Program. The changes recommended by legal counsel and by
staff are largely to do away with references to the
economic development -- do away with references to the
Value Added Finance Authority and bring them up to speed
with the now recognized Economic Development Finance
Authority, remove those statutory references thusly, as
well as to bring the rules for this program up to speed
with changes in federal tax code law as it relates to the
maximum bond principal amount for beginning farmer bonds,
bring net worth requirements subject to board approval,
and to do some basic cleanup again of outdated or
unneeded, unnecessary items.
