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OFFICIAL BOARD MINUTES FOR DECEMBER 10, 2024 VIDEO CONFERENCE

CALL TO ORDER: Berg-Poppe called the meeting to order at 12:01 PM CST.

ROLL CALL: Tellinghuisen Geddes called the roll. Berg-Poppe, yes; Suel, absent; Schmitz, yes; Thuringer, yes; Toman, yes; Ahrendt, yes; Weigel, yes. A quorum was present.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA: Weigel made a motion to approve the agenda. Toman seconded the motion. **MOTION PASSED** by unanimous voice vote.

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD: None.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES FROM OCTOBER 8, 2024: Schmitz made a motion to approve the minutes from October 8, 2024. Toman seconded the motion. MOTION PASSED by unanimous voice vote.

FINANCIAL UPDATE: Tellinghuisen-Geddes reported year-to-date financials as of October 31, 2024: Revenue of \$6,403.71, expenses of \$61,434.28 and a Cash Balance of \$1,210,463.61.

FSBPT ANNUAL EDUCATION MEETING REPORT: Schmitz and Weigel provided a report on topics discussed at the FSBPT Annual Education meeting held in October. AI and its use in medicine and physical therapy was a topic. PTA supervision, and its role in building healthy relationships and complaints was also discussed. Additionally, the PT compact was addressed, including what states should be charging for a compact privilege. Weigel expressed his appreciation for the meeting and was impressed by the topics and overall efficiency of the meeting.

COMPACT FEE DISCUSSION: The board discussed changing the South Dakota PT compact privilege to align with the application fee South Dakota charges for a South Dakota license. Following discussion, Schmitz moved to raise the compact fee to \$120 plus any applicable processing and commission fees. Toman seconded the motion. **MOTION PASSED** by unanimous voice vote.

PTA SUPERVISION VIA TELEHEALTH DISCUSSION: The board discussed a question that had been raised to the board office regarding PTA's being supervised by a PT virtually, while the PT is residing in a different state from the PTA. Suel indicated he believed the original intent of the law was that the joint visits be in person and raised questions regarding the complete assessments of a patient. The board discussed how healthcare has changed with COVID and opening the door to telehealth. Telehealth, along with AI will be a topic the board will want to keep on their radar in the coming years as it will impact all aspects of care, including supervision. Berg-Poppe advised that the SD-APTA is looking at updating the practice act and will be proposing changes to the standards of supervision with that legislation. The board will address proposed changes when they become available.

LEGACY CANDIDATES: Weigel reported that legacy candidates, who tested prior to 1996 when states had their own individual passing scores, was a topic at the annual FSBPT meeting. Tellinghuisen Geddes advised that she spoke with FSBPT and confirmed that South Dakota's passing criteria prior to 1996 was 1.5 standard deviation below the mean, which was very common at the time. The board discussed how a score below South Dakota's passing criteria would impact their ability to be licensed in South Dakota if they had been practicing without issue for several years. Following discussion, the board decided that if they receive an application with a testing score that does not meet the criteria used by South Dakota in the past, it will go to the full board for discussion and approval.

APTA-SD FUTURE CONFERENCE DISCUSSION: Weigel discussed the possibility of the board being involved in a conference hosted by SD-APTA that could include collaboration between many stakeholders such as licensees, insurers, regulators, legislators and members from APTA and FSBPT. Although SD-APTA has discussed holding this event in the future, plans have not been finalized. The board will keep this topic, and their potential involvement, on their radar to discuss in the future if SD-APTA moves forward.

SCHEDULE NEXT MEETING(S): Two meetings are scheduled as follows: February 25, 2025, at 11AM MST/12 PM CST via Microsoft Teams and May 13, 2025, at 11AM MDT/12 PM CDT via Microsoft Teams.

EXECUTIVE SESSION PURSUANT TO SDCL 1-25-2: Ahrendt made a motion to enter executive session at 12:49 PM CST. Schmitz seconded the motion. **MOTION PASSED** by unanimous voice vote.

Berg-Poppe declared an end to executive session at 12:51 PM CST.

COMPLAINTS/INVESTIGATIONS: None to report.

RATIFICATION ON RE-ENTRY APPLICATIONS: Schmitz made a motion to ratify the following reentry applications. Weigel seconded the motion. MOTION PASSED by unanimous voice vote.

Application #220: Complete 30 hours of continuing education; complete PEAT practice exam through FSBPT with a score of at least 600 on each section prior to licensure.

Application #221: Complete 30 hours of continuing education prior to licensure.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS: Tellinghuisen Geddes reported the board had recently been issued their ORI number which will improve the background check process for applicants to be simpler and more efficient. Berg-Poppe reported that SD-APTA is completing their on-boarding paperwork with CEU Locker, and that should be up and running soon.

Thuringer made a motion to adjourn at 12:58 PM CST. Suel seconded the motion. **MOTION PASSED** by unanimous voice vote.

1-27-1.17. Draft minutes of public meeting to be available--Exceptions--Violation as misdemeanor. The unapproved, draft minutes of any public meeting held pursuant to § 1-25-1 that are required to be kept by law shall be available for inspection by any person within ten business days after the meeting. However, this section does not apply if an audio or video recording of the meeting is available to the public on the governing body's website within five business days after the meeting. A violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor. However, the provisions of this section do not apply to draft minutes of contested case proceedings held in accordance with the provisions of chapter 1-26.

An Act to revise licensure and supervision requirements for physical therapists and physical therapist assistants.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

Section 1. That § 36-10-27 be AMENDED:

5		36-10-27. A person seeking licensure to practice physical therapy in this state
6	shall:

36-10-35.8. A physical therapist may not, at any one time, supervise more than the equivalent of two full-time physical therapist assistants. The supervising physical therapist shall register, with the State Board of Physical Therapy, the name and address of each physical therapist assistant whom the physical therapist is supervising. The registration must be on a form provided by the board, and submitted at least fifteen days prior to the date on which supervision is to commence.

The supervising physical therapist shall, within ten days of termination, provide written notification to the board, if the supervision of a physical therapist assistant is terminated. The supervising physical therapist may delegate responsibility for the supervision of a physical therapist assistant to another physical therapist, for a period not exceeding thirty days.

Section 5. That § 36-10-35.9 be AMENDED:

- **36-10-35.9.** When supervising a physical therapist assistant's care of a patient—at <u>in</u> any setting, the supervising physical therapist shall comply with the following standards of supervision:
- (1) The supervising physical therapist shall be accessible either in person or by telecommunications to the physical therapist assistant at all times while the physical therapist assistant is treating patients;
- (2) The initial visit shall be made by the supervising physical therapist for evaluation of the patient and establishment of a plan of care;
- (3) At least every five physical therapist assistant visits, there shall be a joint visit or a treatment rendered by the supervising physical therapist. The physical therapist assistant shall be supervised by the supervising physical therapist at least once every thirty calendar days. Every five physical therapist assistant visits or every thirty days, whichever occurs first, a documented conference with the physical therapist assistant outlining current treatment goals and program modifications shall occur. The supervising physical therapist shall make the final scheduled visit to terminate the plan of care; and
- (4) Each visit by the supervising physical therapist shall include:
- (a) A complete assessment of the patient;
 - (b) A review of the plan of care with appropriate revision or termination; and
- 32 (c) Assessment and recommendation for utilization of outside resources Before
 33 assigning the physical therapist assistant to the patient for physical therapy

1		procedures and related tasks, the supervising physical therapist must perform a
2		comprehensive assessment of the patient and establish a plan of care;
3	(2)	The supervising physical therapist must be present at least one of every ten patient
4		visits or one patient visit every thirty calendar days, whichever occurs sooner, while
5		the physical therapist assistant is performing physical therapy procedures and
6		related tasks. The supervising physical therapist may be present through the use
7		of interactive audio and visual communications technology. During each visit at
8		which the supervising physical therapist is required to be present, the supervising
9		physical therapist shall reassess the patient, review the plan of care, and if
10		appropriate, make changes to or terminate the plan of care; and
11	(3)	During any other patient visit at which the supervising physical therapist is not
12		required to be present, the supervising physical therapist must be immediately
13		available for consultation and direction, either in person or by telecommunications
14		technology, while the physical therapist assistant is performing physical therapy
15		procedures and related tasks.
