IDEA 618 12/2/2024-12/1/2025: Child Exit

- ▶ 1140 total child exits in FFY 2023
- ▶ 64% exited at age 3
- ▶ 44%% Eligible for Part B
- ▶ 43% Not Part B Eligible, or No Longer Eligible

- ▶ Scheduled September 2026 Onsite

- ▶ State team meeting with TA centers

- ▶ Monitoring Manual – DRAFT
 - ▶ Service Coordinators
 - ▶ Direct Service Providers

Service Coordination Regions Monitoring Event


- ▶ State Monitored two service coordination regions
- ▶ First time with new tool – more efficient for state team
 - ▶ Completed via desk audit using SEIDS system
 - ▶ No travel to site – less disruptive to service coordination site
 - ▶ Most items within new SEIDS system. Limited number of other items, agency emailed to team
 - ▶ Completed both regions in two days – previously would have take several days
- ▶ State compiling report for each region
 - ▶ State will call each region to discuss results and next steps
 - ▶ Many areas of excellence within the regions
- ▶ Learning experience for state team
 - ▶ New for most team members
 - ▶ Opportunities for additional technical assistance, clarification

Monitoring – Direct Service Providers

- ▶ OSEP Guidance
 - ▶ Every provider, minimum once every six years
 - ▶ State has 300+ provider agencies
 - ▶ 500+ individual providers
- ▶ State is finalizing the monitoring tool, schedule and agencies to be monitored.
- ▶ Expected to be a full desk review.
 - ▶ Compliance and Results
- ▶ Agencies will be notified

Percent of families participating in Part C who report that early intervention services have helped the family:

- A. Know their rights;
- B. Effectively communicate their children's needs; and
- C. Help their children develop and learn.

ICC Motions (4/21/2021)

- Adopt the Early Childhood Outcomes Center Family Survey
- Begin using survey as of the FFY 2021 year (7/1/2021).
- Distribute survey electronically (with hard copy available as needed)
- *“State consider distributing the C4 survey to each family more often than at exit.”*

C4 – Update

- ▶ Able to distribute through the SEIDS System
- ▶ Met with representatives from the SC regions
 - ▶ Distribute the survey annually, in conjunction with the family IFSP
 - ▶ Greater response
 - ▶ Able to respond more timely
 - ▶ Provide feedback to providers
- ▶ State team working with SEIDS vendor
- ▶ Target start date 7/1/2025

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
