- Call to Order:** 9:05 a.m. on August 21, 2020.
Introductions were shared by members present.
- Minutes from August 16th, 2019 Committee Action:** E Preszler moved to approve the August 16, 2019 SDBON APRN Advisory Committee meeting minutes, seconded by A Klinkhammer.

- Advanced Practice Nursing Advisory Committee Membership:**
 - Committee roster of members reviewed, directed to provide updates to L. Young.
 - Committee appointments: J. Gibson and A. Klinkhammer requested reappointment.
Action: L. Young will, for those requesting reappointment, share request with the Board of Nursing at the September 2020 meeting.
- SD APRN Workforce Report:** L. Young reviewed APRN licensure data as of 8/4/2020. The number of actively licensed CNPs has grown significantly over the years; CRNA populations has grown; CNM remains stable, and the CNS population has decreased.
- SD PDMP Report:** L. Young presented the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) report developed by Melissa DeNoon, R.Ph., PDMP Program Director, SD Board of Pharmacy. CNPs and CNMs, who are registered with the SD Department of Health's controlled substance registration, are required in SD law to register with the SD PDMP, 92% of CNPs and CNMs are compliant. LY will request more information from DeNoon as to who the remaining 8% are and to inquire about how best to encourage them to comply. R. Arends shared that some states require the CNP to provide a copy of their PDMP enrollment card prior to issuing them a state control substance license. DeNoon's report identified that the community MedDrop program has expanded significantly.
Action: LY will share suggestions with DeNoon on follow-up on CNPs/CNMs not registered.

¹1-27-1.17. Draft minutes of public meeting to be available--Exceptions--Violation as misdemeanor. The unapproved, draft minutes of any public meeting held pursuant to § 1-25-1 that are required to be kept by law shall be available for inspection by any person within ten business days after the meeting. However, this section does not apply if an audio or video recording of the meeting is available to the public on the governing body's website within five business days after the meeting. A violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor. However, the provisions of this section do not apply to draft minutes of contested case proceedings held in accordance with the provisions of chapter 1-26.

6. **Review SD APRN Scope of Practice Decisioning Algorithm and Practice Guidelines:** Members discussed assisting APRNs in understanding their roles in their specific specialty areas, inclusion of NP licesned focus area with their licensed title of CNP may be beneficial. Discussion was held on methods to communicate to APRNs on responsibility to know their practice and to stay within the scope of their licensed focus areas.
Action: LY and R. Arends will assess ways to develop communication to assist licensees and employers understand differences in focus areas and practice.
7. **SD and National Legislative/Rules Updates:** L. Young shared 2020 SD legislative changes that impacted the Board of Nursing, including: SB 50 on CRNA practice. A. Klinkhammer shared the change in practice law for CRNAs has significantly reduced barriers for practice especially in rural areas.

Review SDBON Proposed Rules: ARSD 20:48:04 – L. Young read the proposed rules, discussion was held on the rules. The public hearing on the proposed rules will be September 24, 2020 and the Legislative Review Committee hearing will be November 10, 2020.

Committee Action: L. VanGerpen moved to approve the SDBON Proposed Rules ARSD 20:48:04 as presented, seconded by K. Foland.

8. **National Nursing Association Updates:** Members shared a brief overview of activities of their national or local professional associations including: Nurse Practitioner Association of SD (NPASD), American Academy of Nurse Practitioners (AANP), American Association of Nurse Anesthetists (AANA), National Association of Clinical Nurse Specialists (NACNS), and the American College of Nurse-Midwives (ACNM). Members reported that 2 CRNAs are running for positions in State Government: Taylor Rehfeldt and Sidney Davis; as well as Erin Tobin, CNP. LY shared information on NCSBN’s Annual meeting regarding the approval of new APRN compact language; the new language requires an APRN to have a minimum of 2080 practice hours to obtain a multi-state APRN compact license. LY shared that SD’s CNS practice laws are not consistent with full practice authority or prescriptive authority for APRNs and this presents challenges for SD to join the APRN compact. LY also informed members that an APRn also needs to meet the nation’s uniform license requirements (ULR) to be issued a compact license.
9. **Open Dialog on APRN Practice, Roles, Activities:** The SD State Medical Association (SDSMA) is updating their position paper on pain management and prescription drug abuse. A link to the paper is on the SDBON APRN practice website and SDSMA site. LY provided a report on out-of-hospital (OOH) births attended by SD CNMs approved by the BON to attend OOH birtsh. Since 2008, 515 women requested an OOH birth, 83% delievered OOH, 11% were referred for a hosptial birth; and 6% were transported during labor to a hosptial. Outcome data is consistent with national data on OOH birth by CNMs.
