The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Don Roby. Roll call was taken and a quorum was determined.

Chairman Roby asked for a motion to approve the minutes of April 28, 2016.

A MOTION WAS MADE by Zander to approve and seconded by Vanneman. All voted aye by roll call vote and motion carried.

Chairman Roby asked for a motion to approve the minutes of May 12, 2016.

A MOTION WAS MADE by Rosenboom to approve and seconded by Marquardt. All voted aye by roll call vote and motion carried.

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A MOTION WAS MADE by Marquardt to go into Executive Session at 9:34 a.m. for the purpose of contract negotiations and legal litigation and seconded by Zander. All voted aye by roll call vote and motion carried.

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A MOTION WAS MADE by Marquardt to return from Executive Session at 10:24 a.m. and seconded by Vanneman. All voted aye by roll call vote and motion carried.

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Secretary Bergquist recognized Kevin Goeden on his upcoming retirement. Has been the Department's Chief Bridge Engineer for past nine years and has 34+ years of service with the Department. Steve Johnson has been named as the new Chief Bridge Engineer.

Secretary Bergquist updated the Commission regarding ongoing discussions for development of a possible township structure replacement program. Dick Howard appeared before the commission several months ago requesting help on behalf of townships on the rising issue with their larger structures that don't qualify for the BIG grant program. The Commission directed Secretary Bergquist and staff to meet with stakeholders and discuss this topic to come up with a proposed plan of how to address this need. A small group including, but not limited to, Greg Vavra, Dick Howard, Duane Sutton, Laurie Schultz, Bob Wilcox, and a handful of others met. The group developed a draft plan for a county administered program. If the commission decided to allocate funds, the funds would be distributed by formula to the counties for use on these types of structures. The distribution formula would be based on the number of eligible structures in a county. Counties would be responsible for working with their townships to prioritize needs and projects. Counties would be responsible for reporting annually on how their funds were used in order to be eligible to receive future funds. (LTAP would help with the report compilation.) The counties and townships are in the process of doing an inventory of all the structures in order to develop a proposed distribution formula. We would anticipate bringing this proposal to the Commission at a later date.

Last month the Commission awarded a number of bridge improvement grant ("BIG") funds. After that award, staff identified an error in the formula used to rank the major rehabilitation/replacement projects. Staff is reviewing the ranked scores of unsuccessful applicants and next month will come back with an agenda item to reconsider all the unsuccessful applicants. The Department strongly recommends not revoking any of the awarded grants.

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Greg Fuller, Director of Operations, presented the following Construction Change Orders to the Transportation Commission:

Construction change orders approved in April contain an increase of approximately \$49,053.

Over the past 12 months, the overall contract increase is 1.06%.

The following projects have a Construction Change Order (CCO) amounting to a contract change in excess of \$50,000.

Explanation of Change on CCO No. 3: This decrease was the result of numerous minor adjustments made to various contract quantities. The adjustments were made to match the actual quantities used during construction and are considered normal variations.

The adjustments were made to match the actual quantities used during construction. Increases were made for additional asphalt concrete and asphalt binder due to plan errors and changes ordered by the Department during construction. The incentive payments were made in accordance with the contract.

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# HB 1214

{ BOARD CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

# HB 1214

- Also applies to certain education-related entities (not covered in this presentation).

# HB 1214

- HB 1214 passed during the 2016 Legislative Session.
- Sets forth new laws associated with conflicts of interest for certain State board, commission, and authority members.
- Mirrors some language from 2015's HB 1064 regarding conflicts for state employees and officers.

# HB 1214

- Applies to current and certain former Board members
- Not retroactive to Board members who only served before July 1, 2016

# HB 1214

- Applies to 22 named boards, commissions, & authorities, including:
  - Transportation Commission
  - South Dakota State Railroad Board
  - South Dakota Railroad Authority
  - Aeronautics Commission

(Each is referred to in this presentation as "Board")

# HB 1214

- Unless a waiver is properly granted, Board member cannot:
  - Contract with or derive direct benefit from a contract with the state related to the subject matter of the Board
  - Contract with or derive direct benefit from a contract with a political subdivision of the state if the political subdivision administers or executes similar subject matter programs as the state Board

## HB 1214

- "DERIVE A DIRECT BENEFIT:"
  - Five percent interest in the entity contracting with the state
  - Derives income, compensation, or commission directly from the contract or from a party to the contract
  - Acquires property under the contract
  - Serves on the board of directors of an entity that derives income or commission directly from the contract or acquires property under the contract

## HB 1214

- EXAMPLES
  - Within jurisdiction or related to the subject matter of the Board
  - With a political subdivision that administers or executes similar subject matter programs

## HB 1214

- NOT INCLUDED IN "DERIVE A DIRECT BENEFIT":
  - Increase in value of investment, if the board member has less than a five percent interest
  - Participating in a vote or a decision where the member's only interest is the effect of an act of general application

## HB 1214

- WAIVER REQUIREMENT:
  - Full written disclosure to the Board
  - Board reviews essential terms of the contract/transaction and the board member's role in the contract/transaction
  - Board determines if transaction and contract are fair and reasonable and not contrary to public interest
  - Board authorization must be in writing and filed with Auditor-General. The authorization is a public record.

## HB 1214

- FORMER BOARD MEMBERS
  - Conflict prohibition applies for period of one year after service
  - Effective July 1, 2016
    - Resignations

## HB 1214

- BOARD WAIVER PROCESS:
  - Standing agenda item at beginning of each meeting for addressing conflicts
  - Written request for waiver by Board member
  - Questions from Board at meeting
  - Discussion
  - Determination (include in meeting minutes)
  - If granted, prepare written authorization
  - Alternative process for conflicts with substantive items for consideration on agenda

## HB 1214

- Penalties
  - Removal from Board
  - Class I Misdemeanor
  - Contract is voidable
  - Loss of benefits derived from contract or transaction

## HB 1214

- Forms
  - Draft forms for Board Member and Board
  - Modeled after forms used for employee conflict
  - Filed with Auditor-General
