MINUTES OF THE 203RD MEETING OF THE WATER MANAGEMENT BOARD FLOYD MATTHEW TRAINING CENTER 523 EAST CAPITAL AVE PIERRE, SD

May 11, 2017

CALL TO ORDER: Chairman Hutmacher called the meeting to order at 10:31 a.m.

APPLICATIONS: Water Right No. 2704A-3, Hilltop Irrigation District; Future Use Permit No. 5209-3, Kingbrook RWS; Water Right No. 1407-1, Cundy Trust; and Water Permit No. 7350-3, Richard Schmit.

APPROVE March 1, 2017, MINUTES: Motion by Bjork to approve the minutes, seconded by Freeman. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

NEXT MEETING: July 12 - 13, 2017, in Pierre.

STATUS AND REVIEW OF WATER RIGHTS LITIGATION: Board Counsel Matt Naasz stated George Ferebee appealed the board's dismissal of his petition for declaratory ruling to the seventh circuit. The Appellant's Brief was filed on May 9, 2017. Mr. Ferebee will have an opportunity to respond before it is fully briefed. The board also received notification of an open meetings complaint filed before the Open Meetings Commission. The complaint was made by Mr. Ferebee, regarding the October 2016 meeting. A request for extension to respond will be filed with the commission to allow the board to meet at their July 2017 meeting to discuss the appropriate response and take official action.

ADMINISTER OATH TO DENR STAFF: The court reporter administered the oath to the DENR staff who intended to testify during the meeting.

UPDATE ON DENR ACTIVITIES:

• Staff Changes. Jeanne Goodman stated that Ken Buhler, Lynn Beck and Gail Jacobson with the Water Rights Program intend to retire this June.

Motion by Hoyt, the board expresses its appreciation to Mr. Buhler for the expertise and the assistance he has provided to the board over the years, seconded by Freeman. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Motion by Freeman, to extend our thanks to Gail Jacobsen and Lynn Beck for their professional service and dedication to the State of South Dakota, seconded by Bjork. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

REQUEST TO RESCIND SUSPENSION OF WATER RIGHT NO. 2704A-3, HILLTOP IRRIGATION DISTRICT FOR FAILURE TO SUBMIT 2016 IRRIGATION QUESTIONNAIRE:

Water Right No. 2704A-3, with a priority date of April 29, 1976, is held by Hilltop Irrigation District, and authorizes diversion of water from the Missouri River for irrigation of 1,911 acres

in Brule County, South Dakota. The original water permit was approved with the mandatory requirement to submit the annual irrigation questionnaire. The water right was suspended for the 2017 irrigation season for failure to submit the 2016 irrigation questionnaire.

Genny McMath discussed the history of irrigation questionnaire submittals by District representatives dating back to 2003.

On May 1, 2017, through telephone communication with Dick Lloyd, Vice President of Hilltop Irrigation District, a 2016 irrigation questionnaire was directed to his attention and a hearing was scheduled for today for the Board to review a one year suspension of water right. The 2016 irrigation questionnaire and a request by the District to rescind the suspension has been received and is on file.

Dick Lloyd, Todd Priebe and others were on the line to answer questions.

Mr. Hoyt stated the annual questionnaire submittals have been consistently tardy and asked what steps have been put in place to insure timely submittal of future irrigation questionnaires. Prior to answering the questions, Todd Priebe was administered the oath by notary public Karen Schlaak.

Mr. Priebe stated the District has a different person now responsible for completing the annual irrigation questionnaire.

Motion by Freeman to reinstate Water Right No. 2704A-3 for Hilltop Irrigation District with the understanding that leniency only happens once, seconded by Bjork. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND FINAL DECISION IN THE MATTER OF CANCELLATION OF WATER RIGHT FILING NO. 0494-2, BOLLMANN:

Mr. Naasz stated there were no objections filed by any of the parties.

Motion by Freeman to adopt the Water Management Board rulings on the party submission, seconded by Comes. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Motion by Freeman to adopt the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Final Decision as prepared by the board's attorney, seconded by Bjork. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

CANCELLATION CONSIDERATIONS:

Mr. Gronlund stated the chief engineer is recommending cancellation of seven permits in their entirety and two partial cancellations.

Vested Water Right No. 2368-2 held by for Brent and Taylor Fox appropriates 1.27 cfs from Battle Creek for irrigation of 89 acres, Cancellation consideration is for unused portions only which consisted of 3.4 acres, 0.05 cfs and the diversion point in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 27, T3S, R9E.

Water Right No. 4680-3, for Gracevale Hutterian Brethren, is for irrigation of portions of the S ½ Section 3 and the NE ¼ Section 10, T105N, R54W. Cancellation consideration is for NE ¼ Section 10. The land in Section 3 is still being irrigated. Also, Mr. Gronlund informed the Board that Gracevale Hutterian Brethren filed for and has obtained a new water permit for irrigation of the NE ¼ Section 10.

Motion by Freeman to cancel Division 1 and Division 2, with Vested Right No. 2368-2 only cancelling the portion associated with 3.4 acres, 0.05 cfs and the diversion point in the SW ¼ NW ¼ Section 27, T3S, R9E and cancel Division 3 Water Rights, with No. 4680-3 only cancelling the portion associated with the NE ¼ Section 10, as stated in the chart, seconded by Comes. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

SEVEN YEAR REVIEW OF FUTURE USE PERMIT NO. 5209-3, KINGBROOK RWS:

Randy Jencks and an associate participated by phone.

Mr. Gronlund stated this permit was approved in 1989 and currently reserves 1,100 acre-feet annually from the Vermillion East Fork Aquifer located in the SW ¼ SW ¼ Section 10; NE ¼ Section 8; Section 6; all in T111N-R56W. Kingbrook Rural Water System serves users in Beadle, Brookings, Clark, Kingsbury, Lake, McCook, Minnehaha, Miner, Moody, Hamlin and Sanborn Counties.

The Chief Engineer is recommending that the Future Use Permit remain in effect for 1,100 acre-feet annually. The fee assessed if the Board rules to allow the future use permit remain in effect is \$155.00.

The review of Future Use Permit No. 5209-3 was public noticed and no petitions in response to the notice were filed.

Motion to allow Future Use Permit No. 5209-3 to remain in effect by Hoyt, seconded by Holzbauer. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

QUALIFICATION AMENDMENT TO WATER RIGHT NO. 1407-1, CUNDY TRUST:

Water Right No. 1407-1, appropriates 0.57 cubic feet of water per second from one well completed into the Minnelusa aquifer at a depth of 940 feet for irrigation of 40 acres. This is located about three miles northeast of Spearfish in Lawrence County. The priority date is September 16, 1987.

The water permit was issued with qualifications. Qualification No. 1 states:

The well approved under this permit shall be valved and the flow reduced to the amount needed or to a minimum when not being used. The well shall also be equipped with a pressure gauge and a record kept of any pressure fluctuations. Such records shall be available to the Chief Engineer upon request.

An investigation was conducted on October 21, 2016, by Water Rights Inspector Steve Quissell for the purpose of licensing. That investigation found the well is equipped with a non-functioning pressure gauge and that records are not kept. The investigation did find that the well is valved and flow controlled to the amount needed.

The water license was issued on January 30, 2017. The cover letter accompanying the licenses stated the permit contained a qualification requiring the well to be equipped with a pressure gauge and records needing to be kept of any pressure fluctuations. In response, LaVon Colwell, Trustee for Cundy Trust, submitted a letter requesting amendment of the qualification to remove the requirement that the well be equipped with a pressure gage and records kept of the pressure fluctuations.

Mr. Gronlund presented the staff report on the request to amend qualification No. 1 on Water Right No. 1407-1. There was concern back in the early 1960's regarding decline of pressure in area aquifers in northwest South Dakota and well construction practices commonly referred to as open hole completion that could allow water from different formations to mix. That resulted in an observation well being constructed in 1962 into the Minnelusa aquifer in the area of Water Right No. 1407-1. The hydrograph from 1977 is included in the report and shows that current appropriations are not impacting water levels. The historic data from this observation well is of greater value as a continuous record of the artesian head pressure of the aquifer than a pressure gauge on a private well.

A review of area water rights indicates that inclusion of the pressure gauge qualification on water rights has varied over time.

The pressure gauge does not need to be in place for DENR purposes on the well authorized by Water Right No. 1407-1. There may be value of having a pressure gauge to the water right holder in detecting problems with the well.

Notice was sent on April 18, 2017, of today's hearing. A May 3rd notice provided information regarding the meeting being held by telephone conference call.

Chief Engineer's recommendation is that Qualification No. 1 on Water Right No. 1407-1 be amended to remove the pressure gauge requirement and record keeping. Qualification No. 1 to Water Right No. 1407-1 should read:

The well approved under this Permit shall be valved and the flow reduced to the amount needed to a minimum when not being used.

Motion by Hoyt to amend Qualification No. 1 as recommended by the Chief Engineer, seconded by Freeman. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

QUALIFICATION AMENDMENT TO WATER PERMIT NO. 7350-3, RICHARD SCHMIT:

Water Permit No. 7350-3 authorizes the diversion of 1.56 cubic feet per second of water from the Big Sioux River to irrigate 120 acres of land. The diversion point is located in the W½ NW¼ Section 3-T115N-R52W, five miles north of Castlewood in Hamlin County.

Currently Water Permit No. 7350-3 has a qualification that diversion of water from the Big Sioux River is authorized only when 35 cfs or greater is by-passing USGS Gaging Station No. 06479525 near Castlewood.

The proposed amendment to the qualifications on Water Permit No. 7350-3 is to clarify that the permit is subject to senior water rights and allow flexibility for the Chief Engineer to issue written orders when conditions warrant allowing continued pumping when flow at the Castlewood gage is below 35 cfs if downstream flows are sufficient.

During the summer of 2016, pumping ceased when flows fell below 35 cfs at USGS Gaging Station No. 06479525 near Castlewood as required by qualification No. 2 on Permit No. 7350-3. USGS Gaging Station No. 06479770 near Bruce is located approximately 33 miles downstream. Due to inflow from contributing tributaries between the two gages the flow near Bruce was significantly higher.

During the primary irrigation months of June through August in 2016 the gaging stations recorded the following mean monthly discharge.

Gage	June	July	August
Castlewood	27.7 cfs	10 cfs	28.7 cfs
Bruce	126 cfs	59 cfs	99 cfs

Currently there are no water rights diverting from the Big Sioux River below the diversion point for Water Permit No. 7350-3 to the USGS gage near Castlewood. There are three water rights diverting water between the USGS gage near Castlewood and the USGS gage near Bruce. Water Right No. 1812-3 has a priority date of March 9, 1971, and appropriates 1.2 cfs

of water from the Big Sioux River to irrigate 70 acres of land. This water right is currently enrolled in the Conservation Reserve Program until 2018. Water Right Nos. 23-3 and 119A-3 divert flood flow from the Big Sioux River for lake restoration. Diversions occur when flood flows on the river are sufficient to travel down a man-made ditch. Flow at the Castlewood gage would be well above 35 cfs when diversion under 28-3 and 119-3A would occur.

The data from the two gages suggest there was sufficient water available to allow pumping for irrigation, and prior water rights would not have been adversely impacted. However, the wording of the qualification lacked the flexibility to allow the Chief Engineer to issue orders that would have allowed pumping to continue. Amending the qualifications on Water Permit No. 7350-3 gives the Chief Engineer the flexibility to issue written orders to allow continued diversion so that water can be placed to its maximum beneficial use.

The proposed amendment to the qualifications on Water Permit No. 7350-3 is to clarify that the permit is subject to senior water rights and any written orders by the Chief Engineer and that flow by-pass restrictions are also subject to written orders by the Chief Engineer.

It is recommended that the qualifications on Water Permit No. 7350-3 be amended as follows.

Delete: Qualification No. 1 and No. 2

- 1. Diversion of water under this permit shall be in accordance with any written orders issued by the Chief Engineer.
- Diversions from the Big Sioux River are authorized only when the flow at the USGS
 Gaging Station No. 06479525 near Castlewood is at least 35 cfs while pumping under
 this permit.

Add: Qualification No. 1 and No. 2

- 1. Diversions under this Permit are subject to senior water rights and shall be in accordance with any written orders issued by the Chief Engineer.
- Low flows as needed for domestic use, including livestock water and prior rights must be bypassed. This permit does not authorize diversion of water from the Big Sioux River, when pumping, unless at least 35 cfs is flowing at USGS Gaging Station No. 06479525 near Castlewood, unless written orders have been issued by the Chief Engineer.

Motion by Freeman to adopt the new qualifications as recommended by the Chief Engineer, seconded by Bjork. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

ADJOURN: Chairman Hutmacher declared the meeting adjourned.

It is our understanding from his communication with you that the mining claims (named Cody 1 and Cody 2) were filed in the 1980's and were closed and abandoned in 1987. The Chief Engineer of the Water Rights Program is recommending cancellation of Water Permit No. 1874-2 due to abandonment and/or forfeiture.

The Water Management Board will consider cancellation of Water Permit No. 1874-2 at 1:00 pm, Wednesday, July 12, 2017 (Central Time) in the Floyd Matthew Training Center, Joe Foss Building, 523 E Capitol, Pierre, SD (the agenda time is an estimate and the actual time of hearing may be later).

Pursuant to SDCL 46-2A-2 and 46-5-37.1, the following is the recommendation of the Chief Engineer, Water Rights Program, Department of Environment and Natural Resources concerning Water Permit No. 1874-2. The project site is on land owned by the US Forest Service.

The Chief Engineer is recommending cancellation of the above water permit due to abandonment and/or forfeiture.

The original water permit was filed by Midwest Marine Contractor Inc from Mt Prospect Illinois. The permit authorized a small commercial placer mining operation. The permit holder could not be located however the operation was to be conducted on land owned by the US Forest Service. Pursuant to SDCL 46-2A-2 and 46-5-37.1, the following is the recommendation of the Chief Engineer, Water Rights Program, Department of Environment and Natural Resources concerning Water Right No. 4915-3, now owned by Richard Sweeney.

The Chief Engineer is recommending cancellation of the above water right due to abandonment and/or forfeiture.

The 2016 irrigation questionnaire submitted by the Jack Borchers, the manager of the property, indicated the water use had been abandoned. Irrigation questionnaires on file with the Water Rights Program show irrigation was last reported in 2007. On April 25, 2017, Mike DeFea, staff engineer, spoke with Mr. Borchers about the water use system. Mr. Borchers confirmed the land is no longer irrigated. The irrigation system had been blown over in a possible tornado and it will not be replaced. The well is not a dependable source of water.

On April 28, 2017, Mike DeFea spoke with Troy Swee with the Farmers National Company in Beresford. Mr. Swee confirmed no irrigation was being done and irrigation system would not be replaced. 

Report on Vested Water Right Application Nos. 1964-1, 1965-1, 1966-1 and 1967-1 Ollila Family Trust c/o Art Ollila April 21, 2017

The Ollila Family Trust c/o Art Ollila has filed four applications to validate vested water right claims. Application No. 1964-1 requests impoundment of 1.5 acre-feet of water from runoff into a dam located in the SE ¼ SE ¼ of Section 6-T7N-R6E with a claimed priority date of December 31, 1929. Application No. 1965-1 requests impoundment of 3.2 acre-feet of water from runoff into a dam located in the NW ¼ NW¼ of Section 8-T7N-R6E with a claimed priority date of December 31, 1929. Application No. 1966-1 requests impoundment of 24 acre-feet of water from runoff into a dam located in the SE ¼ NE ¼ of Section 7-T7N-R6E with a claimed priority date of December 31, 1939. Application No. 1967-1 requests impoundment of 2.0 acre-feet of water from runoff into a dam located in the SE ¼ NE ¼ of Section 7-T7N-R6E with a claimed priority date of December 31, 1939. The water use for each vested water right claim is livestock watering purposes.

Vested Water Right Application No. 1964-1:

This dam is located in the SE ¼ SE ¼ of Section 6-T7N-R6E. It is 8.5 feet high and has a claimed storage capacity of 1.5 acre-feet at the primary spillway elevation. It has a total drainage area of 0.69 square miles or 442 acres; however, there are four other dams located upstream on this drainage.

The first dam is located about 1000 feet upstream and in the NW ¼ NW ¼ of Section 8-T7N-R6E. Vested Water Right Application No. 1965-1 has been filed for this dam with a claimed storage capacity 3.2 acre-feet. The next dam is another 1700 feet upstream and is located near the center of the NW ¼ of Section 8-T7N-R6E. This dam is located on the applicant's property and appears to be about the same size as the previous dam, about 3 or 4 acre-feet storage capacity. Then there are two dams located off the applicant's property located in the SW ¼ NE ¼ and the NE ¼ SE ¼ of Section 8-T7N-R6E. Both of these dams appear to be in that 3 or 4 acre-foot storage capacity range.

The annual yield for this drainage area with an 80 percent chance of occurrence, or 8 out of 10 years, is expected to be 6.6 acre-feet. The annual yield with a 50 percent chance of occurrence, or 1 out of 2 years, is expected to be 17 acre-feet; and the annual yield with a 10 percent chance of occurrence, or 1 out of 10 years, is expected to be 74 acre-feet.

Vested Water Right Application No. 1965-1:

This dam is located in the NW ¼ NW ¼ of Section 8-T7N-R6E. It is 10 feet high and has a claimed storage capacity of 3.2 acre-feet at the primary spillway elevation. It is located about 1000 feet upstream of the dam in Vested Water Right Application No. 1964-1.

Vested Water Right Application No. 1966-1:

This dam is located in the SE ¼ NE ¼ of Section 7-T7N-R6E. It is 19 feet high and has a claimed storage capacity of 24 acre-feet at the primary spillway elevation. It has a total drainage area of 0.47 square miles or 301 acres; however, there are three other dams located upstream on this drainage.

The first dam is located about 600 feet upstream and on the west fork of the drainage area and in the SE ¼ NE ¼ of Section 7-T7N-R6E. This dam is located on the applicant's property and Vested Water Right Application No. 1967-1 has been filed for this dam with a claimed storage capacity 2.0 acre-feet. The other two dams are located off the applicant's property; about 2500 feet upstream on the east branch of the drainage area, and are both in the SW ¼ of Section 8-T7N-R6E. Location Notice 1664-1 was filed in 1950 for 16 acre-feet in the larger of the two dams. The smaller dam appears to be in the 4 or 5 acre foot range.

The annual yield for this drainage area with an 80 percent chance of occurrence, or 8 out of 10 years, is expected to be 4.5 acre-feet. The annual yield with a 50 percent chance of occurrence, or 1 out of 2 years, is expected to be 11.5 acre-feet; and the annual yield with a 10 percent chance of occurrence, or 1 out of 10 years, is expected to be 50 acre-feet.

Vested Water Right Application No. 1967-1:

This dam is located in the SE ¼ NE ¼ of Section 7-T7N-R6E. It is 16 feet high and has a claimed storage capacity of 2.0 acre-feet at the primary spillway elevation. It is located about 600 feet upstream and on the west fork of the drainage area for the dam in Vested Water Right Application No. 1966-1.

Discussion:

The four Vested Water Right Applications have been filed for dams on two different drainages. Both drainages have additional dams. The expected annual yield for these drainages indicate that there will be insufficient water to satisfy all of the dams during most years, especially the southern drainage with the two larger dams with storage capacities of 24 acre-feet and 16 acre-

feet. However, the Affidavits of Use filed with the applications and the Location Notice on file indicate that these dams have co-existed for a number of years.

Conclusions:

- 2. Vested Water Right Application No. 1965-1 with the claimed Affidavit of Use should be approved for a dam with 3.2 acre-feet storage capacity and a claimed priority date of December 31, 1929.
- 3. Vested Water Right Application No. 1966-1 with the claimed Affidavit of Use should be approved for a dam with 24 acre-feet storage capacity and a claimed priority date of December 31, 1939.
- 4. Vested Water Right Application No. 1967-1 with the claimed Affidavit of Use should be approved for a dam with 2.0 acre-feet storage capacity and a claimed priority date of December 31, 1939.

The Ogallala aquifer underlies approximately 134,000 square miles of the United States including portions of Colorado, Kansas, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Texas, and Wyoming (Gutentag et. al, 1984). In South Dakota, the Ogallala aquifer underlies approximately 1,140,360 acres and contains an estimated 19,929,600 ac-ft of recoverable water in storage in Bennett, Gregory, Ogallala Lakota, Todd, and Tripp Counties (Allen, Iles, and Petres, 1985). The Ogallala Group consists of silts, sands, clays, and surface gravel deposits (Filipovic, 2011; Gutentag et. al, 1984). The Ogallala aquifer is primarily under unconfined conditions, but locally confined conditions do exist (Water Rights, 2017a). The water movement in the aquifer is generally from the northwest toward the southeast and outward from the center toward the edges of the aquifer (Filipovic, 2004).




Figure 1- Approximate areal extent map of the erosional remnant of the Ogallala aquifer Application No. 2758-2 proposes to use

This application proposes to withdraw water from a portion of the Ogallala aquifer that is hydraulically disconnected from the main body of the aquifer. The Ogallala Group has been entirely eroded through down to the underlying Pierre Shale under the channel of Ponca Creek along its southwestern border and under the channel of the South Fork Whetstone Creek along its northeastern edge. This erosional remnant underlies approximately 135,000 acres of Gregory County (Filipovic, 2004; Martin et. al, 2004) and approximately 30,000 acres of Boyd County Nebraska (UNL, 2017). Figure 1 is a map of the approximate areal extent of the portion of the Ogallala aquifer from which this application proposes to withdraw water.

The existing well and proposed well sites are near the edge of this portion of the Ogallala aquifer. Logs for geologic borings in the files of the DENR-Feedlot Program (2017) indicate the existing well, listed as 40 feet deep in this application, is likely completed into silty clay, silty sand, silt, and/or sand. These sediments are labeled fine to coarse alluvium on the logs and may have been misidentified. These unconsolidated deposits are likely eroded Ogallala Group and directly underlying formations at the edge of the Ogallala aquifer. Gutentag and others (1984) stated unconsolidated alluvial, erosional, and eolian deposits that lie directly on the Ogallala Group are likely in hydraulic connection to and should be considered part of the Ogallala aquifer. The well may also penetrate into the Pierre Shale. The applicant stated the static water level in the existing well is nine feet below grade.

SOUTH DAKOTA CODIFIED LAW (SDCL) 46-2A-9

Pursuant to SDCL 46-2A-9, a permit to appropriate water may be issued only if there is a reasonable probability that there is unappropriated water available for this applicant's proposed use, that the proposed diversion can be developed without unlawful impairment of existing rights and that the proposed use is a beneficial use and in the public interest. This report will address the availability of unappropriated water and effects on existing rights from the aquifer that are pertinent to this application.

WATER AVAILABILIITY:

This application proposes to appropriate water from the Ogallala aquifer. The probability of unappropriated water available from the aquifer can be evaluated by considering SDCL 46-6-3.1, which requires "No application to appropriate groundwater may be approved if, according to the best information reasonably available, it is probable that the quantity of water withdrawn annually from a groundwater source will exceed the quantity of the average estimated annual recharge of water to the groundwater source." If the source of the water is older or lower than the Greenhorn Formation and a water distribution system has applied for a permit, the Board need not consider the recharge/withdrawal issue. In this case, the aquifer is not stratigraphically lower than the Greenhorn Formation and the applicant is not a water distribution system.

Observation Well Data:

Administrative Rule of South Dakota Section 74:02:05:07 requires that the Water Management Board shall rely upon the record of observation well measurements in addition to other data to determine that the quantity of water withdrawn annually from the aquifer does not exceed the estimated average annual recharge of the aquifer.




Figure 2- Hydrograph for GY-78A, approximately 3.2 miles north-northeast of the well sites (Water Rights, 2017a)

The DENR-Water Rights Program monitors 77 observation wells completed into the Ogallala aquifer with seven completed into the portion of the Ogallala aquifer this application proposes to use (Water Rights, 2017a). The existing and proposed well sites are within approximately six miles of four Ogallala aquifer observation wells, GY-78A, GY-77B, GY-57A, and GY-77A, as shown in Figure 1. The hydrographs for the observation wells are shown in Figures 2 through 5, respectively. These hydrographs are representative of this portion of the Ogallala aquifer and the Ogallala aquifer in South Dakota as a whole. In general, the aquifer has stable to rising water levels over the period of record.




Figure 3- Hydrograph for GY-77B, approximately 4.5 miles northwest of the well sites (Water Rights, 2017a)




Figure 4- Hydrograph for GY-57A, approximately 5.0 miles east of the well sites (Water Rights, 2017a)

The three low spikes in water level shown in the hydrograph for GY-57A are the result of routine maintenance (pumping with air). After the well was pumped with air it slowly recovered to static water level. When comparing the water level of GY-57A to other observation wells completed into this portion of the Ogallala aquifer, it appears to be representative of this portion of the Ogallala aquifer.




Figure 5- Hydrograph for GY-77A, approximately 5.9 miles northwest of the well sites (Water Rights, 2017a)




Figure 6- Map of wells authorized by water rights around observation well GY-77A

The water levels shown in the hydrographs for observation wells GY-78A, GY-77B, GY-57A, and GY-77A document there is little effect caused by total well withdrawal on the water level of this portion of the Ogallala aquifer. The water levels shown in the hydrographs rise during wet

times when recharge exceeds natural discharge plus pumping and slowly declines when natural discharge plus pumping exceeds recharge. The hydrograph for GY-77A shows some short term temporal effect of pumping on the water level, but the water level is still dominated by climate. Figure 6 is a map showing wells authorized by water rights in the vicinity of observation well GY-77A. When the effects of climate dominate the water level of observation wells, it means recharge to and natural discharge from an aquifer significantly exceeds pumping. Natural discharge from an aquifer can be captured for pumping. Therefore, the hydrographs document there is unappropriated water available from this portion of the Ogallala aquifer to support this proposed diversion.

Recharge and Discharge:

Recharge:

This portion of the Ogallala aquifer is primarily recharged through infiltration of precipitation on the aquifer (Filipovic, 2004). Kolm and Case (1983) estimated a range of recharge rates from 1.3 to 1.8 in/yr. based on eight percent of annual precipitation for their digital model. Hedges and Burch (1985) estimated recharge to the Ogallala aquifer using two different methods, observation well data analysis and base-flow recession analysis. Hedges and Burch (1985) estimated a recharge rate of 1.88 in/yr. using base-flow recession and a range of 2.2 to 3.4 in/yr. using observation well data analysis. Thus, estimated annual recharge to this portion of the Ogallala aquifer ranges from 17,875 to 46,750 ac-ft/yr.

Discharge:

This portion of the Ogallala aquifer discharges through well withdrawals, seepage to streams hydraulically connected sediments, and springs. There are 21 water rights/permits authorizing the withdrawal of water and two future use permits reserving water in this portion of the Ogallala aquifer (Water Rights, 2017b). The non-irrigation water rights/permits are listed in Table 1. Irrigation water rights/permits are listed in Table 2.




Figure 7- Map of wells authorized by water rights/permits to withdraw water from the portion of the Ogallala aquifer Application No. 2758-2 proposes to use (Water Rights, 2017b)

The volumes listed in Table 1 were estimated by assuming pumping at the maximum permitted diversion rate for 60 percent of the time. Water Right No. 2728-2 has a permitted volume of 309 ac-ft/yr. Future Use Permit No. 1622-2 and 1660-2 reserve 269 and 396 ac-ft/yr. The estimated annual pumpage by non-irrigation appropriations plus full development of the future use permits is 2,268.5 ac-ft/yr. Figure 7 is a map showing the wells authorized by water rights/permits to withdraw water from the same portion of the Ogallala aquifer this application proposes to use.

There are a number of domestic wells completed into this portion of the Ogallala aquifer (Water Rights, 2017c). However, the annual withdrawal for domestic use is not significant to the hydrologic budget of the aquifer. Table 3 shows the irrigation pumping history from this portion of the Ogallala aquifer.

Hydrologic Budget:

The estimated average annual recharge to the portion of the Ogallala aquifer this application proposes to use ranges from 17,875 to 46,750 ac-ft/yr. The estimated average annual pumpage is less than 2,500 ac-ft/yr. This application proposes to appropriate 63 ac-ft/yr. The difference between estimated average annual recharge and average annual withdrawals concurs with the observation well data. Therefore, there is a reasonable probability unappropriated water is available for this proposed appropriation.

EXISTING WATER RIGHTS:

The existing well site and proposed well site for Application No. 2758-2 are approximately 0.6 miles south of the well site authorized by Water Permit No. 2625-2 for Raymond Yager (Water Rights, 2017b). The next nearest appropriative wells are three miles away. It is likely there are domestic wells completed into this portion of the Ogallala aquifer within approximately one mile of the well sites this application proposes to use.

The Ogallala aquifer at the existing well this application proposes to use is under unconfined conditions. Drawdown created from pumping a well in an unconfined aquifer is minimal within a short distance of the well. Although many of the assumptions of the Theis Equation are not valid in this case, it can be used to provide a general estimate of drawdown. Assuming the parameter values shown in Table 4, the estimated drawdown 0.6 miles after continuously pumping for 219 days is 0.25 feet (Utah, 2017). It would take 219 days of continuous pumping at the requested diversion rate to pump the annual volume requested of 63 ac-ft. The effects of boundary conditions could increase the drawdown 0.6 miles away from the pumping well.

Observation well GY-77A is within 1.5 miles of several wells operated by the City of Gregory under Water Right Nos. 1031-2, 1668-2, and 2728-2. The hydrograph shows minimal effects caused by pumping the City of Gregory's wells on the water level in the observation well. This application proposes a diversion rate of 0.14 cfs (65 gallons per minute). The relatively low diversion rate means the amount of drawdown created from pumping the existing well or the proposed well will be relatively limited. Precise estimates of drawdown cannot be determined without aquifer testing. The 63 ac-ft/yr. requested by the applicant is slightly more than double the 29 ac-ft/yr. allowed for each domestic user at 18 gallons per minute continuously. Considering all that information, it is probable this proposed diversion will not adversely impact existing water users.

The Water Management Board defined an "adversely impacted domestic well" in ARSD 74:02:04:20(7) as:

"a well in which the pump intake was set at least 20 feet below the top of the aquifer at the time of construction or, if the aquifer is less than 20 feet thick, is as near to the bottom of the aquifer as is practical and the water level of the aquifer has declined to a level that the pump will no longer deliver sufficient water for the well owner's needs".

Nearby adequate wells are not expected to be adversely impacted as defined in ARSD 74:02:04:20(7). However out of an abundance of caution if this application is approved, the water permit should include a qualification the well owner should control their withdrawals so there is not a reduction of needed water supplies for adequate domestic wells or for adequate wells having prior water rights. When all of the above factors are considered, there is a reasonable probability the proposed diversion can be made without adversely impacting existing appropriative or domestic water users.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATION:

There has been some history of opposition to development of appropriative use of water from this portion of the Ogallala aquifer. A letter of opposition to this application has already been filed by Raymond Yager. Mr. Yager indicated a number of local residents also intend to oppose

this application. The applicant, A.J. Steffen, previously petitioned as one of nine people in opposition to approval of Mr. Yager's permit, Water Permit No. 2625-2. A hearing in front of the Water Management Board was held on May 7, 2008, on Application No. 2625-2. Mr. and Mrs. Yager appeared along with a concerned but not in opposition neighbor, Pat Cerny. Application No. 2625-2 was approved by the Board without findings of fact and conclusions of law. The construction period for Water Permit No. 2625-2 ended May 2013, but there is no well completion report on file with the DENR-Water Rights Program (Water Rights, 2017b and 2017c). Notes on Mr. Yager's annual irrigation questionnaires indicate he was unable to find sufficient aquifer material to support a well and was attempting to supply his irrigation system with a dam. In January 2010, Mr. Yager was sent a notice of cancellation. Mr. Yager requested the cancellation be put on hold because he still wanted to use a well for his irrigation project. Since 2013, Mr. Yager's annual irrigation questionnaires have indicated there was sufficient moisture. The 2012 questionnaire indicated the system was not yet constructed.

Water Permit No. 2691-2 for Chad Kehn was opposed for concerns of lack of available water and potential impacts on existing water users. The well authorized by Water Permit No. 2691-2 is approximately 9.7 miles east-southeast of the well sites this application proposes to use. Water Permit No. 2691-2 was approved after a hearing in front of the Water Management Board.

Mr. Yager's letter of opposition to Application No. 2758-2 stated he has a few issues with this application: 1) "...the negative impact the request for an increase of water will have on our current well...", 2) "...as well as adding to the contamination of surrounding ground water and wells...", 3) air quality deterioration due to manure dust from the current feedlot operation, and 4) "...smell, dust and insects have grown exponentially and is often times untenable for us." Issues 3 and 4 are public interest issues and will not be addressed in this report. Issue 2 is a concern about the potential for contamination of the surrounding groundwater and wells. That has to do with the applicant's feedlot and manure management and would be addressed by the review of a permit application by the DENR-Feedlot Program. It is also a public interest issue. Issue 1 states concerns about potential on Mr. Yager's well. As previously stated, there is more annual recharge than there are withdrawals from this portion of the Ogallala aquifer. Furthermore, the limited diversion rate proposed by this application and the distance between the well this application proposes to use and the Mr. Yager's well means there is a low probability of impacts from pumping this proposed diversion on Mr. Yager's well. There is no information available to determine if Mr. Yager's well is adequate.

CONCLUSIONS:

- 1. Application No. 2758-2 proposes to authorize the appropriation of 63 ac-ft/yr. at a maximum diversion rate of 0.14 cfs the Ogallala aquifer for commercial use in a livestock facility in Gregory County.
- 2. The existing well and proposed well site are in an erosional remnant of the Ogallala aquifer that covers portions of Gregory County and extends into Boyd County, Nebraska.
- 3. Based on the observation well data and a hydrologic budget, there is a reasonable probability unappropriated water is available for this proposed appropriation.

4. There is a reasonable probability the diversion proposed by this application can be made without adversely impacting existing appropriative or domestic users.

Pursuant to SDCL 46-2A-2, the following is the recommendation of the Chief Engineer, Water Rights Program, Department of Environment and Natural Resources concerning Water Permit Application No. 2758-2, Steffen Farms LLC, c/o A J Steffen, 34419 295th Street, Burke SD 57523.

The Chief Engineer is recommending APPROVAL of Application No. 2758-2 because 1) there is reasonable probability that there is unappropriated water available for the applicant's proposed use, 2) the proposed diversion can be developed without unlawful impairment of existing rights, 3) the proposed use is a beneficial use and, 4) it is in the public interest with the following qualifications:

- 1. The wells approved under Water Permit No. 2758-2 will be located near domestic wells and other wells which may obtain water from the same aquifer. The well owner, under these Permits shall control withdrawals so there is not a reduction of needed water supplies in adequate domestic wells or in adequate wells having prior water rights.
- 2. The new well authorized by Permit No. 2758-2 shall be constructed by a licensed well driller and construction of the well and installation of the pump shall comply with Water Management Board Well Construction Rules, Chapter 74:02:04 with the well casing pressure grouted (bottom to top) pursuant to Section 74:02:04:28.
- 3. Water Permit No. 2758-2 is subject to compliance with requirements of the Department's Water Pollution Control Permit issued pursuant to SDCL 34A-2-36 or 34A-2-112 for concentrated animal feeding operations.
- 4. Water Permit No. 2758-2 is subject to compliance with all existing and applicable Water Management Board Rules including but not limited to:
 - a) Chapter 74:54:01 Ground Water Quality Standards,
 - b) Chapter 74:54:02 Ground Water Discharge Permit,
 - c) Chapter 74:51:01 Surface Water Quality Standards,
 - d) Chapter 74:51:02 Uses Assigned to Lakes,
 - e) Chapter 74:51:03 Uses Assigned to Streams, and
 - f) Chapter 74:52:01 through 74:52:11 Surface Water Discharge Provisions

This is a letter of opposition to the application for a water permit filed by Steffen Farms LLC c/o A J Steffen, 34419 295th St, Burke SD 57523 to appropriate 63 acre feet of water annually at a maximum diversion rate of 0.14 cubic feet of water per second from an existing well and a new well to be completed into the Ogallala Aquifer (40 feet deep) located on his farm for commercial use in a feedlot facility.

That is an astronomical amount of water for one farm to be taking from the aquifer. This is a feedlot not a city. Mr. Steffen already has one well. By putting down a well the size he proposes, he will have access to an un limited amount of water without cost or monitoring of the amount or use. Once this size well is approved, Mr. Steffen can withdraw twice the stated amount. This operation has a history of not being truthful.

I am concerned as to how a withdrawl of this magnitude is going to affect the overall level of the Aquifer. How is it determined that there is actually that much unappropriated water available for the taking? Just about every farm in the countryside has a well in the Aquifer, as do the cities, and West River Rural Water. My farm well has been in place in the Aquifer for 40 years. The Aquifer level is affected by over use, drought, and floods indicating that existing wells can be compromised by those not protective of our environmental components.

This well would certainly be beneficial use to the feedlot—but NOT to the surrounding neighborhood and community.

As for it being in the public interest, that depends on what sector of public you are asking. It would be to the Steffen Farms and those associated with them, but definitely NOT to the surrounding neighbors and communities they would be taking from.

We oppose the amount of water requested by the granting of water permit NO.2758-2 by Steffen Farms LLC.

The applicant states the he is "Applying for a CAFO from [DNR] water use for proposed CAFO." On April 18, 2017 the Gregory County Commission cited the 2-mile setback-from-existing-residences rule in the Gregory County Planning and Zoning Ordinance to deny Steffen Farms LLC to move forward with their feedlot expansion at the sited location. Based on this ruling DENR cannot issue an approval of Steffen Farms LLC application to expand their current feedlot size beyond 999 head of cattle. Therefore, Steffen Farms LLC show no need for such a large quantity of water (.14 cfs) they have requested.

We own farm property with 4 existing domestic use wells located on land in the N 1/2 of the NW 1/2 and the NE 1/2 of Sect. 18, T 96N R 71 less than one mile of the proposed well site for Steffen Farm LLC. We believe this new amount of water which is requested is now not needed by Steffen Farms LLC nor is it in the public interest (SDCL 1/2).


