### American Rescue Plan Act

#### **American Rescue Plan**

- The American Rescue Plan (ARP) provides \$1.9T in funding
- There are many components to the ARP
  - Direct Payment to Citizens
  - State and Local Government Aid
  - Expanded Unemployment Provisions
  - Education Provisions
  - Tax Provisions
  - Small Business Provisions
  - Health Provisions
  - Others

#### Coronavirus State & Local Fiscal Recovery Funds

- \$350B in Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (CSLFRF) to state, local, and tribal governments
- Treasury launched the CSLFRF on May 10, 2021
  - The use of funds is to support the public health response, address negative economic impacts, premium pay, replenish lost revenue, and make necessary investments in infrastructure
  - Recipients can use the funds to cover costs incurred by December 31, 2024
  - Treasury will distribute funds to eligible state, local, and tribal governments
  - Non-entitlement local governments (population < 50k) will receive funding through their state government

#### Coronavirus State & Local Fiscal Recovery Funds

- The state, counties, and Metropolitan cities will receive funds directly from Treasury
  - State of South Dakota will receive \$974.5M
  - South Dakota Counties will receive \$171.8M
  - Sioux Falls will receive \$25.4M
  - Rapid City will receive \$13.0M
  - SD Non-entitlement units (cities < 50k) will receive approximately \$65.2M through the state
- States that have experienced an increase in unemployment rate of more than 2 percentage points from February 2020 will receive a single payment. Other states (including SD) will receive funds in two equal tranches
- Local governments will receive funding in two equal tranches

### Coronavirus Capital Projects Fund

- The ARP also provides \$10B to the Coronavirus Capital Projects Fund for states, territories, and tribal governments
- This funding is for capital projects directly enabling work, education, and health monitoring. The focus is on the continuing need for connectivity
- Treasury plans to begin accepting applications this summer after further guidance is issued
