CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by Chairman Glenn Blumhardt. The roll was called, and a quorum was present.

Chairman Blumhardt stated that since he was participating via telephone from out-of-state, Vice Chairman Gregg Greenfield would chair the meeting.

APPROVE AGENDA: Motion by Karpen, seconded by Ewing, to approve the agenda. The motion carried unanimously.

APPROVAL OF JANUARY 15, 2026, MEETING MINUTES: Motion by Ewing, seconded by Miller, to approve the January 15, 2026, Board of Minerals and Environment meeting minutes. The motion carried unanimously.

MINING ISSUES CONSENT CALENDAR: Prior to the meeting the board received a copy of the consent calendar (see attachment).

Tom Cline with the Minerals, Mining, and Superfund Program was available for questions from the board. There were no questions.

Motion by Ewing, seconded by Karpen, to approve the consent calendar, as presented. A roll call vote was taken, and the motion carried unanimously.

David McVey, Assistant Attorney General, appeared on behalf of the Board of Minerals and Environment.

Matthew Naasz, Gunderson, Palmer, Nelson, & Ashmore, appeared on behalf of the Applicant, Clean Nuclear Energy Corporation, Inc.

Steve Blair, General Counsel, appeared on behalf of the Department of Agriculture and Natural Resources.

Intervenors present were Bruce Ellison, Dr. Liliias Jarding, Denise Giago, Taylor Gunhammer, Sarah Peterson, Caryn Lerman, Dr. Ben Sharp, Jeremiah Davis, Marla Cooley, Gene Parkhurst, and Elizabeth Lone Eagle

Vice Chairman Greenfield stated that the board will first consider a motion for continuance of today's hearing. Following that decision, the board will determine whether to overturn the following specific rulings made by Hearing Chairman Morris: change of hearing date and change of venue, ruling regarding the Fall River Ordinance declaring uranium mining a nuisance, applicant's motion in limine to preclude evidence regarding mining, electronic service, and translation services.

The following intervenors stated that the parties did not receive notice of today's hearing, today's hearing conflicts with the site visit of Craven Canyon, and several other reasons the board should continue today's proceedings to a future date: Mr. Ellison, Dr. Jarding, Dr. Sharp, Mr. Gunhammer, Ms. Lone Eagle.

Kimberly Craven, Attorney General of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe, stated that Steven Gunn was hired to represent the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe and the Oglala Sioux Tribe, but he is not present today because he did not receive notice and he is attending the site visit. Ms. Craven stated that she is not attending as counsel for the tribe in this matter.

Mr. Naasz requested the board consider the requests to overrule Hearing Chair's orders today rather than continuing this matter to a later date.

Mr. Blair stated that continuing to a later date is up to the board.

Motion by Greenfield, seconded by Karpen, to enter executive session in accordance with SDCL 1-25-2(3) to consult with the board's legal counsel about pending litigation.

Several of the intervenors objected to the board entering executive session.

A roll call vote was taken on the motion to enter executive session, and the motion carried with Ewing, Haag, Karpen, Miller, Schultz, Blumhardt and Greenfield voting aye. Morris abstained.
