

The blue represents the thunderclouds above the world where live the thunder birds who control the four winds. The rainbow is for the Cheyenne River Sioux people who are keepers of the Most Sacred Calf Pipe, a gift from the White Buffalo Calf Maiden. The eagle feathers at the edges of the rim of the world represent the spotted eagle who is the protector of all Lakota. The two pipes fused together are for unity. - WHEREAS, Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe cares about the safety of the traveling public and pedestrians on our roadways; and
- WHEREAS, in order to increase safety for motorists and pedestrians the Tribe wishes to provide comment on the South Dakota Department of Transportation's Statewide Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP) development for 2019 and beyond: and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe will send delegates to the annual Tribal SDDOT STIP meeting to address its concerns; now
- THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribal council does hereby recommend to add these projects to the SDDOT Statewide Transportation Improvement Plan: complete a shoulder widening project on SD Hwy 63 from just North of the Moreau River to SD Hwy 20, add more street lights to the West and East ends of Eagle Butte along US Hwy 212 to the edge of town, create a center turning lane on US Hwy 212 n Eagle Butte from the Coop Elevator to No Heart Housing; and
- BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that nothing in this Resolution diminishes, divests, alters, or otherwise affects any inherent, treaty, statutory, or other rights of the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe over the property or activities described herein. The Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe expressly retains all rights and authority over the property and activities described herein, including but not limited to legislative, regulatory, adjudicatory, and taxing powers.

**Dear Secretary Bergquist:** 

The South Dakota Chapter of the American Concrete Pavement Association would like to thank the South Dakota Department of Transportation for their effort in compiling the 2019-2022 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program followed by hosting the four regional public meetings along with the webinar meeting. The information presented at the public meetings is valuable and always explained effectively. The public testimony is valuable whether it is from the general public, legislators, or industry partners. For this reason our association would like to provide comment to the current tentative STIP.

If you recall, the SDACPA provided comment last year with concerns over the 2021 STIP and lack of mainline concrete paving projects. With some adjustment to the program we see additional projects have been included in the 2021 fiscal year with the most significant addition being the Hot Springs urban reconstruction project. Previously there were zero mainline concrete pavement projects in the Rapid City Region in 2021. This project is a significant undertaking and after listening to public testimony at the Rapid City meeting, the project is obviously a very important to the city and its businesses. Our members look forward to this project in the Rapid City Region and the improvements it will bring to the City of Hot Springs and the SDDOT roadway network.

The SDACPA is concerned, though, that with a combined 13 mainline concrete pavement projects in the fiscal years 2021 and 2022 it will not provide enough projects to the concrete pavement industry. It appears this is due to a large number of secondary roads coming due for preservation/resurfacing. For comparison, the Pierre Region alone has 12 asphalt surfacing projects in 2021. We appreciate the volume on the concrete projects in these years, but the number of projects alone is concerning. We hope not only the SDDOT, but the state as a whole, understands the importance of a balanced program between the two surfacing industries. In State Legislature this past session there was discussion about workforce development and the concrete industry in the state is, and has been, a constant for many years. Our contractors work hard to train their employees to be able to deliver a quality product. It would be unfortunate for these skilled workers to have to leave the industry if their employers are unable to secure enough work for an extended period. Also in the state is the cement plant in Rapid City which is currently in the process of an expansion in excess of \$100 million to provide product to the state more effectively and efficiently. The concrete pavement in the state is one of the largest industries to which the plant provides its cement.

In the SDDOT's presentation to the public at the five STIP meetings, efficiently utilizing the \$480 million spent on a yearly basis was discussed. One of the cost effective solutions the SDDOT has implemented in recent years, and mentioned in the presentation, has been construction of 5"-6" concrete overlays. Yet there are none of these "whitetoppings" proposed in the 2019-2022 STIP. The whitetopping approach has been very effective in other states in the country to provide good balance to the program during years in which states are in preservation mode on their roadway system. A large portion of the SDDOT roadway network is undoubtedly in a condition triggering preservation. We would certainly like to continue the discussion with the Department on innovation and continued implementation of the thinner concrete overlays as a long term preservation to the SDDOT roadways to extend your dollars and provide a longer term solution.

We are appreciative of our partnership with the SDDOT as an industry and value your consideration of our public comment.

Thank you for this opportunity to provide comments pertaining to the 2019-2022 Statewide Transportation Improvement Plan on behalf of the City of Belle Fourche.

1. The City of Belle Fourche again requests a traffic signal at the intersection of US Highway 85 and Highway 34. Thank you for putting it in your 2021 schedule please consider moving this ahead to 2020.

The 60,000 square foot Runnings store is now open. The City of Belle Fourche in November 2015 passed a TIF District for infrastructure improvements of this area which includes the City's share of funding for Water and Sewer improvements and Traffic lights on this intersection. Water and Sewer improvement have been completed. TIF funding will be available and shall be expended within five years.

2. The City of Belle Fourche requests and recommends that a project for installation of a traffic signal at the intersection of US Highway 85 and Jackson Street.

Jackson Street serves as an important connection between the state's US Highway 85 and the City's network of local streets. It is noteworthy as well that Belle Fourche's Police Department is located on Jackson Street just 2 blocks east of US Highway 85. Jackson Street also serves as a direct route for users of Herrmann Park including participants and guests of the community and regional events hosted there. Jackson Street is very difficult to enter onto the highway when a left-hand turn is required. During the 2010 Highway reconstruction this intersection was made a temporary all way stop this really helped with traffic flow at this intersection.

On US Highway 85 there is a small center island on the highway with a pedestrian actuated flashing yellow light. Unfortunately, this has not provided for safe pedestrian passage across the highway as intended. It seems that not all drivers of automobiles and large trucks yield to pedestrians crossing the highway even when the yellow flashing

lights have been actuated to alert them that a pedestrian is crossing the highway. There continues to be vehicle-pedestrian 'near miss' incidents. Vehicles in all lanes driving in either direction fail to yield to pedestrians desiring to cross the highway. While you study this intersection for a traffic signal or all way stop we would like to see the yellow flashing lights be changed to red flashing lights on the pedestrian crossing as soon as possible, we feel this would be safer.

- 3. The City of Belle Fourche requests a left-hand turn arrow be installed on the existing traffic signal light for the south bound lane at Summit Street. Summit Street is one of Belle Fourche major east west corridors it serves an elementary school and middle school It has become increasingly difficult for left turns going east on Summit Street, the turn lane is already there.
- 4. The City of Belle Fourche would like to take this opportunity to voice our support of the continuing development of the north/south corridor of the Theodore Roosevelt Expressway. The four lanes of Highway 85 north of I-90 to Belle Fourche have provided a good starting point on the Theodore Roosevelt Expressway.

We respectfully request your Department's consideration of the above mentioned comments for incorporation into the 2019-2022 Statewide Transportation Improvement Plan.

I was the project manager of a team who, at the request of a former mayor, created and documented a plan to improve and enhance to downtown river area through Hot Springs with and eye towards beautification and improving business opportunities. I am now a businessman (1/3 owner of the movie theater) and thus have a vested interest in the project and both its interim and long term impact on all our local businesses. Among the recommendations of the project team was the revised parking approach (diagonal in front of businesses) and the addition of cantilevered walkways to accommodate the foot traffic which would be needed due to reduced sidewalk space in front of the businesses. We also suggested pergolas over the cantilevered sidewalk for beautification. Perhaps the state could install the walkways and the city would provide the pergolas. Dear SD Dept. of Transportation,

My name is Margaret Thaxton and I have lived in Hot Springs since Jan. 2009. I live in the downtown area and enjoy the pedestrian lifestyle the area affords. With 3 small children I am very happy with the width of the sidewalks in the business district. There is plenty of room for all traffic including myself, our large stroller, my daughter's scooter and the other walkers/shoppers. It is nice to feel safe walking with my kids and sometimes parking our 'vehicles' while we peruse smaller historic shops.

We have seen numerous vehicle accidents while walking that could have been worse if there had been a cantilevered sidewalk or a smaller pedestrian sidewalk on the shops side of the street. These include: a pickup drive through the railing and into the river by the American Legion, an SUV drive straight into a building/lightpost instead of making the turn by the police station, and a minivan jump the curb and burst into flames on the sidewalk by Splash of Color photography (W of Post office). The current design of our sidewalks protected pedestrians in each of these cases, and these examples are only the ones I have personally seen while out walking.

My name is Steve Kapsch. I am from Freeman and a concerned citizen.I feel there is a safety issue along an area of Highway 81 that needs to be looked at. This is an area of Highway 81 that passes through Freeman on the east side of town. It is nice to see the lighting project that is being worked on right now. That is one step in right direction to make this area safer. There is 25 businesses located on both sides of the highway and a number of residences in this mile and a half to two mile stretch. There is currently 4 points of access to town and another one that is planned to be added with future development. The future development is a combination of commercial and residential located right along the highway on the west side. Land has already been purchased for an industrial park on the east side of the highway. With all this activity there is unfortunately only 2 areas that have center turning lanes. I'm not sure if this written testimony should be what we thought about the informational meeting or what we think about the roundabout so I will address both. As for the meeting, I have to say I've never been to an informational meeting that had so little information. When we inquired about the roundabout you had no idea how big it was, how much area it would cover, what shape it would be, what the speed limit leading up to it would be, how long the medians would be or where the approaches would be to our business. For a "tentative" statewide transportation improvement program that will be "set in stone" in August you had no information for the public whatsoever. I was very disappointed this meeting had no information for anyone that was seated in the audience.

As for the roundabout, anyone living or commuting in this area will tell you how unnecessary it will be. With a push of a computer button I am sure that you can have the information of the traffic accidents on this corner, before and after the four way stop. You can obviously see the drop in accidents since installing the four way stop. We have also been told that this will not be a standard size roundabout but it will be scaled down to accommodate the corner. This is a rural area and probably will be for years to come. Trucks, tractors, sprayers and combines frequent this area. We have a ethanol plant 10 miles south of us and a elevator 5 miles north. The landfill is 3 miles from here and Custom Touch moves homes through this corner. We were told not too long ago that the traffic count on this corner DID NOT warrant a four way stop and now the state feels we need a round about? In our opinion this is unnecessary and a poor use of state and federal monies.

Pertaining to our corner, the plans made available to us will not accommodate any traffic coming from the east or the south to enter our business. We feel the state has not properly researched the number of cars that will be forced to enter the roundabout to access our business due to the medians restricting access from the east and south. Levi,

I am writing a comment as a citizen about a project that has been in past STIP/TIP programs. It is the South Dakota Rest Area Improvements on the Minnesota state line. I don't see the project in the STIP/TIP this next program however, do have comments regarding the project.

My parents live on the north side of I-90 and are pretty much adjacent to the rest area, separated only by a field. They do live in Minnesota. In past years, my parents sub-contracted with the main cleaning contractor and used to clean the SD rest area. They are familiar with the site and its operations.

The concern we have is we have noticed drainage patterns have changed in the last few years. Originally the overflow pipe from the lagoons went north to a neighbor's field, which of course created wet conditions for the farmer. It seemed to be like this for many years. However, more recently the drainage appears to have been rerouted south over to the interstate right of way which is draining onto Minnesota interstate right of way and then eventually to a culvert which crosses 190 by my parents driveway. The drainage sits in the ditch and erodes the ditch. We also have drainage coming to the culvert from my Dad's field to the north. Both of these conditions are creating a wet, hard to maintain area. In the wet area, we had a lot of volunteer trees that have grown up over the last couple of years, and are hindering the growth of evergreen trees planted on our property next to the interstate fence. My dad worked with Minnesota DOT recently to get a permit to occupy the right of way to cut those volunteer trees down and get removed from the right of way. We would like to try to keep the drainage ditch in front of the culvert as dry as possible to discourage the volunteer trees.

We would request someone to come out and assess the situation to see if there is a reasonable solution on limiting the drainage going down the ditch. MN DOT Region Office, gentleman by the name of Mark, (sorry I don't know his last name) has been very helpful in allowing us to clean their right of way even though technically I believe is their responsibility. We just want to protect our row of evergreen trees and limit the growth of volunteer trees and standing water as much as we can.

Please let me know if there is anything else you need from me or if we are in error of what we think is happening. I do appreciate your time and look forward to hearing from you.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide written testimony regarding the 2019-2022 SD DOT Transportation Improvement Program. This letter will focus on the transportation infrastructure North of Yankton on Highway 81.

#### <u>Highway 81 North of Yankton</u> – <u>Consider Extending the 4 lanes on HWY81 3</u> <u>additional miles</u>

There is an approximately a 3 mile stretch of HWY81 north of Yankton from the Tabor Road (4 miles north of Yankton) to the Volin Road. Our request is that as this section is evaluated, to extend the current 4 lane on HYW81 an additional 3 miles.

I. WHAT: CONCERNS/CONSIDERATIONS FOR US HWY81 - Where: Distance approx. 3 miles - Intersecting three roads - VOLIN ROAD (303 ST), UTICA ROAD (304 ST), and TABOR ROAD (306 ST)

#### II. WHY: A DISCUSSION OF ISSUES – CHALLENGES:

- Safety -Workforce/Patients Yankton is a regional referral center for health care needs and a supporting work force. The use of Highway 81 for emergency personnel and vehicles is common. There have been 12 fatalities since 1979 on that stretch of HWY81, and since 1959 at least 10 accidents where there have multiple deaths. Also many near misses, and a patrolman incident.
- 2. **Traffic Types Type of Traffic** US Highway 81 is a main artery of highway north and south providing the primary artery west of Interstate 29 and the primary road between Yankton and Sioux Falls. This has been reinforced with the port of entry fourteen miles north of Yankton. Trucks and campers are routine on this highway. In summary, there are gravel pits(2) within one mile; grain terminal exits(2) to Napa Junction, Tabor, and Utica; the port of entry to Nebraska to the north; the main artery HWY No/So West of I-29; Lewis and Clark campers; wind turbine deliveries to Nebraska; agriculture equipment for dealers to the north and south a significant variety.
- 3. **Terrain** Hills There are three segments of hills in this section including two curves. These hills limit passing options and have resulted in accidents because of site distance limitations. On the curves and in the middle of one hill there are intersections connecting primary highways which create safety issues with traffic slowing to turn. In summary significant hills, curves with intersection, and multiple blind approaches

- 4. **Lane and Speed Changes** Currently many exist situations with exits plus changing speeds required
- 5. **Entry Onto HWY 81** Challenging blind spots to enter HWY 81 from Volin road with North and South HSY81 traffic
- 6. **Housing Development** Site adjacent on 81 a multiuse complex on a and hill and curve (303-304 Sts)
- 7. **HWY 81 North of Yankton** 4 lanes would complement the existing 4 lanes complements and stretches of this highway that are already three lanes with long passing lanes
- 8. **County Planning** The county is maintaining fewer roads lead leading to greater use of HWY 81 to-from-for these arteries
- 9. **HWY 81 Location** The 3 intersections are the focal points in the Yankton County's core transportation system East, West, North, South. This area is basically the geographic center of Yankton County
- 10. **County Zoning** Planned changes are resulting in an increased number of larger vehicles in the rural areas

#### III. HOW: ROAD DESIGN CONSIDERATIONS FOR THESE 3 MILES

- 1. Extend the 4 Lanes North of Yankton on HWY81 for another 3 miles to the Volin Road (303 ST)
- 2. Widen the existing HWY 81 Poverty Valley Bridge within these 3 miles to a 4 lanes bridge

#### Summary

We ask your serious consideration as you finalize the program of work for the STIP plan that the three miles of HWY81 north of Yankton be evaluated for increased safety and traffic flow converting it to 4 lanes. Now is the time to plan for the future in that area

Dear Levi:

Please consider addressing the congested traffic issues on Highway 46 east and west of Irene by installing some type of slow lanes or lanes for passing. I have counted as many as 22 vehicles congested east of Irene. The traffic is especially heavy on Friday and Sunday evenings. Also the congestion west of Yankton continues to get worse. Some type of slow lanes or passing lanes is needed to relieve the congestion or better yet switching to 4 lanes all the way to Tabor.

Highway 46: I would strongly encourage slow lanes such as on Highway 81 first instead of spending 30 million dollars on reconstruction of the entire road west of Irene.

De icing of roads: It seems like switching back to a sand de icer mix instead of liquid de icer would make much more sense. The sand mix will adhere to the road better and give more traction. From my observations the liquid de icer freezes up immediately in open areas without wind protection from trees etc. In my opinion the liquid deicer is more dangerous than a sand de icer mix. This is not lowa. The wind is much stronger and colder here. I have seen cars and vehicles go in the ditch once the come out of the wind protected areas and hit the pure iced up roads where the liquid de icer did not work.

Please consider this a request to do more sanding and deicing of state Highway 50 west of Yankton after 5pm and before 6 am so that rural and small town nightshift employees can drive safely to and from work in Yankton.

Going 80 mph at night on the interstate makes no sense and is a huge mistake. I am asking the Department to introduce legislation lowering the night time speed limit to 70 mph in the 2019 legislative session.

Dear Honored Ladies and Gentlemen: South Dakota DOT

I have served on the Tyndall Fire Department for over 25 years. I have been to accidents on every road coming into our town. Roads that are single or double lanes. As you talk to the people that were in the wreaks you hear one story told over and over. The person that pulled out in front of the other vehicle says "I just didn't see them!" and the person in the other vehicle says "I just couldn't stop in time!". This includes myself. I was in an accident 1 mile west of Tyndall on the divided Highway. I was heading west and as I approached the divided highway I seen a car at the stop sign. It crossed the east bound road, stopped in the median area and then pulled out in front of me. I slammed on my breaks and hit the side of the car. Right before I hit the car I could see the driver plain as day talking on the phone. She said she didn't see me, I said I couldn't stop. It was not the roads fault. Last summer as a fireman I responded to a car truck accident on Highway 50 and Main Street. A car was on the East bound lane of Highway 50. They stopped at the intersection and then turned to head into Tyndall. They pulled out in front of a semi truck. The highway patrol determined that the truck was going 70 in a 55 mph zone. The people in the car said they didn't see the truck and the truck driver said he couldn't stop. People just don't slow down for a 55 mph sign. But they will for a 45 mph sign. Check out Meckling SD. They have a divided highway and a 45 mph speed limit. Are you going to change that too or let it go? As elected officials you have an obligation to do what's right for the people, to keep us safe, and to do that job responsibly. The best way to do that is to lower the speed limit, spend a couple \$1000 on signs first, save the taxpayers millions.

So the South Dakota Department of Transportation wants to eliminate four lane rural intersections on two lane highways and replace them with three lane intersections. Let's look at some data specific to the highway in question and not generalize about 4 lanes or the need to build a new four lane.

So first let's put to bed the notion that due to traffic volumes the 4 lane is not warranted. Since the four lane sections are already there the cost of the do nothing option that engineers refer to is zero dollars. You can argue there are maintenance costs and you are correct but the cost of a regrade to change a 4 lane section to a 3 lane section (left turn lane), then add a right turn lane (now that's 4 lanes if my math is correct), easily outweighs the benefit of less snow to plow and a smaller area to chip seal. The information that the DOT provided in their presentations has to do with when a NEW four lane section is warranted. The people are not asking for a new four lane, only the retention of some of the existing four lane sections.

Second, why do I say some of the existing four lane sections? Because each section should be treated as its own unique section. All of the sections are unique. There is no reason that one solution should be used at all four lane sections. The geometry, volumes, and accident data is known for each section and varies widely.

So since the DOT website has accident data available for about the last 4 years we will look at those years, for some of the sites. I could do this for all of the sites but that is not my job, it's the DOT's job. This data is taken from SD DOT interactive road systems maps. Starting on SD 50 from east to west at Tabor between 4-21-16 and 5-24-17 (all of the accidents in this section that are on the website) there was one driver ran off the road accident, one driver hit obstruction in road (non-vehicle) and one failure to yield accident. At SD 25 there was one accident on 3-11-14 and it was a wild animal hit. That is one accident in 4 years, at 4 intersections where a vehicle hit a vehicle and it was due to failure to yield.

In comparison to a 3 lane section of road on SD 50 at 435<sup>th</sup> avenue (10 miles east in Yankton County) in the same time period there were 4 animal hits, 2 run off the road and one rear end accident at one intersection. That is one accident at one intersection in the same 4 years or a 400% higher accident rate at the 3 lane section intersection than the 4 lane intersections. Maybe the money would be better spent placing right turn lanes at 435<sup>th</sup> avenue.

The DOT has recently removed a 4 lane section of SD 19 and made it a 3 lane at Parker, so let's compare accident data from that project site. In the same time period from the same DOT website there were 6 accidents at 2 intersections. Three were read end, two were failure to Yield, and one was a U turn collision. This section also has the advantage of a 40 MPH speed limit (SD 50 is 65 MPH) and traffic volumes less than half of that of SD 50, but it still manages an accident rate of 3 accidents in 4 years per intersection so it looks like the change from 4 lane to 3 lane did not resolve the problem of driver error there either. For those of you doing the math it is a rate 1200% higher than the SD 50 4 lane sections.

i'm not making these points because I think nothing should be done, I just don't want to see the wrong thing done and have an increase in accidents because of it. For example at SD 50 and SD 25 the new proposal doesn't even square up the intersection. It doesn't move the intersection farther from the railroad crossing on SD 25 which is another potential accident location, and it doesn't reuse the existing lanes on the south side of the 4 lane so it will cost more to construct and cause more inconvenience to the public. If the reason for removing the 4 lane was because it was the only way to provide better sight distances by placing the intersection at 90 degrees instead of the skew than maybe it is justified, but don't try to justify it by saying it will save money and lower accident rates because you do not have the data to back that up. The DOT should look into ways to provide better sight distances, reduce speeds, and provide the highest level of service we can afford to provide.



I am Frank Kloucek testifying on behalf of myself in favor of Senate Resolution 3. Thank you to Senator Nelson for bringing this legislation forward. This issue is a very important issue to many people in our region who utilize Highway 50 in Bon Homme County. All my life as a legislator I have advocated spending more money to make our State Highways safer. This is one of the few times I ask that the South Dakota DOT implement low cost methods to make Highway 50 safer before they would ever tear out the 4 lanes in Bon Homme County. In a Dec 22 article in the Mitchell Daily Republic the South Dakota DOT said "The planning phase of a project to reconstruct portions of Highway 50 between Tyndall and Tabor has been completed. This section has seen an above average number of crashes." This is all true. However the DOT is not telling us the above average number of crashes and deaths are occurring on the Highway and they are doing very little to address that issue. 7 deaths on the two lanes from Tabor to Highway 25 and so it goes. Many of the 4 lane intersections had no fatalities and minimal accident rates. The people want to know why the Dot is coming now with a reduction of the 4 lanes to 2 lanes with miles of center turning lanes to nowhere....... The original cost for redoing all 5 four lanes was 13 million. Yet when the 4 lane was left intact at the junction of Highway 50 and North Hwy 37 the cost was still at approximately 13 million. There were no major accidents and no fatalities at the county road 303 intersection yet it is being eliminated. This will really cause concerns for farm and commercial traffic. On and on it goes. Two petitions have been circulated one in 2015 and one this winter with outstanding support for keeping our 4 lanes open. In studying the accident rate at the jct. of SD Highway 19 and 44 east of Parker the removal of the 4 lanes and installation of a three lane on Hwy 44 has resulted in accident rates 1200 times higher than the accident rates on the 4 lanes in Bon Homme County. The citizens of Bon Homme County have been asking for years for common sense solutions to this issue below is a list of those proposals offered to DOT instead of removing the 4 lanes. We support efforts to save our 4 Lanes for the following reasons: \*Keeping 4 lane intersections on Highway 50 in Bon Homme County intact

\*Slowing traffic down to 45 mph by Tyndall and 55 mph by Tabor.

- \*Squaring up all intersections. \*Prohibit Roundabouts from being installed.
- \*Use of solar powered speed notification signage at high traffic areas.
- \*Keeping county road 303 intersections with Highway 50 intact west of Tyndall.
- \*Install much needed turning lanes by Avon and other common sense safety measures intented to reduce accidents and save lives for those traveling on Highway 50.

\*Install much needed slow lane at the junction of Highways 50 and 52 south of Tabor going east to top of hill.

It is appears the SD DOT has made a predetermined decision to destroy the 4 lanes no matter what. There are Speed Alert 18 radar messaging battery and solar operated signs available from a company called All Traffic Solutions for 2700 dollars per sign and DOT have not installed them at the Tyndall intersection. The stakeholders' input appears to be repeatedly ignored. I have served on the Tyndall Fire Department for over 25 years. I have been to accidents on every road coming into our town. Roads that are single or double lanes. As you talk to the people that were in the wreaks you hear one story told over and over. The person that pulled out in front of the other vehicle says "I just didn't see them!" and the person in the other vehicle says "I just couldn't stop in time!". This includes myself. I was in an accident 1 mile west of Tyndall on the divided Highway. I was heading west and as I approached the divided highway I seen a car at the stop sign, it crossed the east bound road, stopped in the median area and then pulled out in front of me. 1 slammed on my breaks and hit the side of the car. Right before I hit the car I could see the driver plain as day talking on the phone. She said she didn't see me, I said I couldn't stop. It was not the roads fault. Last summer as a fireman I responded to a car truck accident on Highw! ay 50 and Main Street. A car was on the East bound lane of Highway 50. They stopped at the intersection and then turned to head into Tyndall. They pulled out in front of a semi truck. The highway patrol determined that the truck was going 70 in a 55 mph zone. The people in the car said they didn't see the truck and the truck driver said he couldn't stop. People just don't slow down for a 55 mph sign. But they will for a 45 mph sign. Check out Meckling SD. They have a divided highway and a 45 mph speed limit. Are you going to change that too or let it go? As elected officials you have an obligation to do what's right for the people, to keep us safe, and to do that job responsibly. The best way to do that is to lower the speed limit, spend a couple \$1000 on signs first, save the taxpayers millions.

DOT STIP Testimony The Highway 50 4 lane issue is a very important issue to many people in our region who utilize Highway 50 in Bon Homme County. All my life as a legislator I have advocated for many years spending more money to make our State Highways safer. This is one of the few times I ask that the South Dakota DOT implement low cost methods to make Highway 50 safer before they would ever tear out the 4 lanes in Bon Homme County. In a Dec 22 article in the Mitchell Daily Republic the South Dakota DOT said "The planning phase of a project to reconstruct portions of Highway 50 between Tyndall and Tabor has been completed. This section has seen an above average number of crashes." This is all true. However the DOT is not telling us the above average number of crashes and deaths are occurring on the Highway and they are doing very little to address that issue. 7 deaths on the two lanes from Tabor to Highway 25 and so it goes. Many of the 4 lane intersections had no fatalities and minimal accident rates. The people want to know why the Dot is coming now with a reduction of the 4 lanes to 2 lanes with miles of center turning lanes to nowhere....... The original cost for redoing all 5 four lanes was 13 million. Yet when the 4 lane was left intact at the junction of Highway 50 and North Hwy 37 the cost was still at approximately 13 million. There were no major accidents and no fatalities at the county road 303 intersection yet it is being eliminated. This will really cause concerns for farm and commercial traffic. On and on it goes. Two petitions have been circulated one in 2015 and one this winter with outstanding support for keeping our 4 lanes open. In studying the accident rate at the jct. of SD Highway 19 and 44 east of Parker the removal of the 4 lanes and installation of a three lane on Hwy 44 has resulted in accident rates 1200 times higher than the accident rates on the 4 lanes in Bon Homme County. The citizens of Bon Homme County have been asking for years for common sense solutions to this issue below is a list of those proposals offered to DOT instead of removing the 4 lanes. We support efforts to save our 4

Lanes for the following reasons:

\*Keeping 4 lane intersections on Highway 50 in Bon Homme

County intact 700

\*Slowing traffic down to 45 mph by Tyndall and 55 mph by Tabor.

- \*Squaring up all intersections.

#### Dear Mr. Briggs:

I would like to offer my sincere concern about the proposed DOT changes to Highway 50 near Tabor and Tyndall, which involves restructuring by removing the four lanes in places. This highway is used by my household almost daily. My son, like many others in Tabor, Tyndall, Scotland, Lesterville, and Utica, has a job in Yankton. Highway 50 between Tyndall and Yankton is heavily traveled especially during the hours that these people are going to and returning from work, but the highway seems to always have a lot of traffic from both directions. In the evenings, there are lots of cars, which can be people going to work, going out for food or entertainment or late shopping. There is also a fair amount of hills and curves which prevent safe passing. Add to that load, the heavy amount of trucks that use the highway, plus the farm vehicle traffic. I have often driven this road when I am behind a slow moving vehicle for miles, which can be an elderly driver, a farm vehicle, or a pickup pulling a boat and/or camper going or coming from Lewis and Clark lake. As the cars stack up behind this vehicle, someone grows impatient and tries to pass quickly knowing there is a vehicle coming from the other direction. I have seen many close calls when the vehicle being passed quickly brakes to let someone back into the lane.

How do the four lanes at Tabor and Tyndall help alleviate this problem? They serve as a relief valve, so the slow vehicle can pull to the right and many vehicles can pass that person. I found myself during a heavy rain storm on a dark night in July being the person who pulled to the right at Tabor to allow a couple of tailgaters to pass me because I was not comfortable driving faster in the current downpour that I found myself in. It was such a relief for me to not have those headlights in my rear view mirror. As I mentioned above, I have also appreciated having the four lanes to pass a slow moving truck or vehicle who pulled over in the right lane and gave me an invitation to pass.

I support the DOT keeping the current four lanes and adding a left hand turn lane at Tabor and Tyndall. As I have presented above, this stretch of Highway 50 is so heavily traveled in both directions from 6 am to 11 pm that the DOT needs to plan and work on providing more four lanes in some areas to allow for safe passing. Please do not consider taking lanes away from us. The traffic load on Highway 50 will only increase in future days. In Scotland we are seeing houses selling quickly for increased prices due to the fact that Yankton real estate prices have increased, so small town prices are more attractive. More people means more traffic to and from Yankton. We need more lanes, not less.
