Chairman Bruce Cull called the meeting of the South Dakota Transportation Commission (Commission) to order at 9:00 a.m. Central Time. A roll call was taken and a quorum was determined.

Cull opened the floor to the Commission members to disclose potential conflicts of interest and to present requests for waiver pursuant to South Dakota Codified Law (SDCL) chapters 3 – 23.

Karla Engle, Office of Legal Counsel, presented a request for waiver and annual disclosure received by Commissioner Larry Nelson concerning a potential conflict of interest. A copy of the disclosure and request for waiver is attached to and incorporated into these minutes as **ATTACHMENT A.** Engle explained that Commissioner Nelson's law firm seeks to represent new clients who are landowners affected by a Highway 18 project located near Canton, South Dakota. Commissioner Nelson is not participating in his firm's representation of the landowners. Commissioner Nelson will not receive or review any Commission packet materials relating to these landowners and will recuse himself from any discussion and vote relating to these landowners that might come before the Commission.

A MOTION WAS MADE by Vehle and seconded by Rosenboom that the matters disclosed in the waiver request are fair, reasonable, and not contrary to public interest. All present voted aye by roll call vote except Nelson who abstained. The motion carried.

Cull asked for any additional conflicts of interest or requests for waiver. No other conflicts of interest were disclosed, and no other waivers were requested.

Secretary Joel Jundt presented to the Commission the Secretary's Report. It included the following items:

- Introduced Ryan Brunner as the new Senior Advisor from the Governor's Office that will be working with the Department of Transportation (the "Department").
- Christina Bennett, Program Manager for the Office of Operations Support, presented for Board consideration, the Fallen Hero Bridge Dedications recommended by a committee that includes members from the Department of Military, Department of Veteran Affairs, and the Department. She shared the committee received 50 applications and, for the second year in a row, have recommended 12 name dedications. The following names and bridges are:

• Consideration of funding for the Department of Game, Fish & Parks (GFP). Jundt introduced GFP Secretary Kevin Robling who shared with the Commission the GFP's annual report of projects completed with the funds from FY22 and the anticipated use of funds for FY23.

A MOTION WAS MADE by Vehle and seconded by Zander to approve funding to GFP in the amount of \$2,800,000 for fiscal year 2023. All present voted aye by roll call vote. The motion carried.

Craig Smith, Director of Operations, presented the following Construction Change Orders (CCOs) for the Commission's information.


