Federal Grants-in-aid Distribution Plan, FFY 2024**

Mission: The State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) manages the National Register of Historic Places program of the National Park Service in South Dakota. The SHPO surveys, inventories, and works to register historic properties; monitors state, federal, and local government activities which affect cultural and historic resources; provides advice on preservation methods; promotes public education on historical properties; and supports municipal and county historic preservation commissions to advance the state's economic, social, and educational objectives.

1. FFY 2024 **estimated** appropriation is **\$896,513**. FFY 2023 was \$896,513
2. Federal government is operating under a continuing resolution set to expire on November 17, 2023.
3. The State Historic Preservation Office solicited public comments for the FFY2024 work plan through a press release that was carried in newspapers across the state. The State Historic Preservation Office staff also held a planning meeting, incorporating public comments, on November 14, 2023, to consider projects for FFY2024.
4. The below table represents proposed federal projected funding areas for 2024 (**IN BOLDFACE**).
