TSLP is the Product of the Transition Systems Change Project (1995 – 1999).

TSLP Purpose: Improve and Expand High School Transition Options and Services for Students in South Dakota.

By Providing Technical Assistance, Resources, and Training to students with disabilities and families, local education agencies and adult service agencies across the state.

- Co-funded by State Division of Rehabilitation Services and Office Special Education Programs
- Facilitated “*South Dakota Transition Cooperative Agreement*”, a formal state interagency transition agreement.

Youth Leadership Forum (Youth Development)



- Five-day Leadership & Self-Advocacy Training
- Held in June on the NSU campus in Aberdeen
- 80 to 100 students apply to attend annually
- 45 to 50 student selections along with alternates
- 80+ individuals involved in assisting to make the event possible, and
- 30 groups or organizations involved

- Virtual Recordings Available on TSLP Website

Regional Transition Forums (Linkages)

Informal and Interactive meet-and-greets for transition-age students, their families, and service providers.

- Awareness of TSLP events and activities

- Often in conjunction with parent-teacher conferences, community resource fairs, TSLP events, etc.

Transition IEP File Reviews

- TSLP Staff join the Education Specialists
- Review IEPs of Transition-Aged Students
- Approximately 30 School Districts Annually
- Provide Individual Technical Assistance and Follow-up
- Provide Inservice Training to School Districts

- Host Annual Meeting for Disability Services Coordinators from Postsecondary Schools
