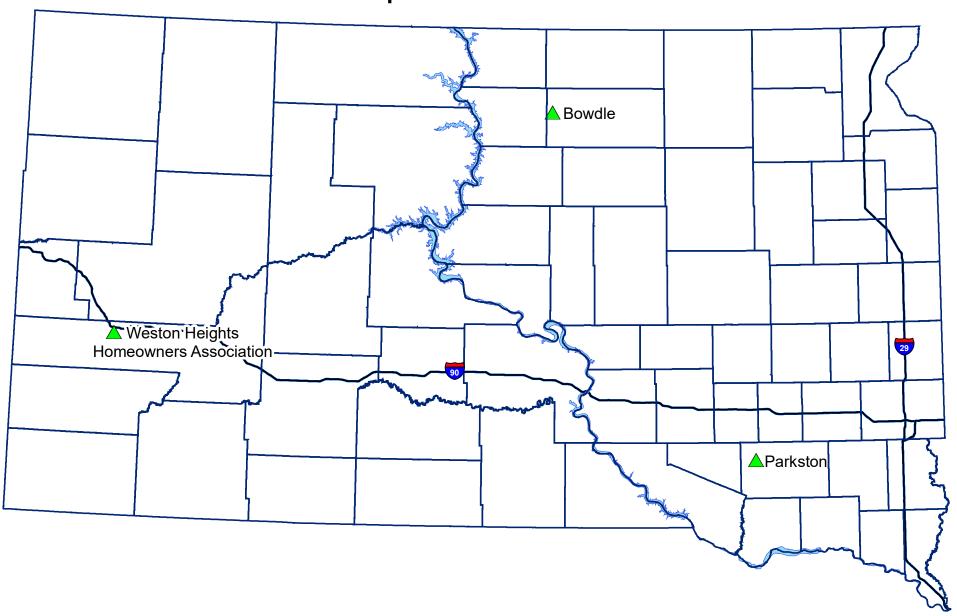

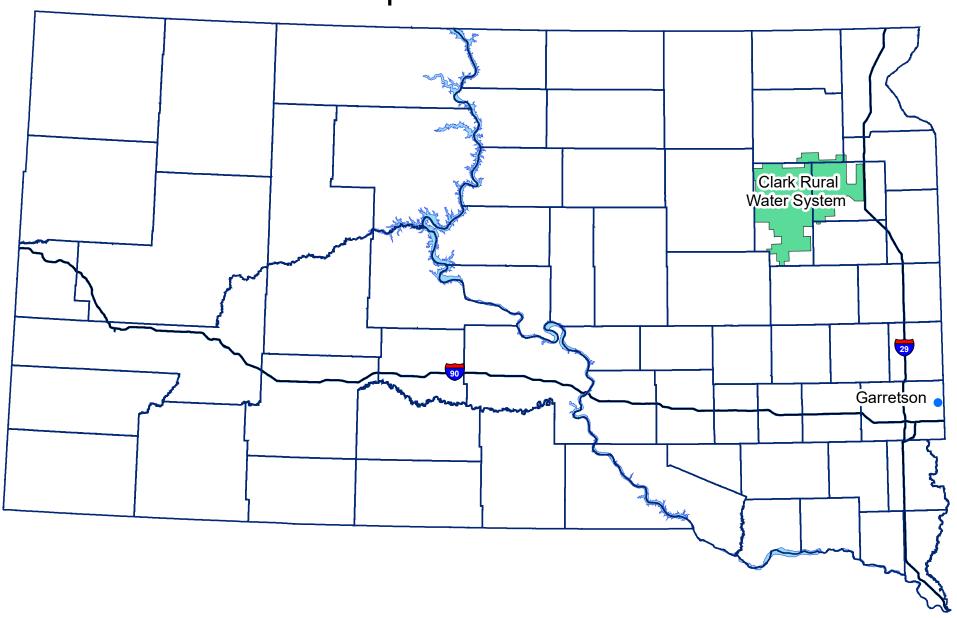

APPLICANT: Clark Rural Water System DW-03

Total Project Cost:\$ 610,000BWNR Funding Assistance Requested:\$ 610,000Rate/Term:2.75% / 30 YearsSecurity Pledged For Repayment Of Loan:System Revenue

Staff Analysis

1) If all funding is provided as loan, CRWS would have 214% coverage based on the current rate of \$64.50 for 7,000 gallons usage.

- 2) This project will only benefit Raymond and all debt associated will be repaid by those 38 customers. If funding was provided as all loan Raymond users would be charged \$77.00 for debt plus an additional \$60.00 per 5,000 gallons.
- 3) At the recommended funding level Raymond users will be assessed a charge of \$14.80 per month for debt, with \$60.00 per month for 5,000 gallons, bringing total rates to \$74.80.

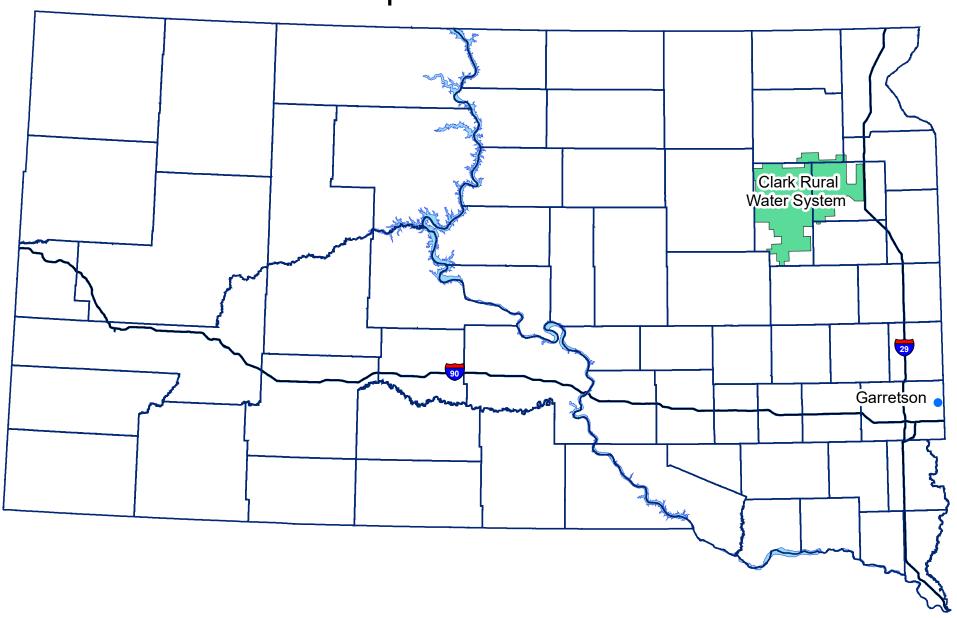
Funding Recommendation: Award a \$610,000 Drinking Water SRF loan, at 2.75% for 30 years with 79.6% as principal forgiveness not

to exceed \$485,000.

Debt Service Coverage: 214% based on current rates of \$64.50 per 7,000 gallons.

- 1) Contingent upon the Borrower adopting a resolution approving the form of the loan agreement, the promissory note, and the pledge of revenues for repayment of the loan.
- 2) Contingent upon the Borrower approving a security agreement and mortgage.
- 3) Contingent upon an Intercreditor Agreement being approved and executed by Cobank, Clark Rural Water System and the District.

Total Project Cost:\$2,394,000BWNR Funding Assistance Requested:\$2,394,000Rate/Term:3.0% / 30 yearsSecurity Pledged For Repayment Of Loan:Project Surcharge

Staff Analysis

1) Current rates in Garretson are \$64.60 per 5,000 gallons. If funding is provided as all loan, the city will have to establish a surcharge of approximately \$21.20 per month.

2) At the recommended level of loan funding, Garretson will need to establish a surcharge of approximately \$10.00 per month. Staff analysis indicates that Garretson can restructure rates to stay at current rates of \$64.60.

Funding Recommendation: Award a \$2,394,000 Drinking Water SRF loan at 3.0% for 30 years with 52.8% principal forgiveness not to

exceed \$1,264,000.

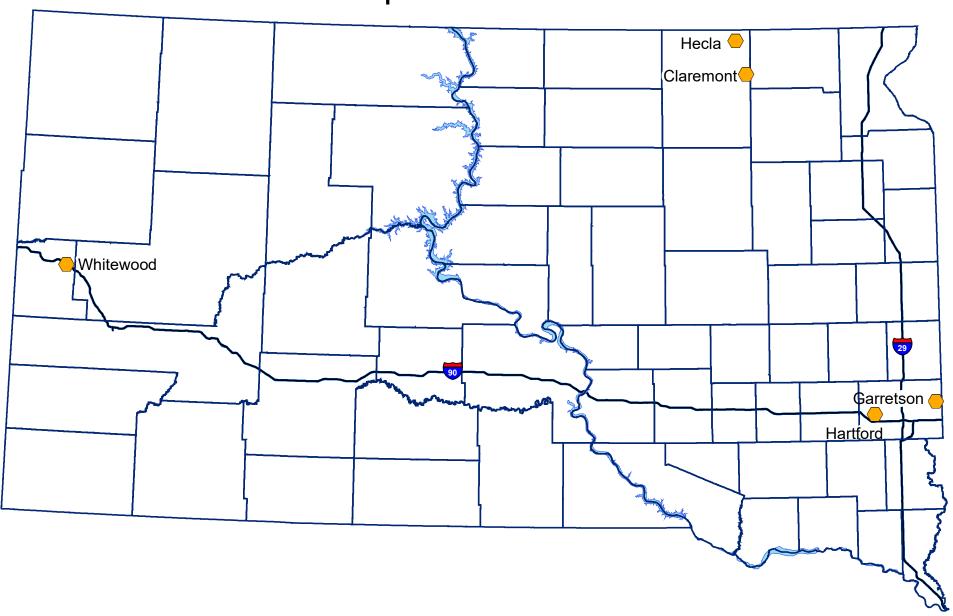

1) Current rates are \$30.00 per 5,000 gallons. If funding was provided as all loan, a surcharge of \$42.75 would be needed to meet the required debt coverage, which would bring overall rates to \$72.75/5,000 gallons.

2) At the recommended funding level a surcharge of \$30.00 will be required, which will bring overall rates to \$60.00 per 5,000 gallons.

Funding Recommendation: Award a \$4,150,000 Clean Water SRF loan at 3.25% for 30 years with principal forgiveness of 29.8% not

to exceed \$1,235,000.

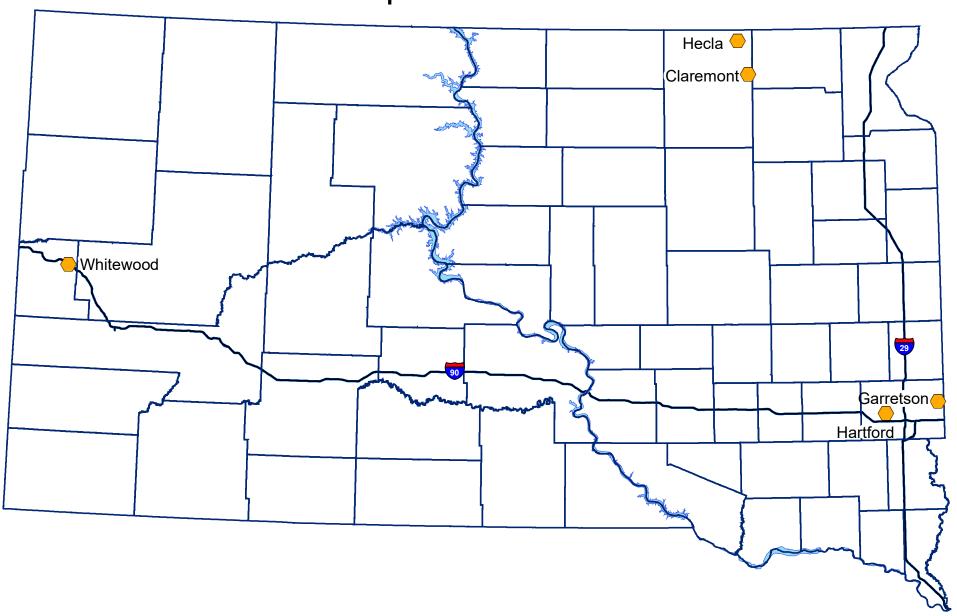

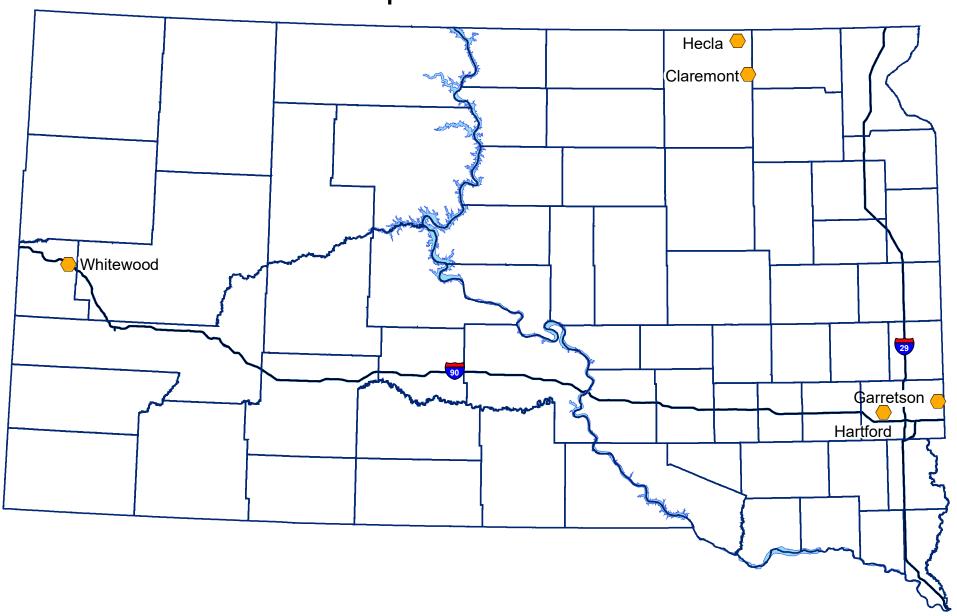
1) Current rates are at \$73.09 per 5,000 gallons. If funding is provided as all loan, the city will have to establish a surcharge of approximately \$23.40 per month. If applied to the base rate this will increase total rates to \$96.49.

Funding Recommendation: Award a \$5,750,000 Clean Water SRF loan at 3.25% for 30 years.

Debt Service Coverage: 110% coverage based on a \$23.40 surcharge

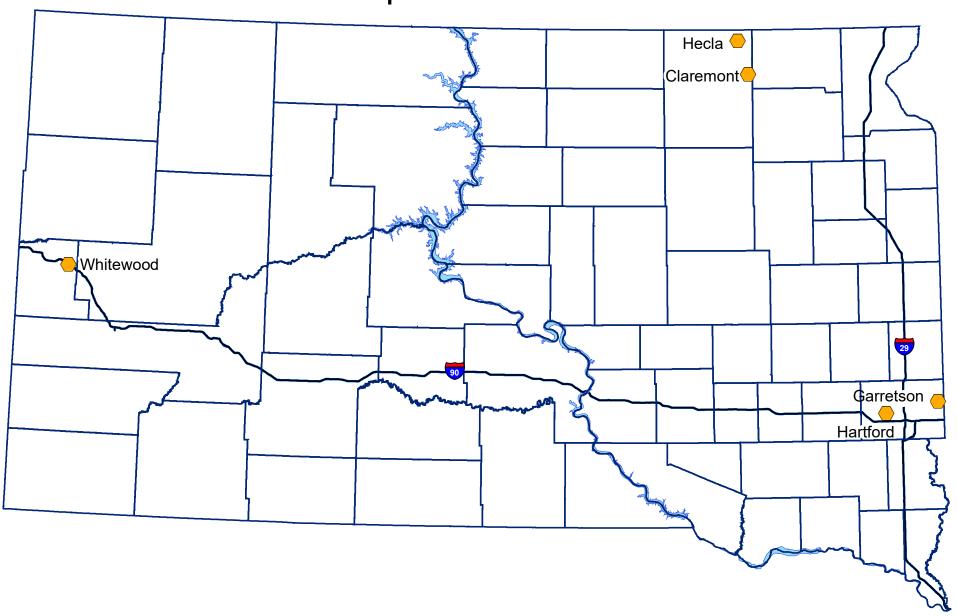

Staff Analysis

- 1) The City of Hecla proposes a Wastewater Collection System Improvements project. The city requested funding for \$4,000,000, staff's analysis indicates that if provided as all loan rates would have to increase to approximately \$150 per user.
- 2) Due to the project and limited ability for loan repayment staff has discussed with Hecla the need to reduce the scope of the project as proposed. Hecla will submit updated information for staff to present at the January 2024 meeting.

Funding Recommendation: DEFER

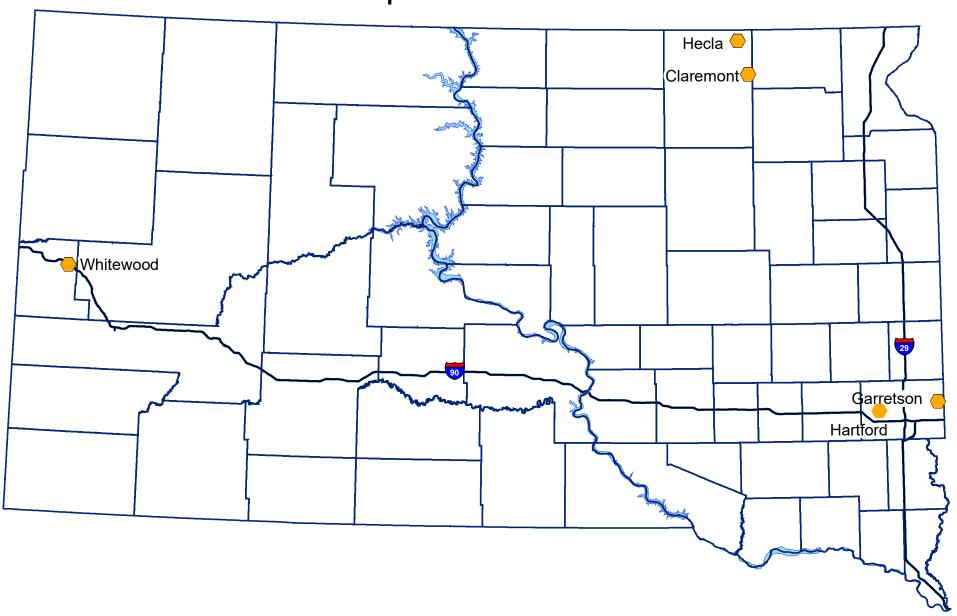
2) Staff Analysis indicates that at the recommended funding level Garretson could restructure their rate and stay at the current rate of \$64.45.

Funding Recommendation: Award a \$2,593,000 Clean Water SRF loan at 3.25% for 30 years.

2) At the recommended funding level a surcharge of \$15.65 would be required, which would bring overall rates to \$67.35. Staff analysis indicates Claremont can restructure their current rates to keep rates at \$60.00 per month.

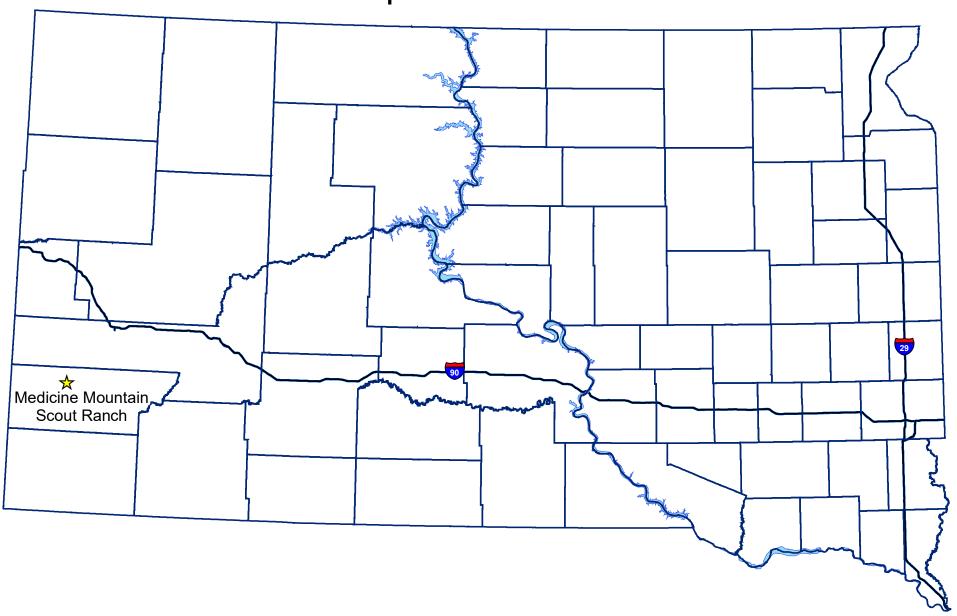

Staff Analysis

1) Medicine Mountain Scout Ranch is seeking funding for their Water Supply project. Staff's analysis indicates that the organization does not show adequate revenue currently to support a loan.

Funding Recommendation: Award a \$73,000 Consolidated loan at 3.25 percent for 30 years.

Debt Service Coverage: 100% based on required contingencies

- 1) Contingent upon the Borrower adopting a resolution approving the form of the loan agreement, the promissory note, and the pledge of revenues for repayment of the loan.
- 2) Contingent upon the Borrower approving a security agreement and mortgage.
- 3) Contingent upon providing financials that present adequate and consistent revenue.
- 4) Contingent upon being able to meet other contingencies within a 6-month timeframe. If the 6-month timeframe is not met, loan funds will be deobligated.

Staff Analysis

1) In April of 2022, Brookings-Deuel Rural Water System was awarded a \$8,310,800 funding package that included a \$5,607,560 DWSRF loan and a \$2,703,240 ARPA Grant; however, additional funding is needed to complete the project.

2) If all funding is provided as loan, B-D RWS would have 110% coverage based on the current rate of \$60.50 for 7,000 gallons usage.

Funding Recommendation: Rescind Resolution 2022-47 and award a \$7,207,560 loan at 2.125% for 30 years.

Debt Service Coverage: 110% coverage at rates of \$60.50 per 7,000 gallons.

- 1) Contingent upon the Borrower adopting a resolution approving the form of the loan agreement, the promissory note, and the pledge of revenues for repayment of the loan.
- 2) Contingent upon the Borrower approving a security agreement and mortgage.
- 3) Contingent upon an Intercreditor Agreement being approved and executed by Rural Utilities, Cobank, Brookings-Deuel Rural Water System, and the District.

Staff Analysis

1) In June 2022, Weston Heights HOA was awarded a \$580,650 Drinking Water SRF loan and an ARPA grant of \$3,290,350. However, additional funding is needed to complete the new water storage tank project and for an expanded project scope.

2) Current rates are \$75.00 per month. At the recommended funding level, staff analysis indicates Weston Heights will not need to increase their rates.

Funding Recommendation: Rescind resolution 2022-408 and award a \$1,479,938 Drinking Water SRF loan at 2.125% for 30 years

with 26.7% of principal foregiveness not to exceed \$393,938. In addition, award a \$64,362 Drinking

Water Construction Program Grant.

Debt Service Coverage: 110% coverage at rates of \$75.00 per month.

- 1) Contingent upon the Borrower adopting a resolution approving the form of the loan agreement, the promissory note, and the pledge of revenues for repayment of the loan.
- 2) Contingent upon the Borrower approving a security agreement and mortgage.

1) In April 2022, the city was awarded a \$2,345,309 funding package that included a \$1,583,133 CWSRF loan and a \$762,176 ARPA Grant. The scope of the project has changed and additional funding is needed to complete the project.

2) Current rates in Bowdle are \$60.00 per month. If funding is provided as all loan, the city will have to establish a surcharge of approximately \$30 per month bringing overall rates to \$90 per month. Rates can be restructured and remain at \$60.

Funding Recommendation: Rescind resolution 2022-37 and award a \$1,988,133 Clean Water SRF Loan at 2.125% for 30 years, with a

revised project scope. The scope of the ARPA grant 2022G-ARP-113 will also be amended for the additional scope to include a new forcemain and lift station to convey wastewater to the WWTF.

Debt Service Coverage: 110% based on a \$30 surcharge

1) Contingent upon the Borrower adopting a bond resolution and the resolution becoming effective.

2) Contingent upon the Borrower establishing a surcharge at a level sufficient to provide the required debt coverage.

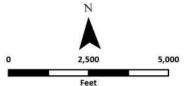
