
## **Background & Methodology**

- Combination online and telephone data collection
- Data collected from August 24 September 10, 2024




### **Public Transportation Overall Rating**




Q8. How would you rate public transportation in South Dakota on each of the following?






## **Reasons for Riding or Not Riding**

"I prefer to drive for the flexibility it provides. Public transportation here is limited and scheduling ahead of when a ride is needed is required. I understand, but my work does not always allow this to work."


"I don't know anything about the availability, locations, or type of public transportation that are available. I also have a functional vehicle (so) that using public transportation doesn't come to mind."






Q10. If public transportation in South Dakota did provide service from the area where you live to the places you want to go in your area, how likely would you be to use it?



#### Know Any Transportation Users in Area?








Q11A. Do you personally know anyone else in your area who uses public transportation?



Q2/Q11A/Q12. Affected By Public Transportation







Q7B. Are you aware of demand-response public transportation? Q7C. Who do you think demand-response public transportation is meant for?
