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RULES Hearing - ARSD 24:43 (Dual Credit)

The Board of Education Standards convened at 9:05 a.m. CT May 22, 2023, in the Library Commons, First Floor, MacKay Building, 800 Governors Drive, Pierre, SD.

The purpose of the meeting was to conduct a public hearing on the proposed rules of the Board of Education Standards numbered ARSD 24:43:11:17 (Dual Credit) adopted under the authority of SDCL 13-37-1.1.

Laura Scheibe, Director, Division of College, Career and Student Success, DOE presented that the rules package was the result of SB 182, passed during the 2023 Legislative Session, that tasked the Board of Education Standards with setting a uniform method for school districts to calculate the amount of credit that a high school student receives for completion of a postsecondary course. She noted that this applies to all dual and concurrent credit arrangements and that the rules package presented was straightforward – with the proposal that three postsecondary credits be equal to one high school credit (with breakouts for other credit awards), and that if a course aligned to a graduation requirement, the credit must be transcribed as that requirement and not as elective credit. Scheibe presented the written public comments that were received.

 - Mr. Cromwell is the parent of a student who took dual credit but because his district only awarded .5 credits per three postsecondary credits, as opposed to one credit, the family decided to homeschool the student. They made this decision so as to not further disadvantage him for scholarships and athletic eligibility. He believes the uniform crediting is an important first step and believes it is fair to have consistency across all 149 school districts.
