Staff Analysis

- 1) Current rates are \$40.25 per 5,000 gallons usage. At the recommended funding level, the system will have to increase their rates approximately \$0.25 to meet the required debt coverage.
- 2) The City of Lead's MHI qualifies them as a disadvantaged community which allows them to qualify for the 2.75% rate for 20 years. However, the City of Lead will need to increase rates to a minimum of \$45.00 per 5,000 gallons useage to be eligible for the lower interest rate.

Funding Recommendation: \$841,425 Drinking Water State Revolving Fund loan at 2.75% for 20 years.

Debt Service Coverage: 110% coverage at rates of \$40.50 per 5,000 gallons.

Loan Contingencies:

- 1) Contingent upon the Borrower adopting a bond resolution and the resolution becoming effective.
- 2) Contingent upon the Borrower establishing rates at a level sufficient to provide the required debt coverage.

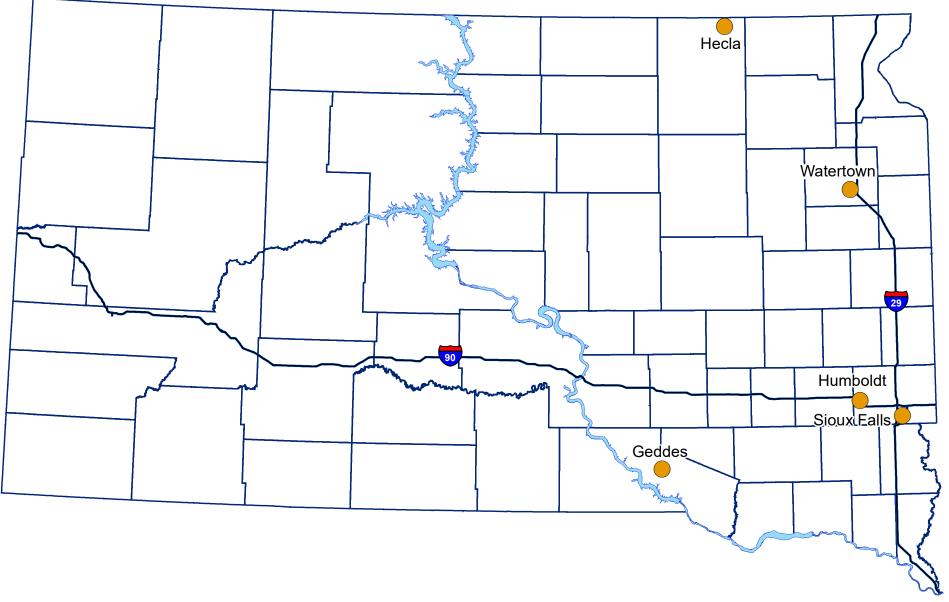

- 2) Staff analysis indicates that based on the new rates going into effect the total revenue would provide the required coverage. Watertown could restructure rates to inclue the surcharge and stay at the new 2024 rates.

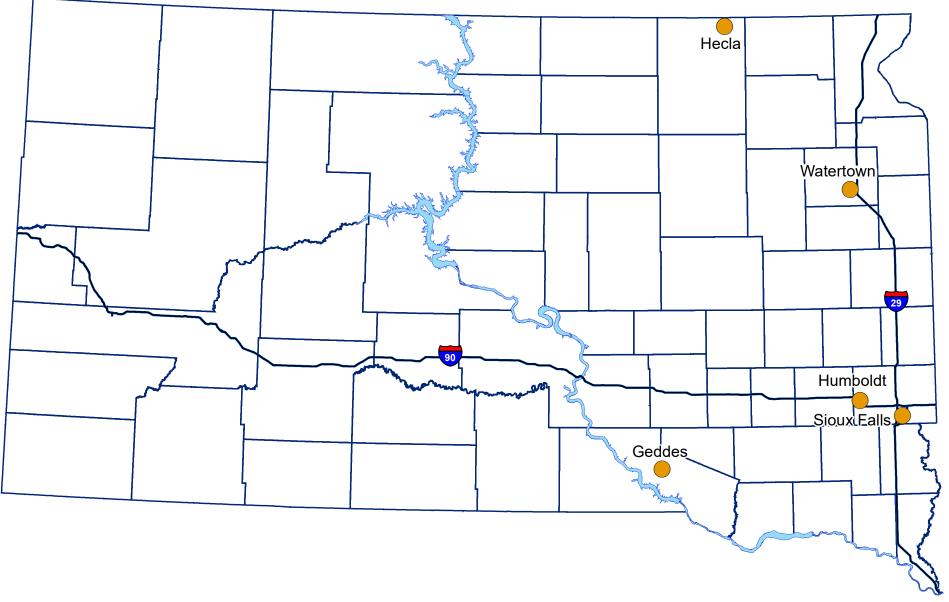

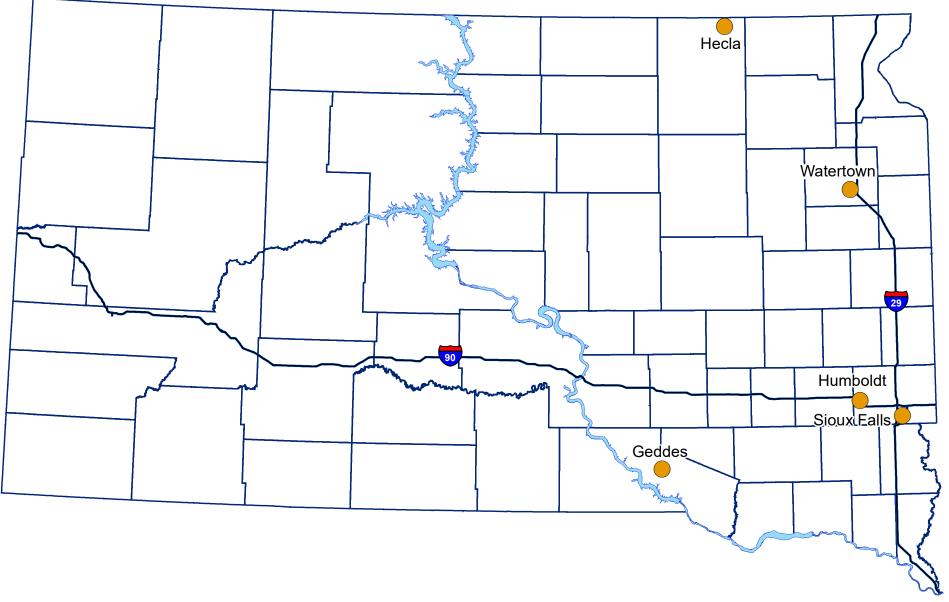

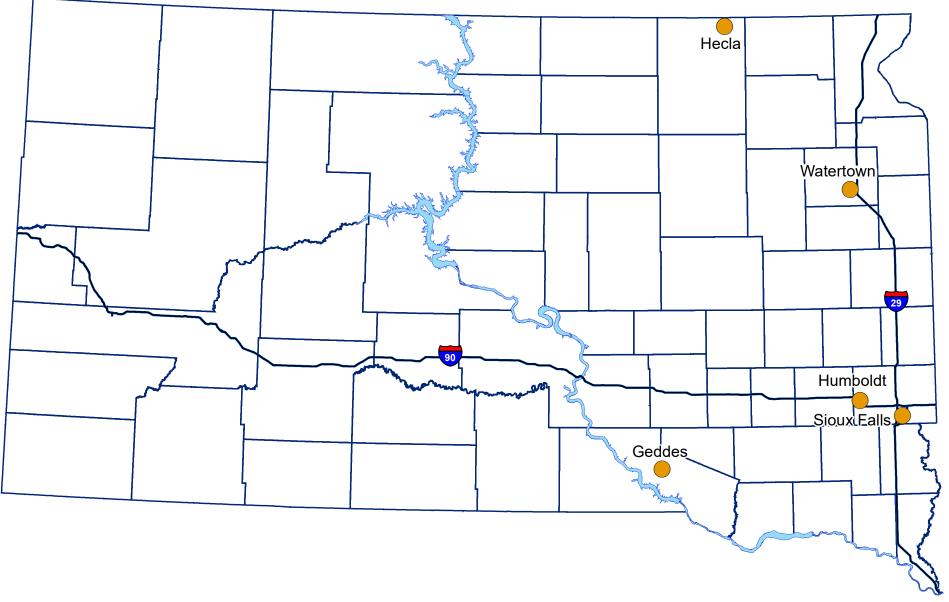
Staff Analysis

- 1) This application was originally presented in September 2023 and staff recommended deferral for Hecla to submit a revised project scope. The city has submitted a smaller project scope working with their consulting engineer for a total project cost of \$2,500,000.
- 2) Current rates are at \$48.00 per 5,000 gallons. If funding is provided as all loan, a surcharge of \$66.60 would be needed to meet the required debt coverage, which would bring overall rates to \$114.60.
- 3) At the recommended funding level a surcharge of \$21.80 would be required, which would bring overall rates to \$69.80. Staff analysis indicates Hecla can restructure their rates to keep total rates at \$60.00 per 5,000 gallons.
- **Funding Recommendation:** Award a \$2,500,000 Clean Water SRF loan at 3.25% for 30 years with 67.3% as principal forgiveness not to exceed \$1,682,000.
- Debt Service Coverage: 110% based on a \$21.80 surcharge

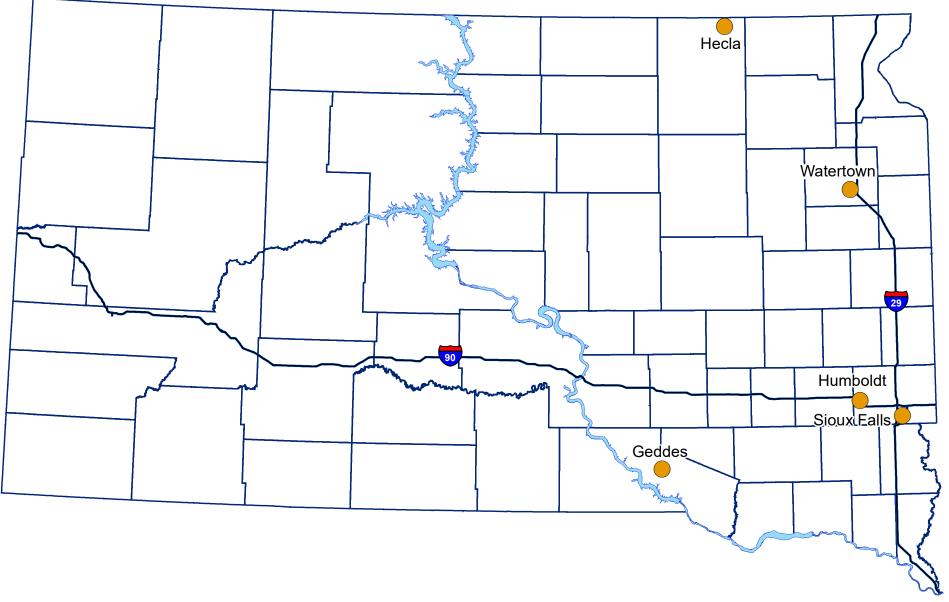

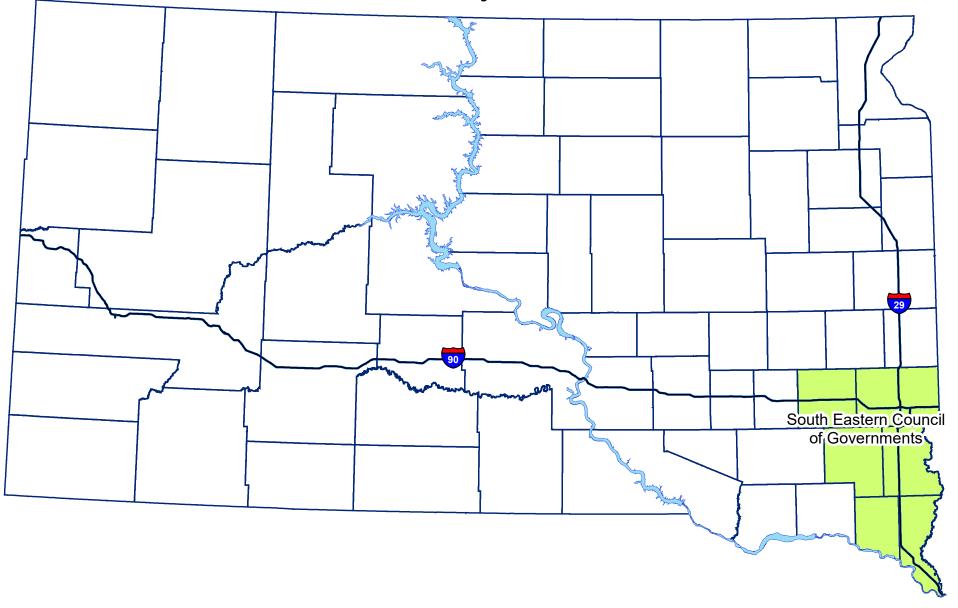

- 2) In April 2022, Davison Rural Water System was awarded a \$1,250,000 funding package that included a \$810,385 State Revolving Fund Drinking Water loan and a \$439,615 ARPA grant. However, additional funding is needed to complete the project.

The additional funding is to cover the revised cost estimate and any cost overages.
- 2) Current rates are \$77.25 per 7,000 gallons usage. At the recommended funding level, the system will have to increase their rates to approximately \$79.35 to meet the required debt coverage.
