## Family Support 360 (FS360) Assistive Technology Overview

## What is Assistive Technology?

**Technology that helps you in daily life.** This includes devices, software, and systems that help you do everyday tasks. Examples include things that help you:

• Talk, like speech-generating devices and voice amplifiers.



- **Communicate**, like a voice-to-text software on an iPad.
- Be independent, like smart home devices (Alexa / Google Home).
- Move, like wheelchair vehicle lifts.



### **How can I get Assistive Technology through FS360?**



- 1. Be authorized through one of these FS360 services:
  - Specialized Medical Adaptive Equipment and Supplies (SMAES)
  - Environmental Accessibility Adaptative Equipment
  - Vehicle Modifications
  - Recreation, Leisure, and Social Opportunities
  - Other Expenses
- 2. Work with your Family Support Coordinator to add Assistive Technology to your service plan and purchase it, if approved.



## **What Assistive Technology Can I Get?**

The chart below shows how you can use FS360 services to buy Assistive Technology. This summary only includes a few examples of available Assistive Technology. Reach out to your Family Support Coordinator, talk to DDD, or read the FS360 Billing Manual for more examples.

Dakota Link  Dakota Link  The Telecommunications Equipment Distribution (TED) Program	Helps people with disabilities access assistive technology. Dakota Link provides:  • Adaptive equipment and software  • Training services  • Evaluation services  The TED program gives free special equipment to people who are deaf, deaf-blind, have severe hearing loss, or have difficulty speaking.
The Telecommunications Adaptive Devices (TAD) Program	The TAD program gives devices to help people with disabilities communicate through phone systems. These devices can include:  • Fully voice-activated phones  • Main street emergency messenger phones  • Picture dialing phones  • Large button phones  • Other equipment
