

In your testimony, you referred to the state legislature not setting speed limits. Jean Hunhoff, State Rep from Yankton, testified the interim rules committee sets speed limits for local roads every year. Also, I believe the state legislature set the speed limit at 80 mph on interstates within our borders four years ago. It is my understanding you testified you were unaware of a news release that the final staff recommendation for the project had been made. Yet, when given the release you still failed to recognize it. It is hard to believe you would make such comments. It is also sad that you refused to discuss the contents of the bill and the need for follow up on recommendations made in HB 1284.

Here is a formal request for DOT to set the speed limits at 45 for Highway 50 around Tyndall and 55 mph around Tabor.

Dear Secretary Berquist:

Please accept this correspondence as a formal request to reduce the speed limit around Tabor to 55 mph, and Tyndall to 45 mph as soon as possible, including an emergency clause as in HB1284.

Please include as supporting evidence the submitted proponent testimony of over 250 signatures from citizens for this request in HB 1284 testimony. Further, there are approximately 600 signatures, emails letters and oral testimony for such a change submitted at one of your first DOT hearings on the issue.

I request that you consider a public meeting for all users of Highway 50. I would be willing to facilitate the meeting and make sure all sides are heard and listened to on the subject, and that all sides would be treated fairly. I expect the meeting would last around 2 hours, or until everyone had their voices heard. A date from mid March until early April before spring planting would be preferred. Also, an evening meeting would be preferred. If you wish to bring any of your staff along they would be welcome.

Not everyone who wanted to speak at your last two meetings did so. They are now left feeling frustrated and disappointed their voices and concerns are not being taken seriously. There is a saying "Let us make change for the better to improve the people's quality and quantity of life - not just change for the sake of change". The latter seems to sum up what many believe to be going on with this project. I believe a public meeting, at this stage of the project, would help to better connect the concerns of our communities to the Departments's mission to provide a safe and effective transportation system.

It is my understanding the cities of Tabor and Tyndall also made similar requests. In order to avoid duplication, extra staff work load and confusion, I hereby withdraw my request.

Could you please send me any form or written legal instrument that is used for requests to lower the speeds on state highways in the future?

Again, Darin, please reconsider my personal invitation to you as Secretary of the Dept of Transportation to meet with the stakeholders who utilize Highway 50 in Bon Homme County. It is only right and fair to answer their questions and respond to their concerns. According to the process you have in place DOT does not have to do such a meeting. In my opinion it would be good public relations on your part to address the great concerns about what the DOT is trying to do with this project. I am not asking the DOT to do this, I am asking you as the Secretary of the Department to do so.

Dear Mr. Kloucek:

As requested, attached please find an electronic copy of the proposed rule change in Bon Homme County. The proposed rule change is to State Trunk Highway 50 through Avon. Under the proposed rule, the current 55 mph speed zone through Avon would be shortened to 1.42 miles in length, instead of the speed zone stretching for 2.31 miles as currently set out in the rule. The current signing in place along this stretch of Highway 50 reflects the 55 mph speed zone for 1.42 miles through Avon. So, if the proposed rule change is adopted, the rule would become consistent with the signing in place on this stretch of road.

For your reference, I am also enclosing a memo that explains the rule change in Bon Homme County. The memo includes a map showing the speed zone under the current rule and the proposed rule.

If you would like to submit a written comment concerning the rule, you may do so by replying to this e-mail and I will make sure your e-mail reply is included in the hearing record. 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

70:01:02:12. Bon Homme County. The following are the maximum speeds on certain highways in Bon Homme County:

(3) State Trunk Highway 50 beginning 0.2 mile west of Bon Homme County Highway 11 then easterly 1.42 2.31 miles through Avon, 55 miles per hour;



The length of the existing 55 mph speed zone in Avon is 1.42 miles, not 2.31 miles as given in the current administrative rule. The Department of Transportation Mitchell Region Traffic Office determined during an on-site review that the 1.42 mile length is appropriate and recommended amending the rule to be in conformance with the existing signing.

There is no cost associated with these changes. These changes reflect what is currently in the field.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: Hamlin County Speed Rule Change on SD Highway 28 near Lake Poinsett.

70:01:02:32. Hamlin County. The following are the maximum speeds on certain highways in Hamlin County:

(6) State Trunk Highway 28 beginning 2.6 miles east of the junction of U.S. Highway 81, then east for 4.2 1.6 miles, 55 miles per hour;

The existing signing east of Lake Poinsett ends the 55 mph speed zone earlier than the current administrative rule. The current administrative rule extended into a rural area further than needed, as there is a lack of cabins, homes, entrances, or lake access in this area; therefore, the Department of Transportation Aberdeen Region Traffic Office recommended the proposed amendment. Lieutenant Caleb Walters of the South Dakota Highway Patrol is in support of the proposed amendment.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the South Dakota Transportation Commission by South Dakota Codified Law chapter 1-26, the commission will hold a public hearing in the Commission Room of the Becker Hansen Building at 700 East Broadway Avenue in Pierre, South Dakota, on Thursday, March 29, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. (Central Time) to consider proposed changes to the following rules:

Chapter 70:01:02 - Speed Limits. Changes are being made to the speed limit rules for U.S. Highway 16 in Pennington County, U.S. Highway 385 in Lawrence County, State Trunk Highway 50 in Bon Homme County, State Trunk Highway 28 in Hamlin County, and State Trunk Highway 20 in Perkins County. The purpose and effect of these changes is to revise the speed limits set out in the rules to match the speed limit signs in place along these highways. 70:01:02:38 - Hyde County speed zone. The 30 miles per hour (mph) limited speed zone on State Trunk Highway 47 in Highmore is being extended north an additional 0.1 mile to match the current signing locations. Then a 35 mph speed zone will extend north for 0.3 mile, rather than the 40 mph speed zone currently in place. A 45 mph speed zone will then extend north for 0.2 mile in place of the current 65 mph zone. The proposed speed zones will enhance safety and are based on an analysis of a speed zone study and consideration of development and turning movements. 70:01:02:48 - Marshall County speed zone. A 55 mph limited speed zone is proposed for State Trunk Highway 10 on the west side of Britton for a distance of 0.2 mile. This change is being made to establish a transition speed zone between a 65 mph speed zone and a 45 mph speed zone. This change will enhance safety and is consistent with the typical length of a transition speed zone. 70:01:02:49 -Meade County. This rule will set a 35 mph speed zone for the Interstate Highway 90 frontage road (Captain Soelzer Street) on the west side of Sturgis Road beginning at Peaceful Pines Road and proceeding north for 0.40 mile. Then a 40 mph speed zone will be established for an additional distance of 0.56 mile to the north. This change will enhance traffic efficiency by making the speed zones consistent with free flow speeds of traffic. 70:01:02:51 - Miner County speed zone. On State Trunk Highway 34, a 45 mph limited speed zone is being replaced with a 50 mph speed zone beginning 0.5 mile west of Main Street in Howard then east for 0.2 mile. Then heading east for 0.8 mile the speed limit on State Trunk Highway 34 will reduce to 30 mph, and then the speed limit will increase to 50 mph for 0.53 mile. The proposed speed zones will enhance safety and are based on an analysis of spot speed zone studies, crash history, turning movements, motorist behaviors, and input from city officials, local citizens and law enforcement. 70:01:02:55 - Roberts County. On State Trunk Highway 123 south of Wilmot, a 25 mph limited speed zone is being replaced with a 45 mph speed zone that will transition to a 55 mph speed zone. These changes will enhance safety and efficiency by creating a transition speed zone between the existing 25 mph zone and the 55 mph zone.

Good afternoon. I apologize for not responding earlier. I have been out of the office for the last few days.

I will be asking the Transportation Commission to set a hearing on the proposed speed zone changes in Tyndall and Tabor for Thursday, April 26, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. Central Time in the Commission Room of the Becker-Hansen Building in Pierre. Attached is an electronic copy of a letter mailed to you last Thursday that explains the process in more detail. I am also enclosing an electronic copy of the rule changes I have drafted based on my understanding of the petitions received by the Department. Thank you for your e-mails, dated February 16, 2018 and February 28, 2018, relating to reductions in the speed limits on Highway 50 adjacent to the cities of Tyndall and Tabor. I am writing to let you know that the department has received similar requests from the cities of Tyndall and Tabor for speed reductions on these stretches of highway. As you have suggested, I will work with officials from those communities to prepare the proposed rule changes for consideration by the South Dakota Transportation Commission. I will send you a copy of the proposed rules once they are drafted.

At the next regular meeting of the Commission on Thursday, March 29, 2018, I will ask the Commission to set a hearing on the proposed rules for 9:00 a.m. on April 26, 2018, in the Becker-Hansen Building in Pierre, South Dakota. At the hearing, members of the public and department staff will have the opportunity to present testimony in support of or in opposition to the proposed rules. There will be an opportunity to appear in person or by telephone. Since you have expressed support for the rule changes, I anticipate you will appear at the hearing, either in person or by phone.
