#### **CAM COREY NAMED VICE PRESIDENT:**



Cam Corey of Watertown, SD, will serve as the next Vice President of Lake Area Technical College. He will officially begin on November 1, 2023. Cam succeeds outgoing Vice President Diane Stiles, who has led the nationally recognized college since 2014.

Cam recently retired from the law enforcement profession after serving for 25 years throughout the state of South Dakota. His storied career includes training law enforcement officers and agents; advocating for children, victims, and families; and leading

the administrative operations of field service agencies. He has served on numerous state and national boards. He is a long-time educator in the law enforcement community, working as an adjunct instructor at Lake Area Technical College and several other colleges and universities, including the South Dakota Law Enforcement Training Center.

Cam Corey will be recommended for hire at the August 14<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Watertown School Board and will begin his duties as Vice President of Lake Area Technical College on November 1, 2023. Shane Swenson, Director of Outreach at Lake Area Technical College, will serve as Interim Vice President.





#### Lake Area Diesel Camp presented by Titan



### Staffing Transitions

Each school year, naturally, comes with some employee turnover. For the 2023-2024 contract year, we retained 95 percent of those who ended the previous year on-staff. Many of these individuals have been familiar faces at Mitchell Tech for 10 years or more. A handful have been on campus more than 20 years. Two of the departing employees retired at the completion of the 2022-2023 contract year.

#### **Faculty**

This fall, we will welcome six new faculty to the team, representing five different industries. Two of the new instructors will teach commercial driver licensing. Both have been serving as adjuncts in that department previously. Of the new faculty, two are coming into new positions created to better serve industry needs, and two are replacing predecessors who have either retired or moved into other teaching duties on campus.

#### Staff

The 2023-2024 school year was an end of an era at Mitchell Tech. Carmen Neugebauer, a 1981 graduate of the Steno Accounting program, retired after spending all 42 years of her career in the Financial Aid office. Longtime Financial Aid Director Grant Uecker, who hired Carmen, joined in the celebration of her retirement in May. Nichole Simmermon, an Admissions representative, is transitioning well into the position Carmen vacated in July. At the same time, Admissions Representative Heather Kulm was promoted to Director of Admissions, and the department welcomed two new representatives to the team.

### **Enrollment Events**

#### Fall Enrollment

Enrollment continues to trend positively for the 2023-2024 school year. At present, the Energy Division is on track to educate and train its largest cohort yet, with Power Line Construction & Maintenance alone welcoming 115 students this fall. Numbers are also exceptionally strong in the construction and agriculture sectors, and we are eager to welcome our first class of Entrepreneurship students to campus twice a month.

#### **Exploration Day**

July 20, Mitchell Tech welcomed 200 prospective students and parents to campus. This was our largest Exploration Day crowd to date.

#### **Dakota Dreams Camp**

July 11, more than 90 middle school students eagerly ventured across campus to learn about the trades and how Mitchell Tech can help them turn their skills, talents and interests into careers.

#### **Registration Week**

June 5-9, incoming new students came to campus to register for classes and purchase tools, scrubs, books and other supplies in order to be ready for the Fall semester to start.

### Construction Progress

#### Ag Diesel Power Building

Progress continues on the 36,000-sq ft Ag Diesel Power Building, with footings poured recently and pre-cast walls scheduled for erection in the near future. The project is on-target for its December 2023 deadline, and faculty and students are eager to utilize the new facility.

#### Radiologic Technology Wing

Renovation of the Radiologic Technology Wing is progressing nicely. Soon, General Electric will be onsite to install the new stationary X-ray unit in the second fixed lab space, and the finishing touches will go on all three lab spaces, two student observation stations and the instructors' workroom. The wing will be open in time for the start of the Fall semester.

#### Wi-Fi & Broadband Technology Department

Utilizing maintenance & repair funds, along with industry partner gifts, lab and classroom spaces in for the Wi-Fi & Broad Technology department received a facelift, with new paint, floor coverings, lighting and training modules installed since this spring, brightening and modernizing the space.


#### **STC Awards Record Number Build Dakota Scholarships**





## Signing Day Recognizes 123 Build Dakota Scholarship Recipients

The cumulative Build Dakota Scholarship awards totaled about \$2.7 million. During the ceremony, scholarship recipients signed Build Dakota Scholarship certificates, donned WDTC baseball caps, and received WDTC pennants.
