Review of the history, duties, and responsibilities of the Council

After introductions, Mr. Sattizahn gave a brief history of the Juvenile Justice Oversight Council starting with the 2015 origin of the council, originally established as a group of stakeholders with the primary responsibility of monitoring implementation and concluding with the 2023 legislation that shifted the primary focus of the council to be a policy-recommending entity.

While the emphasis of the council has shifted, the necessity to rely on data for policy decisions did not change. Mr. Sattizahn recommended that the Council consider what data the council wanted to track and report in future reports.

Review FY 2023 Annual Report
