MINUTES OF THE SOUTH DAKOTA WEED & PEST CONTROL COMMISSION MEETING FEBRUARY 18, 2015 – 1:30 pm Ramkota Hotel & Conference Center – Rapid City, SD

Chairman Lynn Diebert called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm, February 18, 2015.

Discussion was held on the request to add Japanese beetle to the locally noxious pest listing. A motion was made by Ron Thyen to have a public hearing to approve putting Japanese Beetle on the local list for counties. Seconded by Ryan Brunner. Motion carried.

Weed & Pest Coordinator Report was given by Brenda Sievers. Brenda reported on shows attended and upcoming county annual meetings that staff can attend.

Weed & Pest Supervisor Report was given by Ron Moehring. Ron talked about supervisor changes. Black Hills Stock Show and Watertown Farm Shows were attended by Department staff. Noxious weed acres are up this past year.

CAPS report was given by Dale Anderson. He discussed the surveys that were done in 2014 and the planned survey work for 2015. Mike Stenson reported on the CAPS projects that he assisted with, including the alfalfa weevil parasitoid, purple loosestrife and bio-control monitoring projects.

Chairman Diebert went over the items that counties requested on their contractual/regular grants that are not allowed. Any grants that are approved – if spray equipment is approved, no trucks will be allowed. Any meetings will be meeting room expense and coffee only. If advertising, no legal notices are allowed. If labor is requested, only seasonal or contractual labor is allowed – no supervisor's wages.

The total amount of the competitive grants recommended for approval is \$292,502.

A motion was made by Ron Thyen to approve the contractual/regular grants and the competitive grants as recommended by the Committee. Floyd Muntefering seconded. Motion carried.

Grant Signatory Authority

Brenda Sievers briefed the Commission on the contracts that are signed after the Commission approval of the grants, and who is authorized to sign the contracts on behalf of the Commission. A motion was made by Paul Coughlin to grant signatory authority on the Weed and Pest Grant Contracts to the Secretary of the South Dakota Department of Agriculture, or his designee. Seconded by Jason Humphrey. Motion carried.

Aquatic Nuisance Species

Paul Coughlin briefed the Commission on the proposed rules that will be coming before the Game Fish and Parks Commission to add Phragmites to the Aquatic Nuisance Species Listing. The intent of the rules is to prevent the movement of Aquatic Nuisance Species from being moved from waterbody to waterbody. It will allow GF&P personnel to have watercraft cleaned before leaving one waterbody, so movement doesn't take place to another waterbody.

Annual Meeting Date

The Annual Meeting and the Rules Hearing tentative date were discussed, but will depend on hearing date and room availability. Brenda will let everyone know when she can get it scheduled, but will try for the 2nd week of April.
