

Systems of Care (SOC) Services

SOC helps families navigate and access services with a goal of reducing barriers that would otherwise put the youth at risk of justice system involvement.

As of June 2021, there are 44 SOC Care Coordinators, including Project Aware, serving families in 33 counties across the state. In FY22, SOC services will also be available in 8 additional counties.

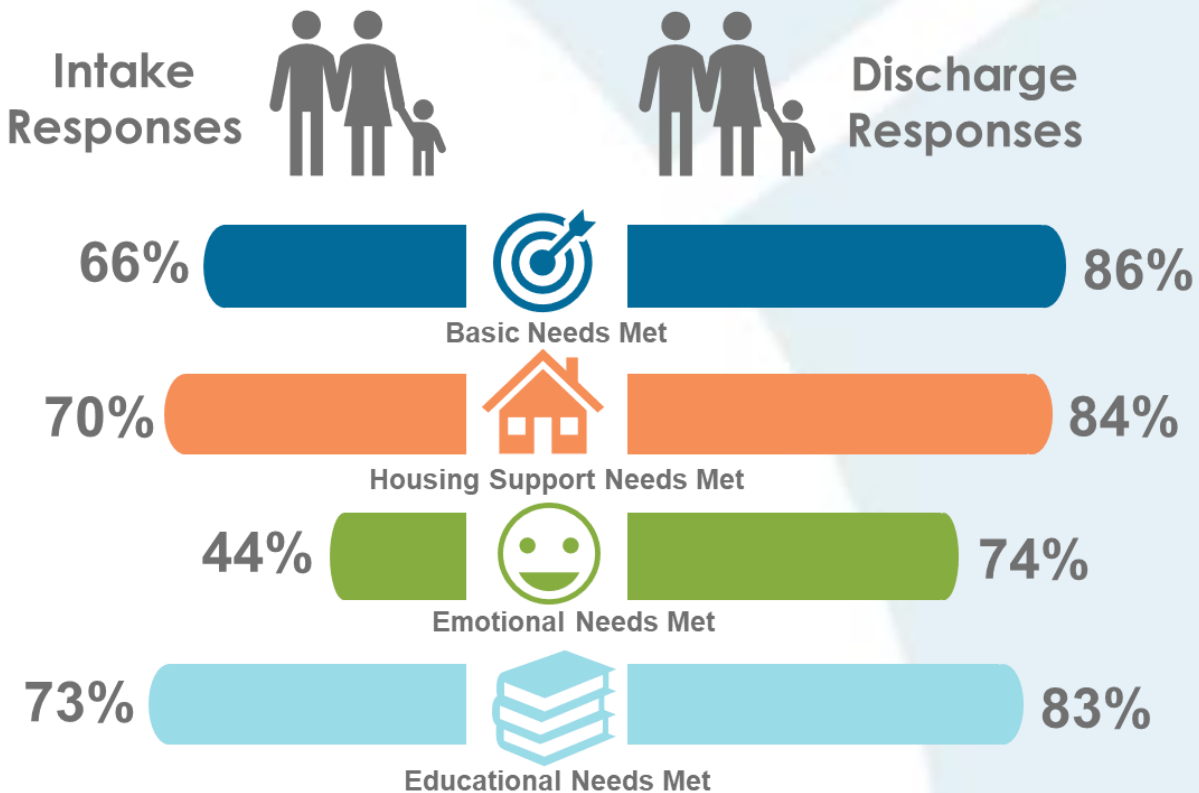
Data are still being finalized for FY21. However, through April 2021, there were 577 families that had been served in SOC, with over 1,200 youth benefiting from those services.

Data below reflect the outcomes experienced by families served in SOC services from June through November 2020.

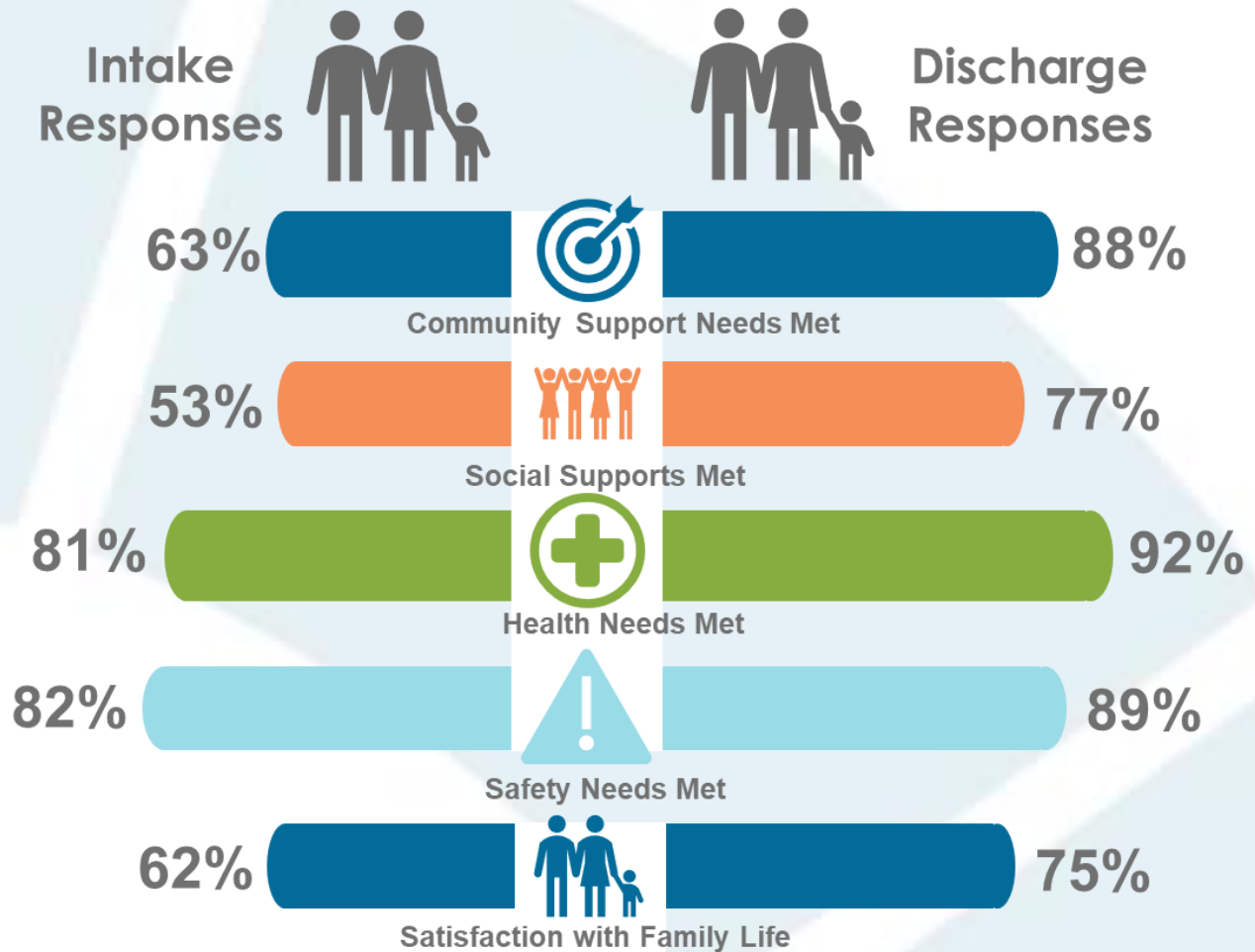
Families reported improved outcomes in all areas measured including basic needs, housing supports, emotional and educational needs.
