 23-24, with 41 SDSU Pharmacy Students participating. We were thrilled to have them here. Tuesday night the students and several pharmacists gathered at RedRossa for dinner. Tom Nelson, board member, Board of Pharmacy and Paula Stotz, Inspector, Board of Pharmacy provided updates from the BOP. Jane Mort, Acting Dean, SDSU College of Pharmacy and Allied Health Professions brought everyone up to speed on the many things happening on campus. Robert Riter, SDPhA lobbyist, and Amanda Bacon, SDPhA executive director discussed the various bills and legislation SDPhA was working on your behalf in the early stages of South Dakota's 93rd Legislative Session. Sue Schaefer was also presented an award for her 13 years of dedicated service to South Dakota's pharmacists. We are extremely grateful for her leadership and will continue to move forward with our legislative work remembering one of her favorite sayings – if you're not at the table, you're usually on the menu!

Wednesday morning, much more early than bright, the students set up in both the House and Senate lobbies at the Capitol to provide wellness checks to those who wanted them. This was such a fantastic opportunity to show a wide-range of the great work you all do each day. It was a wonderful change for our lawmakers to see how pharmacists are once again, so much, "More Than a Count!" The students provided about 40 wellness checks in just a few short hours that morning, while also having the opportunity to sit-in on various committees that morning and learn the legislative process first-hand.

Mark your calendar and plan to join us next year! Legislative days is set for Jan. 22-23, 2019!

The National Scene - Bills

S. 2553 – Know the Lowest Price Act

This bill would prohibit Part D plan sponsors and contracted PBM's from restricting pharmacies from informing individuals regarding the prices for certain drugs and biologicals. The bill was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance. 3/14/2018. The bill currently has five co-sponsors.

S. 2554 - Patient Right to Know Drug Prices Act

This legislation would prohibit gag clauses in Health Insurance Marketplace plans as well as Employee Retirement and Income Security Act (ERISA) plans—employee benefit plans offered by private sector employers. The bill was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance 3/14/2018. The bill currently has five co-sponsors.

H.R. 592/S. 109 Pharmacy and Medically Underserved Areas Enhancement Act

Amends Title XVIII of the Social Security Act to provide for coverage under the Medicare program of pharmacist services. Introduced 1/12/17. Senators Thune and Rounds have graciously agreed to co-sponsor this important legislation, as has Representative Noem.

H.R. 1038 / S. 413 (similar/companion) - Improving Transparency and Accuracy in Part D Drug Spending Act

This bill deals with DIR fees and was introduced on 2/14/17. Senators Thune and Rounds have agreed to co-sponsor this legislation.

H.R. 244 - MAC Transparency Act

Introduced by Congressman Doug Collins (R-GA). This legislation was previously introduced in the 113th Congress as H.R. 5815. Congressman Dave Loebsack (D-IA) joined Rep. Collins in reintroducing the legislation, vitally important to improving fairness and transparency in reimbursements to independent and community pharmacists. The last action on this bill was a referral to the Subcommittee on Military Personnel 6/25/2015

Prescription Drug Abuse Nationwide, pharmacists are engaging in the work to prevent prescription drug abuse with the knowledge that real solutions must balance the need for patient access to medications for legitimate medical purposes with the need to prevent diversion and abuse. Pharmacists are in a unique position to combat this epidemic due to their expertise and accessibility. President Trump announced new initiatives March 19, which include a plan to cut opioid prescriptions by a third over three years, asking the Justice Department to seek more death-penalty cases against drug traffickers under current law, and federal support to increase the availability of naloxone. Here at home, Steve Lee represents SDPhA on the South Dakota Opioid Abuse Advisory Committee. This committee meets quarterly.

Practice Act Workgroup

The Practice Act Workgroup continues its work, and most recently worked with the BOP in developing a workgroup charter, which has been distributed to all workgroup members for feedback. Dana Darger, Secretary/Treasurer, SDPhA is leading this effort, working with pharmacists from all practice areas as well as additional stakeholders.

Health Professional Assistance Program

Our association continues to support the HPAP program. A pharmacist may access the program by self-referral, board referral, or referral from another person or agency, employer, coworker or family member.

C&L Fund

The importance of your donations to the Commercial and Legislative Branch of SDPhA cannot be overstated. We need strong and continuous representation to protect the interests and concerns of pharmacists in South Dakota. We can't retain our Lobbyist, Bob Riter, without your support. South Dakota Pharmacists Commercial & Legislative (C&L) Branch Report (March 9, 2018)

SB 32 This legislation places certain substances on the controlled substances schedule and to declare an emergency. *Signed by the Governor, 2/8/2018*

SB 62 This legislation provides for the notification related to a breach of certain data and to provide a penalty therefor. *Monitoring – Delivered to the Governor, 3/9/2018*

SB 63 This Legislation revises certain prohibitions regarding methamphetamines and to create a mandatory penalty for a violation thereof. *Monitoring – Delivered to the Governor, 3/8/2018*

SB 65 This legislation revises certain provisions regarding drug deliveries that result in death and to provide a penalty therefor. *Monitoring – Delivered to the Governor, 3/9/2018*

SB 75 This legislation establishes certain provisions regarding the dispensing of biological products. SDPhA Position: Neutral. *Board of Pharmacy testified as a proponent. Signed by the Governor 2/8/2018*

SB 122 This legislation provides for the payment of claims for covered services provided by a health care provider via telemedicine or telehealth. *Monitoring – Tabled, Senate Health and Human Services 2/7/2018*

SB 123 This legislation addresses utilization of telemedicine or telehealth by a health care professional. *Monitoring – Tabled, Senate Health and Human Services 2/7/2018*

SB 141 This legislation establishes certain provisions regarding pharmacy benefits management. SDPhA Position: Support. *SDPhA testified as a proponent. Signed by the Governor 2/27/2018*

SB 172 This legislation provides for an opt out by certain professions, including pharmacists, from the Interstate Compact for the Temporary Licensure of Professions established by HB 1319. SDPhA Position: Support. Sponsors requested this legislation be tabled after HB 1319 failed to pass the House. *Tabled, Senate 2/21/2018.*

SB 176 This legislation originally established certain provisions around prescribing opioids. It had been deferred to the 41st legislative day, Senate Health and Human Services 2/7/2018. This was recalled from committee 2/20/2018, reconsidered and passed out to the Senate, where it was hoghoused and now appropriates, through the general fund, for the Attorney General to investigate and litigate opioid misuse, and to declare an emergency. *Monitoring – Senate Do Pass Amended, Passed; Deferred to the 41st Legislative Day, Passed. House Committee on Appropriations 3/1/2018*

HB 1133 This legislation originally called for mandatory drug testing for members of the Legislature. That was deferred to the 41st day 1/31/2018. This week it was reconsidered and heavily amended to revise certain provisions regarding operating a vehicle after consumption of a controlled drug or substance. *Monitoring – House of Representatives Do Pass Amended, Failed 2/22/2018*

HB 1309 This legislation has been heavily amended and now would provide for a periodic review of the sales and use tax exemptions. SDPhA testified against the original legislation which revised certain sales tax exemptions, and the tax rate on the sale of food. That version would have eliminated the sales tax exemption several goods, including prescription drugs. *Monitoring – House of Representatives Do Pass Amended, Failed 2/21/2018*

HB 1319 This legislation adopts the Interstate Compact for the Temporary Licensure of Professionals. SDPhA Position: Oppose. *SDPhA Testified in opposition. House of Representatives Do Pass Amended, Failed 2/20/2018*

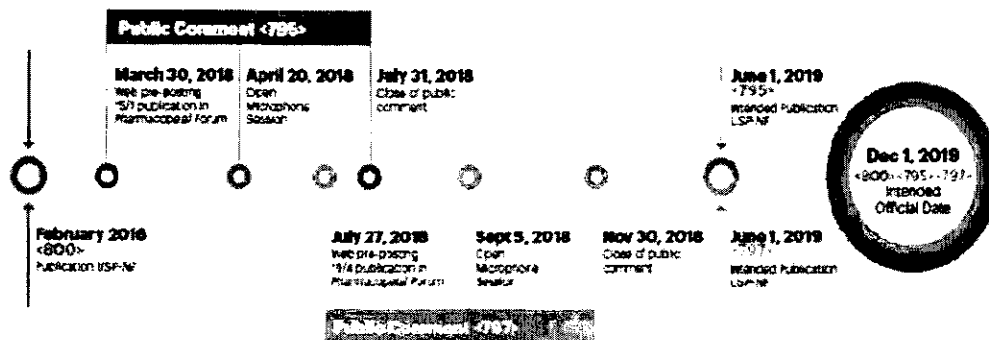
