Governor's Snowmobile Advisory Council Meeting Minutes

August 13, 2022, ~ Hybrid Meeting.

Chairman Dave Kennedy called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m. Council members Scott Erstad (Via Zoom), Bruce Hintz, Al Nagel, Dave Kennedy, Todd Sprang and Todd Wilkinson were present.

Not Present: Gary Ulmer

Game, Fish, and Parks (GFP) members present: Al Nedved, Shannon Percy and Ryan Raynor.

Agenda Adoption

A motion was made by Wilkinson and seconded by Nagel to adopt the agenda. **Motion Carried.**

Approval of Minutes

A motion was made by Erstad and seconded by Sprang to approve the minutes of the May 5th, 2022, meeting as presented. <u>Motion Carried.</u>

Public Comment

No comments were made.

Black Hills Update

Percy introduced Deputy Director Al Nedved who was in the audience. Percy then introduced Ryan Fredericksen as the new Park Manager for the Snowmobile Program. Ryan came to us from working at a mine in Wyoming but was born and raised in Lead and looks forward to working with the SD Snowmobile program.

South Ditch Creek, located at the southern end of the trail system has a warming shelter located on this section of trail. Normally the county plows to this area but Custer County is no longer plowing at this location. Percy is having discussions with the Forrest Service about how plowing operations will work down in this area now.

Trail 7 and 7B by Kirk on the way to Steel Wheel runs across private property where we've had a land use agreement in place. This property has changed hands and now those people want to plow the road the trail sits on for development. Percy stated this will be the last year for this location, but we are planning on moving the trail off the private property.

Percy gave a brief Kaschmitter update, stating they can't build homes and roads fast enough. Trail will be pushed out to the ditch by Rochford Road and the trail reroute established last year hopes to be in a permanent location but is yet to be

determined. Some discussion took place about future easements but too much is unknown to start planning towards that type of contract or agreement.

Finally, Percy stated he was able to negotiate a few more dollars from Wyoming for grooming around 30 miles of trails in the state of Wyoming but that are still in the designated Black Hills Forrest Service. Contract can not exceed \$20,000 now up from \$15,000.

East River Update

Raynor indicated groomer inspections were not completed yet due to a busy summer schedule and the retirement of the Black Hills Equipment Technician Brian Nelson. Raynor did share the slides posted below per the request of Wilkinson which provides a detailed overview of what equipment that snowmobile program has across the state.

Raynor stated he now has the codes for Kalkomey to pass out on a first come first serve basis. Raynor reminded the council they approved to pay for up to 50 certifications annually at 100% back in May.

2022-2023 GIA Applications

Grant-in-Aid (GIA) applications totaling \$315,240 and includes just over 1,400 miles of groomed trails and 1,010 miles of signed trails were recommended to the council: The slide below was presented to the council which included all 14 grant applications from snowmobile clubs across eastern SD. Raynor reminded the council that the Redfield club chose to no longer participate in the GIA program due to lack of help to maintain the trail system.

FY 2023 Budget Preview (July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023)

Projected revenue for FY23 is \$801,920 while \$1,419,499 of spending authority is budgeted. The 9,712 snowmobile registrations account for \$339,920 received through the gas tax reimbursement. This revenue is based on the number of registered snowmobiles as of July 1st, x .28 cents in gas tax, x 125 gallons of fuel.

Projected Capital Assets:

Raynor stated the RTP council in June approved the majority of the 30% motorized dollars to the snowmobile program. Raynor then referred to the slide above for project costs of assets to be purchased this fiscal year.

FY 2024 Budget Recommendation (July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024)

Projected revenue for FY24 is \$802,000. Raynor told the council that all revenue projections from FY23 were brought over to FY24. Specific categories are mentioned below.



Future Program Discussions

GFP staff attending the meeting addressed the council about how snowmobiling trends and operations in the Black Hills and on the eastern side of the state are currently changing. GFP staff presented broad subjects related to the program that they feel are good starting points for discussion, while trying to create a scope of work for a consultant to come in and help plan for the future. Assess trends in Snowmobiling, Fiscal Impacts, Review program statutes, rules and procedures, specific challenges and issues, provide recommendations for various program procedures, solicit public comment and create steering committee. Wilkinson agreed this was a great idea and mentioned we are probably late in doing this based on how quickly things are changing in the hills. After further discussion Raynor would remind SDSA and the Council to agree upon a couple members for the steering committee in a few weeks and the first meeting was set for Thursday, November 10th in Aberdeen.

Election of Officers

Bruce Hintz will take over the Chairman responsibilities at the November meeting. A motion was made by Wilkinson and seconded by Kennedy to make Al Nagel Vice Chair. **Motion Carried.**

Next Meeting

The next meeting is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on Friday, November 11th, 2022, in Aberdeen. This meeting is held in conjunction with the SD Snowmobile Association Association's Annual Convention.
