My name is Steve Myers,

Issue #1:

On April 10, 2024, the Green Valley Sanitary District board President Jason Reitz, Secretary Lorretta Jangula, Treasure / Vice-president Scott Mohr and newly appointed Trustee Val Lewton went into executive session without citing a codified law or qualifying for executive session. They did this with GVSD attorney Erica Olson present.

The agenda says, "Discuss complaint by Steve Myers." Agendas are not read to the public before or after approval. This one could be read online 2 days before the meeting, if you have a computer and know where to go.

SDCL1-25-2 Executive or closed meetings may be held for the sole purposes of:

"Discussing a complaint" does not fall under any of those purposes. Not even #3. The OMC is not a judicial body. It is an administrative commission.

In the publication, **Conducting the Public's Business in Public**, the question is--What is the proper procedure for executive sessions? Their answer is-- "Motions for executive sessions must refer to the specific state or federal law allowing for the executive session." It goes on to say, "Also, best practice to avoid public confusion would be that public bodies explain the reason for going into executive session."

I've attached the audio for that portion of the meeting, labeled "4-10-2024 Executive Session" that tells us the truth of what happened.

Jason struggled. GVSD board Attorney Erica Olson had to advise, 5 year 7-month President, Jason Reitz that he needed a motion to go into executive session. At no time did she advise that the motion needed to include a state law or a reason for going into executive session.

November of last year, the South Dakota Open Meeting Commission found that Bennett County was in violation of the same open-meetings law.

The Open Meetings Commission ruled that <u>a complaint</u> against the Bennett County Board of Commissioners was a violation of open-meetings laws.

That was the first complaint involving the Bennett County Board of Commissioners. Another called out the board's failure to properly move into an executive session during a February 2023 meeting. The commissioners failed to cite the specific law authorizing the closed session and failed to obtain a second for the motion to enter the executive session. That was determined by the Open Meetings Commission to be a violation of state law.

On May 8, 2024, at the monthly Green Valley Sanitary District meeting, board President Scott Mohr and Vice President/Treasure Val Lewton stopped me recording the public meeting.

SDCL 1-25-11 Says I can record a public meeting.

As I did at the beginning of the previous meeting, I held my recorder up to show it and let everyone know that I am recording. I also told the person to my right that I am recording. This recorder was in plain sight in front of me on the table, 5' from the treasure and 6' from the president.

On August 27, 2025, I emailed Attorney Ty Daly asking for access to the recording of the minutes for that May 8, 2024, meeting. I did receive those minutes on September 2, 2025. I have attached the first 10 minutes of that recording, labeled "First 10 minutes."

You can hear how argumentative and dysfunctional the meeting is and the disruptions that came from other than me, including board members, especially Val Lewton.

I expressed my objection to the Secretary's misquoting me in past minutes of meetings. At approximately 7 ½ minutes I told the board that I'm recording too. Next you hear Val Lewton ask, "Did you get everyone's permission to record?"

At approximately 8 minutes Scott says, "All it takes is one opposed and you're in violation of their rights." Someone asked where he went to law school? Val replied, "That's what our attorney says."

At approximately 8½ minutes Scott looked right at me and said, "Do we need to adjourn the meeting right now?" I stopped recording and put my recorder in my shirt pocket but continued to argue my objection of the mis-quotes.

Just over 9 minutes in, GVSD resident, Julaine Jager had googled the question of recording a public meeting and stood up and read the answer. Val argues and says," You're not correct."

I've also attached a recording of Commissioner **Travis Lasseter** asking the board if they stopped anyone from recording a meeting. You can hear Scott Mohr say, "I did."

Yes, there were disruptions to the meeting. There would not have been as many if the board hadn't insisted that I stop doing something that I have the legal right to do.
