

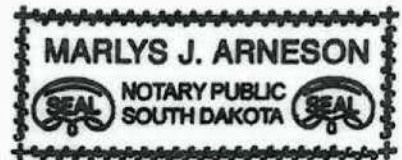

Michelle, I have included screenshots of the SDCL and the Attorney General guidance in the question and answer section. All the information is available by simply googling open meetings laws in South Dakota.

By definition a third class municipality is a political subdivision.

Subject to the open meeting laws of this state.

In October of last year I requested in person, in front of a reliable witness, that the agenda be posted on the website so I could see the agenda on the morning of the meeting. I was told that they didn't have to by Kayla. Rather than argue, I went home, printed out the law, and requested again by email that the agenda be posted. The agenda was posted in November and that's when I noticed that two of the three components that the law says "shall" and the AG says "at a minimum" is missing on our agenda. The time and location. So I emailed Kayla again and told her:

No reply and no change in December, January or February.

Upon further investigation, the agendas back to Brenda Durcan have not included the required time and location. Special meetings do have the time. My information is violations have a seven year statute of limitations.

So what's the big deal? A violation is a class 2 misdemeanor. How about 7 continuous years?

Norm Koehn said he was going to talk to Cody and Nancy. I'm not sure they will share any information with you.

In February, the Governor signed into law a bill that would require entities subject to open meetings laws to review those law annually and attest to that fact. That's a little late in this case.

The citizens of Egan deserve governance that is aware and obeys all the laws. I just want it fixed. But how do you fix something that has not been in compliance for at least 7 years and even when pointed out, simply ignored?

Every violation I could find, brought before the Open Meeting Commission, is for a single violation.

I'm sure you didn't sign up for this, but I'm not going to allow this to be ignored either.

**Q: HOW ARE THE PUBLIC AND MEDIA NOTIFIED WHEN PUBLIC BUSINESS IS BEING DISCUSSED?**

**A.** SDCL 1-25-1.1 requires that all political subdivisions (except the state and its boards, commissions, or departments as provided in § 1-25-1.3) prominently post a notice and copy of the proposed agenda at the political subdivision's principal office. At a minimum, the proposed agenda must include the date, time, and location of the meeting and must be visible, readable, and accessible to the public for 24 continuous hours immediately preceding the meeting. Also, if the political subdivision has its own website, the notice must be posted on the website upon dissemination of the notice. For special or rescheduled meetings, political subdivisions must comply with the regular meeting notice requirements as much as circumstances permit. The notice must be delivered in person, by mail, by email, or by telephone to all local news media who have asked to be notified. It is good practice for local media to renew requests for notification of special or rescheduled meetings at least annually.

SDCL 1-25-1.3 varies slightly from SDCL 1-25-1.1 and requires the State and its boards, commissions, or departments to

**1-25-1.1. Notice of meeting of political subdivision—  
Agenda—Violation as misdemeanor.**

Each political subdivision shall provide public notice, with proposed agenda, that is visible, readable, and accessible for at least an entire, continuous twenty-four hours immediately preceding any official meeting, by posting a copy of the notice, visible to the public, at the principal office of the political subdivision holding the meeting. The proposed agenda shall include the date, time, and location of the meeting. The notice shall also be posted on the political subdivision's website upon dissemination of the notice, if a website exists. For any special or rescheduled meeting, the information in the notice shall be delivered in person, by mail, by email, or by telephone, to members of the local news media who have requested notice. For any special or rescheduled meeting, each political subdivision shall also comply with the public notice provisions of this section for a regular meeting to the extent that circumstances permit. A violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor.

**Q: WHAT HAPPENS IF THE MEDIA OR PUBLIC IS IMPROPERLY EXCLUDED FROM A MEETING OR OTHER VIOLATIONS OF THE OPEN MEETING LAWS OCCUR?**

**A:** Excluding the media or public from a meeting that has not been properly closed subjects the public body or the members involved to: (a) prosecution as a Class 2 misdemeanor punishable by a maximum sentence of 30 days in jail, a \$500 fine or both; or (b) a reprimand by the Open Meeting Commission ("OMC"). The same penalties apply if the agenda for the meeting is not properly posted, or other open meeting violations occur.

Also, action taken during any meeting that is not open or has not been properly noticed could, if challenged, be declared null and void. It could even result in personal liability for members of the governing body involved, depending

On July 11, 2024 I applied for a maintenance superintendent position with the city of Egan, SD. On my application I indicated that I was a veteran.

On July 17, 2024 at the city meeting, a discussion was held about completing interviews for the finance officer, and once that was completed the board would hold interviews for the maintenance position.

On August 1, 2024 interviews for finance officer position were held. After the meeting, two board members Mike and Cody were talking and stated they wanted a guy named Nick as the snowplow operator and that Mike and Cody would just continue their dual employment as board members and as maintenance people.

On August 21, 2024 at the city meeting another discussion was held regarding the city maintenance position. Cody and Mike maintained that they were just going to continue to do the position. Board member Michelle argued with them that there were 4 applicants on the table and the board needed to do something with those applicants. Cody refused and back and forth happened and then it was decided to advertise position again to add more to the pile before interviewing. They also discussed sending letters to the 4 applicants stating that they were still under consideration.

On September 18, 2024 Kayla (city finance officer/secretary) advised the board that the facebook account was going live and the position would be advertised. No letters had been sent.

On September 23, 2024 Position was posted but it was a different description from the one the board approved and the pay was different than the previous one.

On October 16, 2024 at the city meeting it was brought up again and stated that they had 1 applicant for the snow plow position and Cody was going to check with the guy to see if he had a CDL. Michelle questioned the maintenance position again and was sternly shut down by Cody, with him stating that the letters do not need to go out as he has applied to other jobs and never got letters and that He and Mike were going to continue to do the maintenance position and they were not going to interview. Michelle stated that there were employment law violations and they should look into it.

These denials and refusals violate SD Codified law 3-3-1 thru 3-3-9.

Age, loss of limb, or other physical impairment which does not in fact incapacitate does not disqualify the veteran if the veteran possesses the qualifications and business capacity necessary to discharge the duties of the position involved. A veteran who has a service-connected disability shall be given a preference over a nondisabled veteran. In order to determine if the veterans' preference applies, each applicant for employment under this chapter shall complete an employment application on which the applicant is asked if the applicant is a veteran as defined by § 33A-2-1.
