Goosen	Leroy	PVT	by Onida	(Army) Goosen was a member of the 17th Infantry Regiment, 7th Infantry Division. He was killed in action while fighting the enemy in North Korea on October 8, 1952.	Sully	Korean
Barbee	Larry	1LT	near Redfield	(Army) Barbee was on Recon in Force near An Loc when killed trying to save a member of his platoon on June 6, 1969. He was platoon leader of his Bravo Company.	Spink	Vietnam
Larson	Fred	PFC	east causeway bridge by Pollock	(Army) Fred was assigned to the 11th Infantry Brigade. He was on combat patrol and was part of a forward observation team. Fred and some of his team were searching a suspected enemy dwelling. An enemy explosive device was accidentally detonated and Fred was killed in the blast April 24, 1970.	Campbell	Vietnam
Ommen	Peter	PFC	US14A near Central City	(Marine Corps) Peter was killed by small arms fire in QUANT TRI Vietnam on April 30, 1967.	Lawrence	Vietnam
Dexter	Ronald	PFC	SD15 Bridge - 3 3/4 S of Milbank	(Marine Corps) Died through hostile action - small arms fire September 29, 1966	Grant	Vietnam
Miller	Richard	PVT	I-90 Exit 308 overpass or US281 over Firesteel Creek	(Army) Richard died June 11, 1969 through hostile action....artillery rocket mortar in VINH Long South Vietnam.	Aurora	Vietnam
Ziegler	Thomas	SP4	SD49 near Hamill	(Army)killed in action March 22, 1971.	Tripp	Vietnam
Holcombe	Frank	PVT	SD19A Vermillion River Turner County south of Centerville	(Army) Killed in action in Cottan France August 3, 1918	Turner	WWI
Albertson	Elmer	PVT	Bull Creek	(Army) Elmer died during the final battle of World War, being killed in the Meusse Argonne November 15, 1918.	Harding	WWI

Rieck	Ervin	SSGT	US281 Bridge between 141st Street and 142nd Street (1 miles west and 1/2 north of Warner	(Army) Ervin was killed April 9, 1945. He wsa part of company C of 383rd Infantry which was attempting to take and hold Kakazu Ridge on Okinawa. After a long battle the 383rd was driven back, suffering heavy casualties. Erv was one of those casualties.	Brown	WWII
Gunderson*	Marvin	PVT	bridge on SD19 between 275th and 274th Streets or bridge on SD19 between 272nd and 271st Streets	(Army) Killed in action in Okinawa on April 3, 1945.	Turner	WWII
Muller*	Milton	MM2	near Montrose	(Navy) Officially reported missing in action having been serving aboard the USS Leary when that vessel was torpedoed and sink in the Atlantic December 25, 1943.	McCook	WWII
Erpenbach*	Alvin	SGT	James River Bridge on SD42 - 8 1/2 miles east of Ethan	(Army) Alvin was defending a bridge in Italy as villagers were fleeing from Nazi solders. Alvin was killed Sept 7, 1944, when he stepped on a land mine.	Davison	WWII
Henle*	Harvey	CPL	SD42 W 12th Street over the Sioux River	(Army)Killed in action June 16, 1944	Miner	WWII
Rich*	Porter	PO2	between Lake Preston and DeSmet - US14 - between 435th and 436th Avenues	(Navy) Was on the US Battleship Oklahoma in Pearl Harbor at the time of the infamous attack on Dec 7, 1941.	Kingsbury	WWII
Nielson*	Leland	PFC	near Volin	(Army) While on a mission, Leland was hit by a Japanese Sniper on June 29, 1945 and died from those wounds the following day.	Yankton	WWII
