




Detachment 1, Company B, 1/112th Aviation Regiment earned the <u>Certificate of Victory</u> for weapons marksmanship.

The 114th Fighter Wing was awarded the <u>Air</u> <u>Force Outstanding Unit Award</u> in 2017. This is the 3rd consecutive and 9th time overall that the114th Fighter Wing has won this award for meritorious service.





South Dakota's 114th Fighter Wing was also awarded the <u>Distinguished Flying Unit</u> Plaque in 2017 for being one of the top five flying units in the nation. Selection is based on overall combat readiness and performance. This is the 7th time the 114th Fighter Wing has won the prestigious award.





2017 Deployments

- We deployed 125 Airmen to numerous countries (Djibouti, Germany, Jordan, Kuwait, Qatar & UAE) for 180day tours during 2017 and 56 of them are still deployed.
- Individual Airmen will continue to deploy to various locations worldwide.

Aviation Readiness Center

- Current facility is comprised of eight (8) aviation units with 153 soldiers occupying 10,600 sq. ft. in the Army Aviation Support Facility (AASF).
- Authorized space for the 8 units is 58,714 sq. ft.
- Current AASF is short 48,114 sq. ft.
- The AASF is an aircraft maintenance facility lacking sufficient training, supply and administrative space required for units to achieve proficiency in required training tasks.

Aviation Readiness Center

- The aviation units identified for this Military Construction (MILCON) project are considered homeless.
- The federal authorization for the project was received in FY2019.
- Total cost of project is \$20 Million (\$15 Million Federal and \$5 Million State)
- On 10 Mar 2017 the certification of State funds was provided to the Federal Government.




