8:15 a.m. Chairman Bryan Nagel called the meeting to order. Board members present were Bryan Nagel, Cobbie Magness, Lynn Boadwine, Bill Aeschlimann, Dr John Voegeli, and via phone Eric Iversen. Absent was Steven Rommereim. AIB staff members present were Dr Dustin Oedekoven, Dr Todd Tedrow, Dr Rory Fischer, Dr Susan Reenders, Dr Adam Wiechmann, Dr Craig Hanson, Ben Doty, Terry Johnson and Janet Baatz. Other present were Sherri Wald-Attorney Generals Office, Shannon Casey Ballard-Bear Country USA, Dr David Mills, Ashley Elhoff-Kramers Auction, and Cindy Kramer-Kramers Auction.

Dr Oedekoven updated the Board on AIB staff. Ben Doty has been hired as a AIB Compliance Officer and Cheyenne Olson assumed the Exam Board responsibilities.

Dr Oedekoven discussed requirements for permitting possession of Captive Non-domestic mammals as per SDAR 12:68:18.

8:30 a.m. Shannon Casey Ballard of Bear Country asked the Board to amend Bear Country USA's 2016 Captive Non-Domestic Mammal Possession Permit to allow for limited public contact with bear cubs at specified times in April. Ms Casey-Ballard also presented letters of support from people in the community. Lynn Boadwine motioned to amend the permit application as requested. John Voegeli seconded. All in favor. Motion passed. Bear Country was instructed when renewing their annual permit to attach dates of events.

8:45 a.m. Dr Oedekoven updated the Board on recent Trichomoniasis cases in South Dakota: seven cases have been reported in South Dakota beef herds since November 2015. Shannon County, Corson and Dewey Counties each had two cases, and Mellette County had one case. A Trichomoniasis vaccine is available, but not recommended as it does not eliminate trich.

9:25 a.m. Dr Oedekoven updated the Board on the 2016 legislative session.

1. The AIB budget was approved.
2. HB1080 is an appropriation to transfer certain money to the Bureau of Administration to fund a design study for a potential expansion and upgrade to the State Animal Disease Research and Diagnostic Laboratory. Governor Dugaard signed this bill.
3. SB 157 attempted to provide additional regulations for commercial breeding operations (dogs and cats). This bill was deferred to the 41st legislative day. Dr Oedekoven testified against the bill, citing that USDA's existing regulation of commercial breeding operations is adequate.
4. HB 1228 would have created a mandatory county of origin meat labeling program in South Dakota. This bill was deferred to the 41st legislative day.

5. HB 1185, to revise certain provisions regarding livestock satellite video auction agencies and electronic auctions of livestock. This bill was tabled in the Agriculture and Natural Resources committee. The bill's sponsor, Representative Brunner, asked Dr Oedekoven to work with his constituents.

Dr Oedekoven reviewed a recent meeting of the National Advisory Committee on Meat and Poultry Inspection, and that the South Dakota Meat Inspection Program will undergo an on-site review by USDA FSIS on April 11<sup>th</sup> – 22<sup>nd</sup>.

10:00 a.m. A public hearing was held to consider the request for an auction market license for Kramer's Auction LLC, Cindy Kramer, applicant. Present for this hearing were Cindy Kramer, Ashley Elhoff and Dr David Mills. The hearing was audio recorded and is on file. There were no proponents or opponents and no written testimony was received. Cobbie Magness moved to issue an auction agency license to Kramer Auction LLC contingent upon installation of posts to hold gates so they don't swing in the sale ring and to finalize the construction of the quarantine pen. Lynn Boadwine seconded. All in favor. Motion passed. The hearing adjourned at 10:55 p.m.


11:05 a.m. Updates were given on:

- 1) Brucella canis in dogs - SDSU ADRDL has assisted in testing dogs on South Dakota reservations. An overview of recent surveillance efforts was distributed to Board members.
2. Ohio scrapie trace – a SD producer received an exposed lamb from an infected flock in Ohio. AIB field staff found that the exposed lamb had died on the SD premises prior to lambing and the producer no longer had sheep on the premises.
- 3) USDA has extended the deadline for comments to the proposed rule for Brucellosis and Bovine Tuberculosis until May 15, 2016.

Dr Oedekoven has agreed to serve as Interim Secretary of Agriculture while the South Dakota Department of Agriculture continues the search for a full-time replacement for former Secretary Lucas Lentsch. For the purposes of AIB internal operations, Dr Mendel Miller is serving as the Acting State Veterinarian.

Dr Oedekoven reminded Board members of the Annual AIB Meeting to be held on Tuesday, July 12, 2016.

11:45 a.m. Bill Aeschlimann moved to adjourn the meeting. Cobbie Magness seconded. Chairman Nagel adjourned the meeting.
