Chairman Roby called the meeting of the South Dakota Transportation Commission (the "Commission") to order at 9:00 a.m. CT. A roll call was taken and a quorum was present.

Roby opened the floor to the Commission members to disclose potential conflicts of interest and to present requests for waiver pursuant to South Dakota Codified Law (SDCL) chapters 3-23.

No members of the Commission disclosed a conflict or requested a waiver.

Roby asked for a motion to approve the August 12, 2025 Commission meeting minutes.

A MOTION WAS MADE by Jensen and seconded by Simons to approve the August 12, 2025 Commission meeting minutes. All present voted aye by roll call vote. The motion carried.

Secretary Joel Jundt addressed to the Commission asking that they acknowledge their review of the 2025 Open Meeting brochures prepared by the Attorney General's Office and presented in Attachment #2 of the packet.

All present acknowledged by roll call vote that they had reviewed the open meeting materials provided.

Roby opened the floor to public input.

No members of the public addressed the Commission or offered any input.

Secretary Jundt presented the following items to the Commission in his Secretary's Report:

- Federal: Both the House and Senate Appropriations Committee passed their respective Transportation, Housing and Urban Development (THUD) bills out of committee, but there are still several other appropriations bills that need to be passed in both bodies to finalize the overall appropriations package. Congress is in recess until September 2, and it is very unlikely they will be able to pass the remaining bills and/or work out the differences between the versions by the September 30 deadline, since there are significant differences in spending levels and priorities. Therefore, a Continuing Resolution (CR) is highly likely into the December 2025 timeframe. With the Senate's THUD bill, Congressional Directed Spending (CDS) projects were also initially approved. For South Dakota, Senator Rounds and Senator Thune submitted in one highway project, \$30 million for Platte Winner bridge. It is hopeful Congress will pass the overall appropriation package such that the CDS projects can receive approved funding.
- Budget: The Department of Transportation (the "Department") continues to formulate our budget request which will be considered by Governor Rhoden. Overall, state highway revenues were down from FY2024 by about 1% (\$4.2 million) so we are considering this reduction in revenue and its impact moving forward. This will be part of our budget request for the Governor's consideration for his budget recommendation to the legislators.
- Harrisburg School District: The Department received a request to consider a speed limit reduction on SD115 / Minnesota Street south of Sioux Falls, between Willow Street and Lincoln County Highway 106/271st Street. The request came from the Harrisburg School District. We initiated a speed study and will be providing the Commission a request to schedule a public hearing date during next month's Commission meeting.
- **Tentative September Agenda:** Jundt asked Director of Operations, Craig Smith, to share the draft agenda with the Commission for the *On the Road* meeting on September 23 -24 that will take place in Pierre.

In regard to the Departments budget, the Commission asked for a finance update and projection of the State Highway Funds for the meeting on September 23, 2025.

Secretary Jundt and Joanne Hight, Program Manager for the Office of Administration for the Division of Planning & Engineering, presented to the Commission a request from Hutchinson County for an advance on their Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBGP) funds.

Jundt shared that the current guidelines set for STBGP advances set by the Commission on August 29, 2024 state that the loan has an interest rate of 2.7% and should be repaid in full within three years after the loan was issued as well as that the amount borrowed cannot exceed three times the applicant's estimated annual STBGP allocation. He also encouraged the Commission to eliminate the administration fee noted in the guidelines on this loan.

Hight shared the detail of the application received by Hutchinson County.

A MOTION WAS MADE by Rosenboom and seconded by Frick to approve the STBGP advance request for Hutchinson County in the amount of \$900,000.00 for improvements to County Road 38. The loan will have an interest rate of 2.7% compounded annually, will not include the 0.25% for administrative overhead, and will be repaid within 3 years. All present voted aye by roll call vote. The motion carried.

The Commission asked that the guidelines be reviewed and consideration taken for possible amendments at the September 23, 2025 meeting.

Jundt presented two more items as part of his Secretary's Report:

- Customer Satisfaction Survey: Jundt briefed the Commission that the Department contracts with an independent third-party to perform this survey. Results provide the Department with an overall assessment of what our citizens think of the Department's performance in many areas as well as giving us a better understanding of what priorities they think are important. The preliminary results are very positive and we will share more detail with the Commission in September.
- Performance Excellence Network (PEN): The Department has been engaged with this
 organization for many years as part of the Baldridge Excellence Framework created by former
 President Reagan. The Department's goal is to continue to improve in six different categories,
 with the overall goal to strive towards excellence in the services we provide to our customers.
 Jundt informed the Commission that we have submitted our application to PEN which is the
 starting point for them to send a group of examiners to review the Department against the six
 categories.

Chairman Roby gave kudos to the Department for their top national ranking recently noted in the US News & World Report (#2 in Road Quality) and Newsweek (#3 in 95.1% miles classified as acceptable.)

Craig Smith, Division Director of Operation, presented the following informational Construction Change Orders (CCO) to the Commission.

CCOs completed in July contain an increase of \$2,823,135.40. Over the past 12 months, the overall contract increase is 1.72%.

The following projects have a CCO amounting to a contract change more than \$50,000.

Type of Work: crack leveling

<u>Explanation of Change on CCO No. 3:</u> This decrease is the result of SDDOT adjusting the contract quantities to match the as-built quantities normal for a crack leveling job. The crack depth was less than estimated, reducing the quantities for repairing and traffic control.

<u>Explanation of Change on CCO No. 4:</u> This increase is the result of SDDOT compensating the contractor for extra work to remove quartzite rock encountered when installing pipe and inlets on the west side of Cliff Ave.

<u>Explanation of Change on CCO No. 2:</u> This increase is the result of SDDOT compensating the contractor for extra work for a full depth reclamation to reclaim unstable roadway shoulder. Once the cold milling on the project was complete, the underlying roadway shoulders were too unstable to complete the shoulder resurfacing in the original plans.

<u>Explanation of Change on CCO No. 3:</u> This increase is the result of SDDOT adjusting the contract quantities for the high-tension cable guardrail anchor assembly. Prior to construction of the project, the contractor tested the soil conditions. The testing determined the footings on the anchor assembly were not adequate and required adjusting.

<u>Explanation of Change on CCO No. 1:</u> This increase is the result of SDDOT compensating the contractor for extra work and materials to repair pavement at additional locations along the project. The original survey was completed 2 years ago and additional areas have deteriorated since.

<u>Explanation of Change on CCO No. 4:</u> This increase is the result of SDDOT compensating the contractor for extra work to haul waste material to an approved location. The new 4 lane divided highway compared to the existing 2 lane road created a large excess of topsoil that was too much to be placed on the project.

<u>Explanation of Change on CCO No. 10:</u> This increase is the result of SDDOT compensating the contractor for extra work and the material to extend cross pipes and shape the ditches. The mainline culverts throughout the project did not meet the minimum clear zone requirements per DOT design standards so they were extended and the ditches needed to be reshaped to match the extensions.

<u>Explanation of Change on CCO No. 18:</u> This increase is the result of SDDOT paying the contractor an incentive earned for minimizing the closure of the intersection of Veteran's Parkway and Minnesota Avenue. The incentive payment was made in accordance with the contract.

<u>Explanation of Change on CCO No. 8:</u> This increase is the result of SDDOT compensating the contractor for extra work and material to remove the top 3" of base course from the completed sections of Phase 1 and replace it due to the original quartzite base course causing breakup on the driving surface. Once the completed section was open to live traffic, the breakup began, and it was determined the quartzite base course needed to be removed and replaced.

The additional 19,420 tons of base course will be provided by the contractor.

Once the PCCP grinding was complete on a segment of the project, the surface began delaminating and flaking off causing a rough surface. The surface was ground smooth, and the shoulders were surfaced with granular material instead of the asphalt concrete originally planned.

Smith shared, and agreed by the Commission that moving forward the dollar limit will change to \$100,000 for CCOs and the Department will add a percentage change for to each CCO as previously requested by the Commission.

Ryan Johnson, Office of Operations Support, presented to the Commission the modifications to Division I of the South Dakota Standard Specifications for Road and Bridges dated October 1, 2025 and asked for approval for the modifications made by the Department to the previous publication from 2015. Johnson provided explanation of the signification modifications.

Toby Crow of South Dakota Chapter of Association of General Contractors (AGC) shared that the contractors have been part of the conversation and they will continue to work with the Department on issues that arise.

A MOTION WAS MADE by Nelson and seconded by Vallery to approve the revision made to Division I of the South Dakota Standard Specifications for Road and Bridges and that they go into effect as of October 1, 2025. All present voted aye by roll call vote. The motion carried.
