INTRODUCTIONS: The commission members introduced themselves.

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL: Chairman Robert McGrath called the meeting to order. A quorum was present.

COMMISSION MEMBERS PRESENT: Robert McGrath, Patrick Snyder, Kim McIntosh, Paul Merriman, Tina Titze, Dustin Willett, Andrew Canham, and John Forman.

COMMISSION MEMBERS ABSENT: Becky Pitz and Mike Carter.

OTHERS PRESENT: See attached attendance sheet.

APPROVAL OF JUNE 26, 2017, MEETING MINUTES: Motion by Titze, seconded by Forman, to approve the minutes from the June 26, 2017, State Emergency Response Commission meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

CHEMICAL FACILITY ANTI-TERRORISM STANDARDS (CFATS) PROGRAM

OVERVIEW: Thad Fitch, Department of Homeland Security, Rapid City, SD, presented an overview of the CFATS program. He answered questions from the audience.

EPA UPDATE, TABLE TOP EXERCISE, CAMEO TRAINING: Lori Reed, EPA Region 8, provided an update on EPA activities regarding the hazardous rail storage issue, the Clean Power Plan, the Clean Water Act, and Confined Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs).

Ms. Reed reported that there will be a Regional Response Team meeting October 17-18, 2017, in Denver, CO. She encouraged the SERC members and staff to attend that meeting.

Ms. Reed discussed the Local Government Reimbursement Program and CAMEO software training offered by EPA Region 8. She also distributed a list of training and resources that EPA Region 8 offers to states in the region.

Ms. Reed noted that the 2018 Western Region SERC/TERC conference will take place January 30-31, 2018, in Seattle, Washington.

Ms. Reed discussed a table top exercise provided by EPA Region 8 that is solely focused on emergency plans.

LEPC GRANT APPLICATION PACKAGE: Ms. Kindt distributed copies of the draft copy of the LEPC grant application package. The grant package will be mailed to the LEPCs and emergency managers. The deadline for submittal of applications is November 30, 2017. Applications not postmarked, received, or hand-delivered by the deadline will not be accepted.

Ms. Kindt reported that \$45,468 is available for LEPC grants this year. Only active LEPCs are eligible to apply for grant funds. Individual grant amounts will be determined by a distribution formula. The first \$16,500 will be divided evenly among LEPCs that qualify for and have applied for a grant. The remaining amount will be divided among the qualifying LEPCs based on the number of facilities that paid Tier II fees for the reporting year from which the grant is funded. Increasing facility compliance can result in an increase in grant funds for future years.

Ms. Kindt requested approval of the grant application package.

Motion by Willett, seconded by Snyder, to approve the grant application package and to authorize Ms. Kindt to distribute it to the LEPCs and emergency managers. Motion carried unanimously.

HMEP GRANTS, TRAINING AND PLANNING REPORT: Autumn Stout, Office of Emergency Management, provided the quarterly review of training and planning grant activities.

Ms. Stout reported that about \$87,500 is remaining in the 2016 grant. There are several projects that haven't yet submitted reimbursements requests. If there are any excess 2016 grant funds, those funds will be rolled over into grant year 2017.

For grant year 2016, fifteen projects were completed. A total of 167 students were trained through the hazmat classes, and a total of nine personnel attended hazmat continuing education conferences.

Training for Sioux Falls Fire Rescue was set up then cancelled due to Hurricane Harvey. Approximately \$6,500 was allocated for this training. Staff is currently working with Sioux Falls Fire Rescue on re-allocating the funding, and it will likely be rolled over to the 2017 grant year.

Pennington County also had to cancel a hazmat exercise. Approximately \$2,600 was allocated for that exercise, and those funds will be rolled over to the 2017 grant year.

The continuing application for FY 2017 funding has been submitted to DOT/PHMSA. The State is slated to be awarded \$143,519.00. This agreement should be issued by DOT/PHMSA this month.

Ms. Stout noted that Dustin Willett attended the 2017 Western Regions SERC/TERC conference. Eighty percent of the cost for Mr. Willett to attend meeting was funded through the HMEP program and 20 percent was provided using LEPC grant funds. She stated that if a SERC member is interested in going, HMEP grant funds can again be used to pay for 80 percent of the cost.

Mr. Willett volunteered to attend the conference in 2018.

Chairman McGrath requested SERC approval for Mr. Willett to attend and be reimbursed for attending.

Motion by Titze, seconded by Snyder, to approve using SARA fees to provide 20 percent of the cost of Dustin Willett's attendance of the 2018 Western States SERC meeting in Seattle, WA. A roll call vote was taken, and the motion carried with McIntosh, Forman, Merriman, Titze, Snyder, Canham, and McGrath voting aye. Willett abstained from voting.

Chairman McGrath asked Mr. Willett to provide a summary of the Western States SERC meeting at the March 2018 SERC meeting.

Mr. Willett stated that if the SERC members, staff, or anyone from the public has a concern they would like him to bring forward during the Western States SERC meeting, please let him know.

Ms. Stout answered questions from the SERC regarding the HMEP grants.

Ms. Stout noted that she and Chairman McGrath had discussed possibility of hosting statewide training to provide hazmat awareness and hazardous operations. They also discussed the potential of holding an annual hazmat conference.

Chairman McGrath noted that the possibility of holding a hazmat conference will be placed on the SERC agenda for discussion sometime in the future.

REGIONAL HAZMAT TEAM UPDATE: Tina Titze, Office of Emergency Management, presented an updated prepared by Stefan Pluta, director, Officer of Homeland Security, regarding South Dakota Task 1, previously referred to as the Regional Hazmat Teams. South Dakota Task Force 1 is conducting training in September and October specific to field force extrication related to the various planning efforts that state agencies are doing as well as local and law enforcement agencies related to civil unrest preparations for multiple reasons.

Mr. Willett stated that he is a member of South Dakota Task Force 1, and he recently attended a field force extrication course held in Rapid City.

OTHER BUSINESS: Kim McIntosh reported that DENR and county emergency managers have been involved in training and table top exercises with some of the pipeline facilities in the state.

Ms. McIntosh noted that she represents the state on the regional response team so she will be attending the meeting October 17-18, 2017, in Denver, CO. Mr. McIntosh will provide an overview of that meeting during the next SERC meeting.

Tina Titze stated that she has been selected for the National Advisory Council for FEMA. The council advises the FEMA director.

The next SERC meeting is December 18, 2017, from 10:00 a.m. to noon Central Time via the Digital Dakota Network at sites in Pierre, Brookings, Mitchell, and Rapid City.

ADJOURN: Motion by Willett seconded by Titze, that the meeting be adjourned. Motion carried unanimously.

FFY 2016 Grant Award Amounts:

- Federal Share: **\$144,617.00**
- Non-Federal Share (Match): **\$36,154.00**
- Total: **\$180,771.00**

FFY 2016 Federal Share Spent/Remaining To-Date:

- Spent: **\$103,271.26** (projects) + **\$25,258.83** (personnel, operating, supply, and indirect costs) = **\$128,530.09**

 - \$6,465.00 has been re-allocated to Sioux Falls Fire Rescue for FY 2017 due to an unforeseen cancelled project in FY 2016;
 - \$8,300.00 will be spent on a TEEX Pipeline Awareness/Operations course in the spring, likely hosted in Pierre;
 - \$1,225.00 will be used for Dustin Willett's attendance at the Western Regions SERC Conference;
 - **Total=\$15,990.00**

HMEP Grant Year 2016

- Twenty-six projects were completed (two hazmat courses in Codington County, a Hazmat IQ Decon training, ARFF Spring Live Burn training, ARFF Fall Live Burn training, Blue Card online training, attendance at the IAFC conference, and attendance at the Safe Transportation Training Specialists training for Aberdeen Fire & Rescue, three hazmat courses in Edmunds County, hazmat plan updates/rewrites for Spink, Douglas, Aurora, and Hand Counties, commodity flow studies for Hanson, Lake, and Fall River Counties, attendance at the FDIC and IAFC conferences for a total of three personnel, a Hazmat IQ course, and attendance at the Safe Transportation Training Specialists training for Sioux Falls Fire Rescue, attendance at the Cold Zone and FDIC conferences for a total of five personnel, ARFF training, and attendance at the Safe Transportation Training Specialists training for Watertown Fire Rescue, attendance at a hazmat training at the Security and Emergency Response Training Center in Pueblo, Colorado for two personnel from the Rapid City Fire Department). A total of 257 students were trained through the hazmat classes and a total of nine personnel attended hazmat continuing education conferences.
 - One training for Sioux Falls Fire Rescue (TEEX Pipeline Technician training at the Texas A&M facility in College Station, TX) was cancelled due to Hurricane Harvey. \$6,465 was allocated for this training, which was rolled over and re-allocated to the 2017 grant year.
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HMEP Grant Year 2017

- Through the FY 2017 grant, funding was awarded to complete six hazmat plan updates/rewrites, one hazmat exercise, four hazmat awareness/operations trainings, attendance at five hazmat trainings/conferences for Aberdeen Fire Rescue, attendance at four hazmat trainings/conferences for Sioux Falls Fire Rescue, and attendance at five hazmat trainings/conferences for Watertown Fire Rescue.
- Two projects have been completed (attendance at the Hot Zone conference in Houston for three personnel from Watertown Fire Rescue and attendance at the TEEX Transportation Specialist training for one member of Sioux Falls Fire Rescue).
