#### SDSL STRATEGIC PLAN SURVEY

Summary of responses as of 2/1/2019

Survey was launched in September 17, 2018.

#### **Total responses: 459**

50% of respondents were librarians and library staff

21% library trustees

8% teachers

Remaining 21%: city/county officials, state government employees, citizens & other

### We asked survey takers which of our services are most valued by their libraries or schools.

The top four services were:

83% Electronic resources (databases) and print content that we provide

69% Interlibrary loan / sharing resources, services and support (training and technology)

52% Formal annual trainings like Public Library Institute, School Library Boot Camp, JumpStart summer reading, webinars offered, etc.

45% Reference and Research services / digitization of state publications

#### 54% or respondents said they were aware of all of the eleven services we listed.

Of the SDSL services listed, building capacity and local leadership skills, trustee opportunities, etc. was the service respondents were most often unaware that we offer. 25% of respondents were unaware of this SDSL service.

## We asked respondents what they feel are challenges for providing quality and relevant library services to their communities in the next ten years.

The top four challenges were:

68% Local funding

65% Keeping up with technology

40% Reaching out to underserved populations such as non-English speakers and families in poverty

36% Hiring trained librarians

## We asked respondents whether the State Library is a valued and used resource for their library, city, or school.

Responses:

70% Yes

20% Sometimes

2% No

8% Don't know

### We asked respondents how well the State Library provides information and research to meet state agencies' needs.

Responses:

29% Exceptionally well

40% Above average

12% Adequately

Top responses were:


.66% Programs / events / outreach

38% Staff certification / Library accreditation


34% for *each* of these topics: Summer reading, SD Share-It interlibrary loan, using local and state data



What services provided by the South Dakota State Library offer your library (or school) the most value and would be the MOST MISSED if no longer offered? (choose all that apply)




# Which of these services were you UNAWARE were offered by South Dakota State Library to SD libraries? (choose all that apply)




What do you feel are the challenges for providing quality and relevant library services to your community in the next 10 years? (choose all that apply)






Is the State Library agency a valued and used resource for your library (city, school, other)?


