Federal Grants-in-aid Distribution Plan, FFY 2024**

Mission: The State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) manages the National Register of Historic Places program of the National Park Service in South Dakota. The SHPO surveys, inventories, and works to register historic properties; monitors state, federal, and local government activities which affect cultural and historic resources; provides advice on preservation methods; promotes public education on historical properties; and supports municipal and county historic preservation commissions to advance the state's economic, social, and educational objectives.

1. Due to the two Continuing Resolutions the National Park Service (NPS) was operating under in January 2024, NPS allowed SHPOs to apply for a partial apportionment of the funding available for NPS programs. The 2024 **partial apportionment** for SD SHPO is **\$454,795**. SHPO's application for this partial apportionment was submitted to NPS on March 7, 2024.
2. Although NPS has not yet released a Notice of Funding Opportunity for the remainder of the 2024 apportionment, on March 4, 2024, NCSHPO indicated that Congress had just approved what amounts to level funding for SHPOs for 2024. The **estimated total appropriation** for FFY 2024 is, therefore, **\$896,513**, the same as what was granted in FFY 2023. The remaining apportionment, therefore, is estimated at \$441,718.
3. After the annual work plan was approved during the December meeting of the State Review Board, the rates for the Bureau of Information and Technology (BIT) have increased 83%, leaving us unable to fund all of the projects as initially planned.
4. The below table represents the revised federal projected funding areas for 2024 (**allocated funds in bold**). The original projected funding areas remain with original funding allocations in parentheses for reference.
