



Staff Analysis

- 1) Balcon Enterprises is a package supply business with its headquarters in Elk Point. The business sells new and used Gaylord boxes. Boxes that are no longer usable are recycled. The business also assists the city of Elk Point with its recycling efforts. The business is out-growing its existing recycling building and is requesting funding to construct a new recycling center and purchase a new baler and forklift.
- 2) The South Eastern Council of Governments performs loan analyses for private entities applying to the Solid Waste Management Program and conducted the financial review for the Balcon Enterprises application. Financial Information is considered Confidential in accordance with SDCL 46A-1-98 for private entities.
- 3) Staff analysis indicates that by providing a Solid Waste Management loan with the requested rate and term, when compared to conventional financing methods at current market rates, Balcon Enterprises would receive \$190,000, or approximately 20 percent of total project costs, in subsidy through this loan.

Funding Recommendation: \$954,000 Solid Waste Management Program loan at 2.25% for 20 years.

Loan Contingencies:

- 1) Contingent upon the Borrower adopting a resolution approving the form of the loan agreement, the promissory note, and the pledge of revenues for repayment of the loan.
- 2) Contingent upon the Borrower approving a security agreement and mortgage.

- 1) Colton was awarded a \$1,385,000 Clean Water State Revolving Fund loan for this project in March. The loan has not closed.
- 2) If all funding is provided as loan Colton would have to establish a surcharge of approximately \$38.75. Colton's current rate is \$45.50/5,000 gallons.
- 3) Colton recently increased its rates by \$20/5,000 gallons to provide funding for this project which can be used to offset the required surcharge.
- 4) The staff funding recommendation will require a surcharge of \$27.85. However, staff analysis indicates that Colton could restructure its rates to keep rates at approximately \$48/5,000 gallons.

Funding Recommendation: Rescind Board resolution #2017-35 and award a \$1,974,000 Clean Water SRF loan at 2.50% for 30 years

and an \$800,000 Consolidated grant.

Debt Service Coverage: 110% based on a surcharge of \$27.85/customer.

Loan Contingencies:

with 41.6% principal forgiveness not to exceed \$558,000, and keep the existing \$815,000 Consolidated

grant with the grant percentage reduced to 37.8% of total project costs.




Figure 1. Sample locations in Faulk, Hyde, Hand, Spink, and Beadle Counties.




Figure 2. Sample locations in McCook, Minnehaha, Turner, and Lincoln Counties.




Figure 3. Sample locations in Bon Homme County.




Figure 4. Isotope data from wells completed in aquifers.




Figure 5. Delta deuterium versus delta oxygen-18 for samples collected from till, surface water, and rainfall.




Figure 6. Delta deuterium versus delta oxygen-18 for samples collected from outwash, surface water, and rainfall.




Figure 8. Delta deuterium versus delta oxygen-18 for samples collected from outwash having water with a radiocarbon age of 3,500 years or older, surface water, and rainfall.
