We have an opportunity to do something few people anywhere in the world, at any time in history, have ever done. To celebrate and commemorate the 250th anniversary of the republic in which we live.

From 1776 to today, the Declaration of Independence has provided the unifying idea that we and



past Americans have aimed to achieve. It advances the central ideas that equality and individual rights are the ends for which our

government strives. In 1776, no government on earth expressed such aspirations. This idea is a powerful one that inspired Revolutionary soldiers and sailors, the citizens of the new nation, the American people since, and political movements abroad. The United States was unique in the world in 1776 and still today it remains one of the few nations where the people rule and individual rights are protected. Balancing forces us to constantly balance the tensions. Therefore, our domestic tranquility is often elusive.

South Dakota was founded by Civil War veterans. They understood the benefits of the Declaration and the tragedy of such strife, but sacrificed so much so that we today could enjoy the fruits of their service. But that tension remains and requires a knowledgeable and virtuous citizenry to make it work for the benefit of a future for all. Given this, it's fitting that we take this opportunity of the nation's 250th birthday to connect back to the Declaration of Independence, seek to understand its ideas, and renew our commitment by learning how as a nation we have lived it out over the past 250 years. It is fitting that we mark this milestone and appreciate the path traveled getting here. Who is America 250 SD?

Established by Governor Kristi Noem on July 6, 2023 with <u>Executive Order 2023-11</u>, the America 250th South Dakota Commission was created to plan, encourage, develop, coordinate, and promote observances and activities to be held in South Dakota in commemoration of the 250th anniversary of our nation's beginning, in celebration of our present, and in anticipation of our promising future.

Our Mission:

Engage, Educate, and Unite South Dakotans to deepen their understanding of American History, South Dakota history, and the democratic process through education; increased engagement in our communities and civic affairs by coordinating a statewide celebration of the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States.

Our Duties:

To encourage, plan, develop, and execute programs, projects, and activities to **commemorate** the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States.

- To encourage private organizations, State and local governments to organize and participate in activities commemorating the Semiquincentennial of the United States.
- To facilitate and coordinate activities throughout South Dakota relating to the Semiquincentennial of the United States.
- To serve as a clearinghouse for the collection and dissemination of information about events and plans for the Semiquincentennial of the United States.
- To develop recommendations for State departments and the Governor for commemorating the Semiquincentennial of the United States.

Proving up the Declaration:

These should be educational events that illuminate how Americans have worked to make the ideals of the Declaration of Independence a reality. Events featuring or discussing the history of American Indian rights, women's suffrage, various minority communities, property rights, etc could all be examples of how Americans have striven towards the right of, "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness" while making sure that our society reflects that all people are, "created equal."

Preserving Local History

This kind of effort would focus on improving the historic nature of a specific place, building, neighborhood, or setting with the goal of restoring it to reflect its historic design or purpose.

Toward the Tricentennial

These kinds of actions invest in the nation's citizens who would be experiencing the nation's Tricentennial in 2076. Educational activities to children and young adults would be an example or creating things that could be enjoyed by people in 2076 such as artwork, poetry, historical books and essays, that would enhance their understanding of the nation's past.

America 250 SD Committees

State Commemorative

Mission: To develop ideas for state-level events. Encourage Gubernatorial and Legislative involvement. To assist and facilitate relationship building and opportunities to produce these events beginning in 2024.

Community Commemorative

Mission: To develop ideas for execution in individual counties and communities commemorating the Semiquincentennial of the United States. To originate templates for a model county celebration and suggest opportunities for America250 partnership and guidance to counties.

Education and Engagement

Mission: To cultivate concepts and ideas for education about commemorating the Semiquincentennial of the United States. To identify target audiences and corresponding opportunities to engage them in education and commemorative activities. To originate ideas for speaking events, books, artwork, music, web content and social platforms.
