RE: Alleged Violation of Open Meeting Laws – City Council, City of Gary, SD

Dear Open Meetings Commission:

Please find enclosed the complaint and supporting investigative materials regarding the City Council of Gary, South Dakota, as outlined pursuant to SDCL § 1-25 and related statutes. The attached documents include the formal complaint, police reports, meeting minutes, and other relevant materials reviewed during the investigation.

Statement of Material Facts:

On December 1, 2025, the City Council of Gary, South Dakota, held its regular monthly meeting. During this meeting, the Council entered executive session for personnel and legal matters. The complaint alleges that three city employees were present in the executive session without a recorded motion or vote authorizing their presence, and that after being dismissed, one employee remained within earshot of the executive session, potentially overhearing confidential discussions. The complaint further raises concerns about a local conflict of interest affecting the impartial review of the matter at the county level (COMPLAINT 1-25-2, 1-27-1.6(7), 6-1-17.pdf, p. 9).

Legal Questions:

The legal questions presented include:

1. Whether the City Council violated SDCL 1-25-2 by failing to properly authorize the presence of non-council members in executive session.
2. Whether the confidentiality of executive session was breached, contrary to SDCL 1-25-2 and SDCL 1-27-1.5(7).
3. Whether a conflict of interest exists under SDCL 6-1-17 that would prevent a fair review at the local level (id., p. 10).

State's Attorney Findings:

There are three matters identified in the complaint. #3 is not within the purview of the Open Meetings Commission. Deuel County State's Attorney has reviewed this complaint and I will dismiss the #3 after the open meeting commission decides the remaining charges. Regarding #1 and #2, the Open Meeting Commission is in the best place to make this decision. I have avoided a review in this case as the matter is brought by a private citizen.

Related Litigation:

At this time, I am not aware of any ongoing litigation directly related to this complaint.

All contrary to the statute in such case made and provided and against the peace and dignity of the State of South Dakota.

Primary Narrative By Cory Borg, 02/06/26 14:51

On February 3, 2026, I (Sheriff Borg 23-1A) was given a complaint that was filed with the South Dakota Attorney General's Office from Rachel Hinsvark. The Deuel County States Attorney's Office received the complaint from the Attorney General's Office and gave me the complaint to be investigated.

The complaint is regarding the City of Gary regular monthly meeting on December 1, 2025. I have attached the agenda and meeting minutes of December 1, 2025, for the City of Gary. The Deuel County States Attorney's Office subpoenaed any video and audio from that meeting.

I have reviewed the complaint from Rachel Hinsvark, the meeting agenda, and meeting minutes from December 1, 2025, for the City of Gary meeting. I have also searched for any state law violations that might have occurred.

First by looking at the agenda, executive session for personnel and legal are on the agenda in item 25.

By looking at the minutes, Nelson motioned, Christians 2nd to go into executive session for personnel and legal matters at 7:36pm, and the motion carried. The executive session lasted until 8:30pm. No action was taken after the executive session until the motion to adjourn the meeting.

By looking into SDCL 1-25-2, a board may go into the executive session for certain reasons. Both personnel and legal are approved for executive session. In SDCL 1-25-2 it does not state a board must approve who is in executive session by a vote or another motion.

My review of the 1st complaint is unfounded as the requirements of SDCL 1-25-2 were met.

The same with SDCL 1-25-2 being executive session, it is my opinion this is confidential and should not be shared or heard with anyone. That being my opinion, SDCL 1-25-2, does not specifically state that it is confidential. This to me would be a City of Gary internal matter that they should make sure employees or public cannot hear what they are discussing in executive session.

SDCL 1-27-1.5(7) refers to personnel information other than salaries are not open to inspection or copying. The complaint refers to nothing about copying or inspection of records.

My review of the 2nd complaint is unfounded as it does not fit SDCL 1-25-2 or SDCL 1-27-1.5(7).

Finally, I have reviewed the 3rd complaint of conflict of interest. The complaint is under SDCL 6-1-17 which directly talks about discussing or voting when they have a conflict of interest. The Deuel County States Attorney and I (Deuel County Sheriff) are not county commissioners, or on the City of Gary Counsel. SDCL 6-1-17 directly talks about officials discussing or voting when there is a conflict of interest. The South Dakota Supreme Court has decided *Holborn v. Deuel County Board of Adjustment*, *Miles v. Spink County Board of Adjustment* and *Loves Travel Stops Country Stores inc. LLC v. City of Wall*. These all deal with having a pecuniary interest in the vote cast. The States Attorney and I were not involved with the City of Gary meeting, have no voting rights at those meetings and have no pecuniary interest in the City of Gary.

My review of the 3rd complaint is unfounded as it does not fit SDCL 6-1-17.

I have also assigned Deputy Sheriff Nutter to review this case as well.

Supporting Narrative By Matt Nutter, 02/06/26 14:40

On 2/3/2026, I, Investigator Matt Nutter with the Deuel County Sheriff's Office, was asked by Sheriff Cory Borg to

review a complaint against the city of Gary, South Dakota, that was sent to the Attorney General's Office. The complaint was referred back to the Sheriff's Office for review. Rachel Hinsvark made the complaint.

I reviewed the complaint and noticed it appeared to have been made by AI due to the layout. In the 1st part of the complaint, it alleges that three additional people remained in an executive session without authorization. The South Dakota Codified Law cited was SDCL 1-25-2. The codified law cited does not specify who is allowed in an executive session; it explains the reasoning for calling an executive session. I did not find that a law was violated in that section.

The second part of the complaint alleges that Joni Kjelden, the city finance officer, positioned herself directly outside the executive session room and was close enough to hear the conversations inside. The cited SDCLs were 1-25-2 and 1-27-1.5(7). 1-25-2 does not mention or specify who is allowed in an executive session; it explains the reasoning that an executive session can be called. 1-27-1.5(7) cites that personnel information other than salaries and routine directory information records is not open to inspection or copying. The SDCL cited does not apply to a person employed by the city being within "earshot" of an executive session. I did not find that a law was violated in that section.

The third part alleges a conflict of interest between Sheriff Cory Borg and Ms. Kjelden because Craig Evenson, Deuel County State's Attorney, informed Jodie Engesser that he could not assist her due to his close relationship with Sheriff Borg. Further stating that the complaint could not be addressed impartially at a county level. The SDCL cited was 6-1-17. SDCL 6-1-17 cites that an official is prohibited or voting on an issue if they have a pecuniary interest or a vote of at least two-thirds of the governing body votes that an official has an identifiable conflict they would be prohibited from voting. From my review of the city minutes, there was no vote in which the alleged people were involved; therefore, this codified law does not fit the crime committed.

Reviewing the complaint and city minutes, I did not see that a crime was committed. An outside agency, the Attorney General's Office of South Dakota, had also reviewed the complaint. As an impartial agency, I do not see that it is necessary for further action on the matter.

The complaint, and city minutes have been added to this case.

Employee, committee, and ward reports were heard. There were no public comments.

Motion by Schumacher, second by Engesser to convene jointly as Board of Adjustment and Gary City Council. All voting aye; carried.

A public hearing was held for a variance request by Craig Otto to relax the front yard setback to allow enough room for a garage. With no public concern Nosbush motioned to approve the request, second by Schumacher. All voting aye; carried. Nosbush moved to adjourn and convene as City Council only, second by Nelson. All voting aye; carried.

Sara Stoks, representing the Gary Community Club informed the council of their lighted parade event "Gate City Christmas" on Saturday December 20, 2025.

Gary Hudiburgh was not available at his scheduled time but was present by the end of the meeting. He has been to Washington to meet with the South Dakota congressional delegation to present Gary's infrastructure needs. He is working on federal funding projects and gave an update.

Motion by Nosbush, second by Nelson to give \$400 to the Deuel County Community Foundation. All voting aye; carried.

The first reading of Ordinance No. 387, supplementing the 2025 Appropriations was held. Second reading will be at the next meeting.

The eighth payment request from the State Revolving Fund loan in the amount of \$89,913.00 was approved to send in with a motion by Nelson, second by Engesser. All voting aye; carried.

A committee was formed to plan an Employee Christmas party and bring to the next meeting for approval.

Mark Johnson was present to discuss the sewer service line to his property and the surcharge being implemented January 1. There was a lengthy discussion involving other residents in attendance, with winter approaching digging will not be feasible. Schumacher made a motion to reimburse the sewer surcharge to residents who dig and find the sewer line is already capped at the property line, by June 15th, 2026, second by Christians. A written complaint received regarding barking dogs will be turned over to the Attorney to send a letter to the dog owner.

South Dakota Municipal League membership for 2026 is due. Motion by Engesser, second by Schumacher to pay the Municipal League dues of \$532.00. All voting aye; carried.

Motion by Nosbush, second by Engesser to renew the Municipal League Affiliate dues. All voting aye; carried.

Motion by Nelson, second by Christians to go into executive session for personnel and legal matters at 7:36 pm. All voting aye; carried. Motion by Schumacher, second by Nelson to exit at 8:30 pm. All voting aye; carried. No action was taken.

The end of year meeting will be held on Monday, December 29, 2025 at 5:00 pm.

Re: Request for Review of Alleged Open Meeting Violations – City of Gary, South Dakota

Attorney General Jackley,

I am writing to formally request your review and intervention regarding **alleged violations of South Dakota's open meetings laws** committed by the **City Council of Gary, South Dakota** during its meeting on **December 1, 2025**.

1. Improper inclusion of unauthorized individuals in Executive Session (SDCL 1-25-2)

During the December 1 meeting, the City Council made a motion to enter Executive Session. After the motion passed, **three city employees were kept inside the Executive Session without any recorded motion or vote authorizing their presence**, as required by **SDCL 1-25-2**.

The individuals who remained inside the Executive Session without authorization were:

- **Robin Lanners – Liquor Store Manager**
- **Joni Kjelden – City Finance Officer Assistant / Non-board Secretary**
- **Austin Crocker – City Utilities Manager**

The **City Attorney was also present**. While legal counsel may attend Executive Session for consultation, **SDCL 1-25-2 requires that any additional individuals be explicitly authorized through a vote**, which did not occur.

2. Confidentiality breach — dismissed individual overhearing Executive Session (SDCL 1-25-2 and SDCL 1-27-1.5(7))

A second violation occurred involving **Joni Kjelden**, who also acts as the non-board secretary. After being dismissed from Executive Session, she positioned herself **directly outside the Executive Session room**, in the hallway between the library and city office—close enough to hear the ongoing discussion.

I became aware of this when I was asked to step outside during Executive Session and waited in the public library area. When I used the hallway restroom, I **clearly heard the Executive Session discussion** through the door and immediately left, knowing that remaining would be improper.

Later, when **Jodie Engesser** used the restroom, she discovered **Ms. Kjelden seated on a chair directly inside the hallway**, plainly within earshot of the confidential discussion.

SDCL 1-25-2 requires that Executive Session discussions remain private, and allowing an unauthorized individual to overhear those discussions violates the purpose of the statute. Additionally, **SDCL 1-27-1.5(7)** protects personnel matters as confidential, further highlighting the importance of strict Executive Session privacy.

3. Local conflict of interest preventing fair review (SDCL 6-1-17)

This matter cannot be addressed impartially at the county level. The Deuel County State's Attorney **Craig Evenson** previously informed **Jodie Engesser** that he could not assist her due to his close working relationship with **Sheriff Cory Borg**, who has a close personal relationship with **Ms. Kjelden**.

Under **SDCL 6-1-17**, public officials must avoid conflicts of interest or even the appearance of such conflicts. The State's Attorney's stated conflict demonstrates the need for neutral state-level review.

Requested Action

I respectfully request that your office:

1. **Investigate the December 1, 2025 Executive Session** for compliance with SDCL 1-25-2.
2. **Review the unauthorized inclusion and overhearing of Executive Session discussions**, contrary to SDCL 1-25-2 and SDCL 1-27-1.5(7).
3. **Provide corrective guidance, training, or enforcement action** to ensure the City of Gary complies with South Dakota open meetings laws.
4. Consider the county-level conflict of interest (SDCL 6-1-17) and determine whether direct oversight by your office is necessary.
