

November 1, 2017


Average Daily Population of Adult Inmates



FY05 – FY17 are actual. FY18 and FY19 are projected.


Male Inmate ADC by Month

July 2015 to July 2017




Female Inmate ADC by Month




Breakdown of Crimes for Male Offenders

Population Response

- At 3,888 as of 10/30/17 the prison population is 43 inmates above what was the basis for the FY 18 budget.
- Pinched the most in low medium and minimum beds
- Responses:
 - Expanded number beds
 - Policy revisions to best align practices with bed space
 - Program development and completion
 - Options to house parolees on CTP or on detainee status locally vs. in prison
 - Extended Confinement Program
 - Compliant discharge

Drug Testing and Responses

- Average=143 a month positive for controlled substances
- 99% incarceration rate

Maximizing Justice Reinvestment Grant Intermediate Correctional Intervention Program (ICIP)

Project Goals & Target Population


- Target population is prison-bound adult female offenders from Pennington County.
 - "program will further justice reinvestment by diverting Pennington County females from prison, prevent return to prison"
- Goals
 - "Reduce corrections costs by reducing unnecessary prison confinement.
 - "Expand and promote collaboration among those working in the criminal justice system to support justice reinvestment.
 - "Use evidence-based practices to reduce recidivism and prevent reincarceration."
- Preference is for those admitted to the program to be probation violators needing an intensive intervention as an alternative to prison admission.
- As space allows, parole violators could also be placed in the program.

Female Inmate Population Considerations

In 2015, South Dakota ranked #6 in the nation in female incarceration rates.


93% of FY17 female court commitments were nonviolent


92% of FY17 Pennington County female court commitments were nonviolent

Maximizing Justice Reinvestment Grant Budget

- \$1.75 Million
- No match
- October 1, 2016 September 30, 2020 (this is with a one-year extension)
- 100% of funds are budgeted as Contractual Services
- Major budgetary categories include:
 - residential program,
 - case management,
 - community-based services,
 - housing assistance,
 - SCRAM/GPS monitoring,
 - jail costs,
 - flexible funds to address individual specific needs,
 - program development and evaluation,

Intermediate Correctional Intervention Program

- 90-120 day residential phase
- 9-month community phase
- Evidenced-based practices
 - Individualized, assessment-based
 - Risk and needs drive services and intensity
 - Cognitive-based programs
 - Identify and address Stages of Change
 - Responsivity females, Native Americans
- Access existing state and local services and resources
- Ensure access to mental health, health care, and medication management
- Utilize federal funds to fill-in service gaps
- Enhanced case management
- Leverage supervision

ICIP RFP Reissued on October 2 with Two Options:

Option One:

 One provider to provide Housing and Custodial Services AND Programming and Case Management

Option Two:

 Two providers, with one providing Housing and Custodial Services AND the other to provide the Programming and Case Management.
