Board Discussion

Janice Minder, System Vice President for Academic Policy and Planning, Molly Weisgram, System Academic Program Manager, BOR, and Laura Scheibe, Director, Division of College, Career and Student Success, DOE, gave a presentation on:

• Early Preparation for Post-secondary Education and some initiatives.

 The Dakota Dreams Online Tutoring Program. The grant allows for two years of online tutoring in South Dakota.

 Dakota Dreams Career Exploration Summer Camps. The grant allows for threesummers of camps.

Transitions from high school to post-secondary education

 Our Dakota Dreams promotes post-secondary education in South Dakota, which was initiated with the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) project. Includes the development of the Our Dakota Dreams website.

 FAFSA completion push, brought back the FAFSA Completion Portal which a is a tool for high school counselors to track their student's completion or noncompletion of the FAFSA application.

Shannon Malone, Director, Division of Learning and Instruction, DOE, spoke on the Proactive Admissions Initiative. The proactive admissions initiative offers students who meet certain criteria guaranteed general acceptance to any of the state's six public universities and four technical colleges.

 Free application period expanded to October 3, 2022, to November 30, 2022, for the six public universities and one technical college at this time.

Scheibe, DOE, also reported that SDMyLife is proving to be a successful tool for academic and career planning. It is useful for students and schools.

Thinking that ten years from now 109 110 there will be an impact from today's discussions and ideas.
