ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS

- Disabled young adults (ages 18 30)
- Family members of disabled youth/young adults
- Educators, transition professionals, and related service providers serving disabled students in pre-school through late-20s.



Accessibility features and universal design will be embedded into the Series, including captioning, ASL, Spanish translation, plain language materials, and additional supports and accommodations as needed.

ACTIVITIES

Eight, two-hour, highly interactive sessions:

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Creating a culture of inclusion and belonging.

JUNE 2026

Authentic inclusion in school and community: hearts, minds, rights.

JULY 2026

Community organizing, advocacy, and media/communications.

SEPTEMBER 2026

Adulting while disabled: Creating a self-determined life.

OCTOBER 2026

Finding meaningful work: careers, entrepreneurship, the arts, volunteering.

NOVEMBER 2026

Expanding minds and community through continued education and lifelong learning.

JANUARY 2027

Living a social life of your choosing: friendships, relationships, intimacy.

FEBRUARY 2027

Connecting the dots, action group reportouts, graduation, staying connected.

Plus regular breakout gatherings between sessions:

 All participants will engage in personal and group action planning with specific outcomes, supported by experienced facilitators. Young adult participants will also have regular, informal mentorship gatherings to connect with disabled leaders/innovators.

OUTCOMES

Participants in this Series will:

- Learn and practice powerful strategies for community organizing and impacting policy at the local, state, and federal level.
- Take part in communications training from professional speakers, writers, influencers, and media makers.
- Be mentored by trailblazers in inclusive education, transition, and disability justice.

- Access and utilize groundbreaking resources and tools.
- Team up with Series participants to actively implement tools and strategies for disability justice and inclusion in schools, communities, states, and across the nation.
- Receive a Certificate of Completion to submit for professional development or educational credit.

Series staff will facilitate meetups for graduates after the Series ends.
