Agenda

1. **Call to Order:** 9:00 a.m. on August 25, 2023. Introductions were shared by members, staff, and guests present. Young provided the opportunity for guests to provide comments and explained that attendees may address the committee throughout the meeting; no guests requested to do so during the meeting.
2. **Minutes from August 26th, 2022** were approved unanimously.
3. **Advanced Practice Nursing Advisory Committee Membership:**
 - a. Committee roster of members reviewed, directed to provide updates to Olson.
 - b. Committee Appointments: Olson reported that the Board of Nursing appointed Carol Stewart, CNP and Dustin Delaney, CRNA to a 1st term at the Board's August 9, 2023 meeting. Olson informed members that Gibson's and Klinkhammer's 3rd terms end 10/2023. Olson thanked Gibson and Klinkhammer for their time and expertise in serving on the committee for three full terms.
4. **SD APRN Workforce Report:** Olson provided APRN licensure and characteristic data from the 2023 SD Nursing Workforce Report. The number of actively licensed CNPs has grown significantly; CRNA and CNM numbers show positive growth, and CNS numbers continue to decrease. Members discussed supply and demand issues for APRNs in South Dakota.
5. **2022 OOH CNM Report:** Olson provided a report on out-of-hospital (OOH) births attended by South Dakota CNMs. Since 2008, 904 women requested an OOH birth, 86.3% delivered OOH. In 2022, a total of 198 women requested an OOH birth, 178 delivered OOH, 7 were referred for a hospital birth, and 13 were transported during labor to a hospital.
6. **South Dakota and National Legislative/Rules Updates:**
 - a. Young shared the proposed amendments to RN and LPN practice rules in ARSD 20:48. The proposed rules are posted on the state portal and the Board's public hearing to adopt the rules will be held on October 10, 2023. The rules are open for public comment.

¹1-27-1.17. Draft minutes of public meeting to be available--Exceptions--Violation as misdemeanor. The unapproved, draft minutes of any public meeting held pursuant to § 1-25-1 that are required to be kept by law shall be available for inspection by any person within ten business days after the meeting. However, this section does not apply if an audio or video recording of the meeting is available to the public on the governing body's website within five business days after the meeting. A violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor. However, the provisions of this section do not apply to draft minutes of contested case proceedings held in accordance with the provisions of chapter 1-26.

- b. Olson shared 2023 SD legislative changes that impacted APRNs, including HB 1080 which prohibits certain medical and surgical interventions on minors; HB 1154 which modified acceptable conduct for practitioners related to medical cannabis certifications; and HB 1162 which allows licensed healthcare providers to directly or by standing orders, dispense or distribute an opioid antagonist to an employer.
7. **Review SD APRN Practice Guidelines and Scope of Practice Decisioning Algorithm:** Olson provided a copy and presented an overview of the Board approved guidelines. Within the guidelines, the Licensure, Accreditation, Certification and Education (LACE) national network’s statement titled, “Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRN) Changing a Population or Role” is referenced. The statement provides guidance to APRNs who want to treat patients that are not consistent with that APRN’s licensed role or focus area and recommends the APRN obtain additional formal education and national certification. Members discussed various scenarios involving family certified nurse practitioners working in critical access, acute, and psychiatric settings. Members were asked to consider if revisions to the Board’s APRN practice guidelines are necessary or to leave the current guidelines as written; Pravecek, Schryvers, White, Reitsma, and Foland voiced support to leave the document as written. Olson and Young shared that more national conversation will be taking place regarding the LACE network statement; members will be informed if updates are made to the statement.
8. **Review Elective IV Infusion and Medication Therapy Guidelines:** Olson presented an overview of the South Dakota Board of Nursing’s approved guidelines, located on the Board’s website. Members discussed state and national interest regarding elective IV infusion and medication therapy services. Olson informed members that if any changes are needed to the Board’s guidelines, they will be given the opportunity to provide input.
9. **National Nursing Association Updates:** Members shared a brief overview of activities of their national or local professional associations: White reported that the National Association of Clinical Nurse Specialists (NACNS) has been discussing the National Organization of Nurse Practitioner Faculties (NONPF) 750 clinical hour requirement and how this clinical hour change could have an impact on future CNS education standards. Schryvers shared information on the Nurse Practitioner Association of South Dakota (NPASD) Fall Conference which will be held on October 27-28, 2023. Olson encouraged members to contact her with any APRN practice topics of interest to explore at future meetings.
 - a. Olson provided an overview of the key provisions of the APRN Compact. Three states have adopted the APRN compact legislation: North Dakota, Delaware, and Utah. A total of seven states are needed to enact the compact.
10. **Open Dialog on APRN Practice, Roles, Activities:** No additional member discussion. Olson encouraged members to contact her with any APRN practice topics of interest to explore at future meetings.
