Purpose

The purpose of the Advisory Council shall be to guide the Division of Behavioral Health with the planning, coordination and development of the state comprehensive behavioral health services plan. The Advisory Council shall advocate on behalf of persons served to ensure their highest attainable degree of independence, productivity, community integration and quality of services. The Advisory Council will also advise the Division of Behavioral Health on statewide treatment, prevention, and rehabilitation needs within the current behavioral health system.

Minutes:

I. Call to Order / Welcome and Introductions

August 18, 2016 the Behavioral Health Advisory Council meeting was called to order.

Tiffany Wolfgang introduced the new Human Services Center Administrator, Troy Jones, whose first day was May 24th. Troy was the Executive Director/Hospital Administrator at the New Mexico Behavioral Health Institute.

II. Review and Approval of Meeting Minutes

The Council reviewed the November 2015 and April 2016 meeting minutes. No proposed changes were recommended.

III. Election of Chairperson

Lois Knoke and Phyllis Arends were nominated for the role of Chairperson. Under written ballot, Phyllis Arends was selected for the position. Lois Knoke will continue as Vice Chairperson.

IV. Bylaws, Membership Composition & Meeting Times

The Council reviewed current bylaws and discussed the current membership composition and timeframe for meetings. Discussion was also had in regards to how to make meetings more meaningful and productive for everyone involved.

The Council agreed to continue with meeting at least four times per year. It was also decided to not make any changes to membership composition as this time. In addition, bylaw amendments were proposed and will be presented for approval at the next meeting.

To date, the following positions are vacant:

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V. Behavioral Health System Update

Human Services Center (HSC)

Troy Jones, HSC Hospital Administrator, provided an update from HSC along with describing his background. Troy answered questions from the Council including an explanation of the admission process. In addition, Troy discussed an initiative which will pull together performance data into a dashboard so all staff are able to see how they are making a difference for people at HSC.

Fiscal Reports

Tiffany Wolfgang provided an overview of the FY 2017 budget in the areas of substance abuse and mental health services.

First Episode Psychosis (FEP)

Southeastern Behavioral Health Care in Sioux Falls received additional training through OnTrack NY for their First Episode Psychosis Program on July 26-28, 2016. Behavior Management Systems in Rapid City received their initial 3 day training through OnTrack NY on August 24-26, 2016. Both teams will be presenting FEP at the NAMI Conference September 29th and 30th.

Technical Assistance Request

Tiffany Wolfgang provided an update regarding the technical assistance requested through the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration for methamphetamine/opioid addiction treatment. The technical assistance will focus primarily on evidence-based practices including competencies, curriculums and trainings our state would want to consider as we move forward with providing additional support and enhancements to our two current specialized programs; City/County Alcohol and Drug Program in Rapid City and Keystone in Canton.

Methamphetamine Awareness Campaign

Tiffany Wolfgang provided an update to the “Meth Changes Everything” awareness campaign. The three Prevention Resource Centers in the state will be charged with the tasks of coordinating school presentations and community town hall meetings on the campaign across the State. A website has been developed that include school and community specific videos, information on the dangers of meth and resources available in the State for individuals who are using meth.

Prevention

Tiffany Wolfgang announced that the Prevention Program received notification that it will be receiving a Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) grant from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration by October 1, 2016. The grant is for 1.6 million a year for 5 years and will provide funding to support screenings in medical clinics, brief intervention and brief treatment services in the community, and referral to structured treatment for those abusing substances. During Phase I of the grant, the focus will be on multiple clinics in Sioux Falls operated by Avera, Phase II will then include clinics in Central SD and Phase III will focus on clinics in Western, SD.

Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT)

Tiffany Wolfgang announced that three Community Mental Health Centers, HSC and 34 correctional mental health professionals have been trained in DBT. DBT is a cognitive behavioral treatment that is effective at treating a wide range of disorders including borderline personality disorder, substance use dependence, depression, and post-traumatic disorder.

Motivational Interviewing

Tiffany Wolfgang provided an update regarding the Motivational Interviewing training being conducted by the Addiction Technology Transfer Center (ATTC). Two level I, two level II, and a train the trainer in motivational interviewing training occurred in FY16. Forty-three staff from Department of Social Services Behavioral Health, Human Service Center, and Criminal Justice Initiative Providers attended the level I and Level II Motivational Interviewing training. Nineteen staff from Department of Social Services Behavioral Health and Human Service Center attended the motivational interviewing train the trainer training.

In FY 17 there will be two level I (October-November), two level II (January-February), and a train the trainer (March). A total of 50 staff will be trained in Motivational Interviewing in FY17. The train the trainer in March will consist of Criminal Justice Initiative Providers (20 staff).

Juvenile Justice Reinvestment Initiative (JJRI)

Tiffany Wolfgang provided the Council an update on JJRI. Functional Family Therapy (FFT) is available statewide through a network of 11 agencies. .

Behavioral Health Logic Model

Tiffany Wolfgang and Bre Baltzer provided a brief overview of the Behavioral Health Logic Model.

VI. Future Meetings

The next Council meeting will be held on Thursday, November 17th from 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. (CDT) at RedRossa in Pierre.
