

36-8-15. Fee for annual renewal--Duration of renewal.

The fee for annual license renewal of a podiatrist may not exceed five hundred dollars, as promulgated by rule, pursuant to chapter 1-26, by the Board of Podiatry Examiners. Each license renewal shall remain in full force and effect for one year, unless a different time is fixed by rule promulgated, pursuant to chapter 1-26, by the Board of Podiatry Examiners.

All licenses must be renewed annually by December 31. There is no grace period. Podiatrists are not allowed to practice podiatry with an expired license.

Original License Renewal Declaration, required CME documentation, and the license renewal fee of \$750.00 must be submitted to the board office annually by December 31. A delinquent renewal fee of \$100.00 is required in addition to the annual renewal fee for any renewal received after December 31 and before June 30.
