**SUBJECT:** Statewide Coordinated Public Transit Human Services Transportation Plan

In January 2024, the Office of Air, Rail, and Transit hired KFH Group, Inc to complete a Statewide Coordinated Public Transit Human Services Plan. This coordination plan identifies the transportation needs of individuals with disabilities, seniors, and people with low incomes, and prioritizes transportation services for funding and implementation.

Previously, coordinated plans were created by local public transit providers through local public participation, but through working with the transit directors, SDDOT learned that a planned developed through the state would be administratively easier for the transit agencies, while also improving the coordinated plan.

This plan is a federal requirement for the distribution of federal transit funding and was developed through 12 public meetings, with a minimum of one in each SDDOT area. From these public meetings, a list of potential projects was created and prioritized by participants of the meetings.

The KFH Group is presenting this Statewide Coordinated Public Transit Human Services Plan to the Transportation Commission as an informational item.

#### **Coordinated Transportation in South Dakota**

- High level of coordination at the local and regional levels
  - Public transit & local human service agencies work closely together to provide essential transportation for older adults and people with disabilities
  - Public transit & national carriers coordinate services and schedules to provide long distance and out of state trips


## **Section 5310 Transportation Program**

- SDDOT administers the Federal Transit Administration's (FTA)
   Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities (Section 5310) Program
- Capital and operating funding to support the provision of transportation services to meet the specific needs of older adults and people with disabilities
  - Capital projects to meet needs when public transportation is insufficient, unavailable, or inappropriate
  - Public transportation services that go beyond the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
    minimum requirements or decrease reliance on ADA paratransit services



## **Coordinated Transportation Plan**

- Required for <u>Section 5310 Program</u> Funding
- First Statewide Coordinated Plan
- Required Plan Elements:
  - 1. Assessment of Transportation Providers
  - 2. Assessment of Transportation Needs
  - 3. Identification of Strategies/Activities/Projects to address the Unmet Needs
  - 4. Prioritization for Implementation

## **Identified Strategies**

#### Use Federal & State Funds More Effectively

- Maintain services that are effectively meeting identified transportation needs
- Identify opportunities for additional funding
- Re-assess the administration of human service transportation funding programs
- Use statewide coordinated plan for ongoing dialogue

#### Improve Communication & Coordination

- Improve coordination through mobility management efforts
- Re-assess opportunities for state agencies to meet and to discuss coordination efforts
- Expand community engagement and information on services
- Provide greater guidance, support, and technical assistance to local providers

#### Improve & Expand Mobility Options

- Support efforts to expand local and regional public transit services
- Continue to support capital needs to ensure vehicles are safe and appropriate for the service
- Assess opportunities to improve driver recruitment and retention



## **Proposed Phased Statewide Strategy**

- Short-Term (Years 1-2):
  - Formalize state-level coordination structure
  - Develop statewide marketing program
  - Monitor federal coordination activities and support programs (continuous)
- Mid-Term (Years 3-4):
  - Implement local Mobility Management Pilot Program
  - Plan and implement state-funded programs
- Long-Term (Year 5 and beyond):
  - Update statewide coordinated transportation plan



## Recommendations to Enhance Coordination & Expand Services

#### Capital & Operational Investments

- Support needs identified through local or regional plans
- Enhance statewide transit marketing
- Seek discretionary grants
- Cost estimates for expansion strategies surpass current federal program funding

#### **Business & Financing Models**

- Use Section 5310 funding for Mobility Management
- Fund vehicles through other FTA funding sources
- Create a state funding program for older adults and people with disabilities
- Create employment transportation funding program

#### **Public Agency Policies, Strategies, & Practices**

- Maintain current transportation services & vehicle fleets
- Improve outreach, marketing, & education
- Identify new funding opportunities
- Expand transportation services to meet needs
