Last Name	First Name	Rank	Bridge Location	Details
Rusch	Elmer A.	Capt	Brookings - US HWY 14 Bypass over the east branch of Six Mile Creek, just west of Medary Avenue	(Air Corps) D-Day Invasion June 7, 1944 - Glider pilot who landed in enemy territory and was killed.
Lyman	Herbert F.	1LT	Thunder Hawk HWY 73 - near Thunder Hawk (one bridge honoring two Veterans)	(Army Air Forces) P-51 Mustang Pilot shot down over France on June 17, 1944. Buried in France. (Brothers)
Lyman	James M.	T/Sgt	Thunder Hawk HWY 73 - near Thunder Hawk (one bridge honoring two Veterans)	(Army) Killed March 16, 1945 in Italy while leading charge on Machine Gun positions. Buried in Italy. (Brothers)
Ruby	Bruce E.	Pvt	Mobridge - HWY 12 over the Missouri River	(Army) Killed in combat November 9, 1944 in France. Buried in France.
Bertram	Richard R.	Pvt	Wewela - HWY 183 (Keya Paha River Bridge)	(Army) Died April 10, 1945, as a result of combat injuries suffered in fighting on Okinawa. Died upon ship and buried at sea.
Westerman	Delmar W.	PFC	Chancellor - SD HWY 44 over the Vermillion River nwest of Chancellor	(Marine)Died February 22, 1945 from injuries sustained while fighting on Iwo Jima, on February 21, 1945.
Christensen	William L.	Sgt	Parkston - Pony Creak Bridge about a half mile west of the intersection with SD HWY 37	(Air Force) Died April 8, 1944 while serving as a Bombardier on board a B-25 Bomber. Shot down by Japanese planes.

Last Name	First Name	Rank	Bridge Location	Details
Rand	Robert C.	PFC	Monroe - HWY 42 north of Monroe -over the East Fork Vermillion River	(Army) Killed in action near Heartbreak Ridge, Korea October 3, 1951.
Vietnam War Veterans				
Last Name	First Name	Rank	Bridge Location	Details
Lane	Charles	Capt.	Yankton - HWY 81 over the James River	(Air Force) F-4D Phantom pilot in Vietnam. One of only seven remaining SD MIAs from Vietnam. Fate Determined Status declared in 2006.
Horner	Mark R.	SPC	Watertown - SD HWY 20 over the Lake Kampeska Outlet on the NE side of the lake	(Army) Killed on February 15, 1970, while on foot patrol in Vietnam. He was attending to wounded when shot.
Jamerson	Kenneth R.	LCpl	Little Eagle - Grand River Bridge	(Marine) Died on April 5, 1967 from injuries sustained when he stepped on a landmine on March 21, 1967, while on patrol in Vietnam.

Last Name	First Name	Rank	Bridge Location	Details
Wagner	Gregory A.	SSG	Alexandria - HWY 38 over the James River (east of Mitchell)	(SD Army NG) Killed May 8, 2006 in Baghdad, Iraq, when an IED detonated near his HUMVEE.
Vrooman	Jeremy D.	SSG	Sioux Falls - SD HWY 11 from Sioux Falls to Brandon over Sioux River	(Army) Killed on July 15, 2008 from injuries sustained by explosion, while clearing buildings. Saved teammates lives in the action.
