Chairman Eric Odenbach called the meeting of the South Dakota Aeronautics Commission (the "Commission") to order at 1:04 p.m. Roll call was taken and a quorum was determined.

Odenbach opened the floor to Commission members to disclose potential conflicts of interest and to present requests for waivers pursuant to South Dakota Codified Law (SDCL) chapter 3-23.

No conflicts of interest were disclosed and no waivers were requested.

Odenbach asked for a motion to approve the minutes of January 29, 2018.

A correction was made to the organization a meeting attendee, Kyle Lewis, was affiliated with. Kyle Lewis, Air Line Pilots Association (ALPA) was corrected to read Kyle Lewis, Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association (AOPA).

A MOTION WAS MADE by Funk and seconded by Luers to approve the amended January 29, 2018, meeting minutes. All present voted aye by roll call vote. The motion carried.

Odenbach asked for a motion to approve the minutes of March 27, 2018.

A MOTION WAS MADE by Luers and seconded by Funk to approve the March 27, 2018, meeting minutes. All present voted aye by roll call vote. The motion carried.

Odenbach presented for discussion the possibility of establishing a tuition reimbursement program modeled after other organizations such as the South Dakota Bar Association in order to foster aviation and aviation education in the state. His suggestion was in order to qualify for the tuition reimbursement program, the student must attend school in South Dakota, and upon graduation, the recipient must reside and work in South Dakota, and be employed in an aviation field. Commission members agreed that further research would be needed, including contacting Legislators, in order to pursue a tuition reimbursement program.

Deputy Secretary Joel Jundt of the Department of Transportation (the "Department") presented the Secretary's report which included a handout, which was emailed to Commission members and distributed to members of the public. The handout included a list of possible organizations and members suggested for the ad hoc committee for Title 50 review.

Travis Lantis joined the meeting at1:25 p.m.

The Department will review the list and recommend a five-person committee for review and approval by the Commission at the next meeting.

Jon Becker of the Office of Air, Rail, and Transit presented the consideration of the Eureka 2018 Grant Application. Becker said that this is the first application of the year. The Office of Aeronautics is requesting funding from the State Aeronautics Fund for:

A MOTION WAS MADE by Lantis and seconded by Funk to approve the state assistance for the Eureka new tilt-down pole in the amount of \$3,600.00. All present voted aye by roll call vote, except for Odenbach who abstained from the Commission discussion and vote. The motion carried.

Jennifer Boehm of the Office of Air, Rail, and Transit presented an informational item of the results of the 2018 International Art Contest winners. The Department received 149 pieces of artwork from two (2) private schools, six (6) public schools, and two (2) homeschools. The winners received an award certificate, a laminated copy of their submission, and a prize paid for by the
