Full time inspectors are in charge of the markets in the inspection area and perform country inspections.

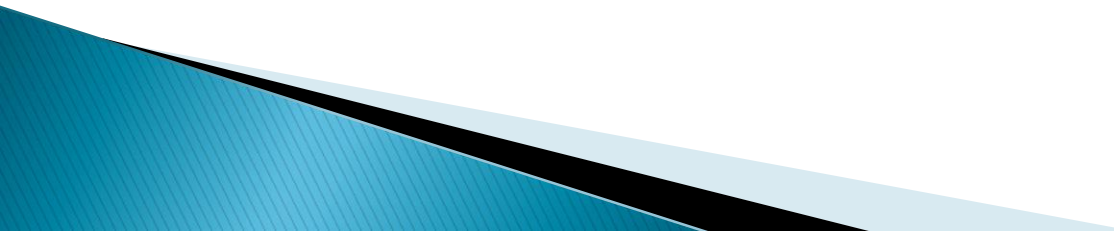
Part time/Local inspectors will help at the markets and perform country inspections.

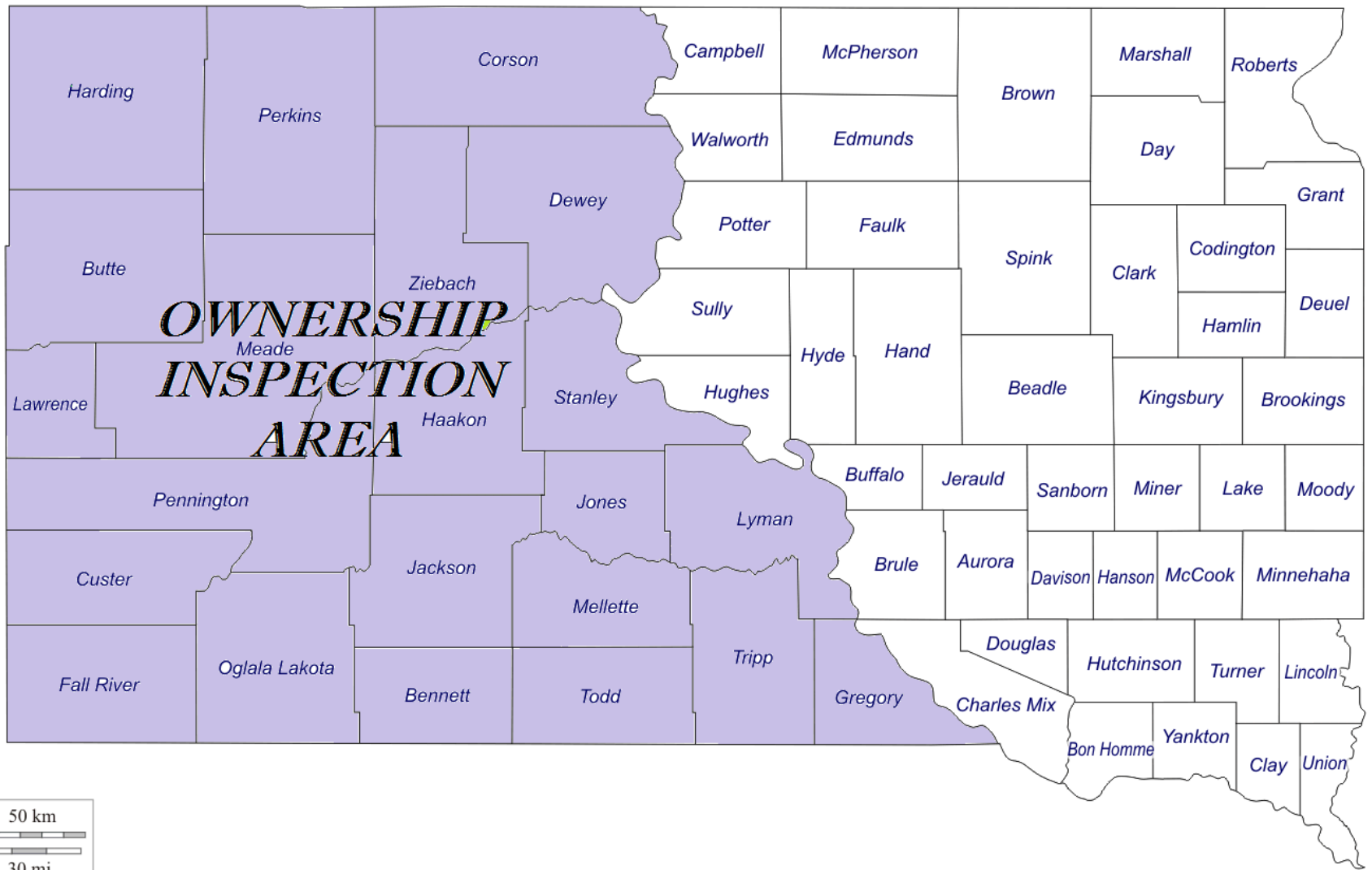
Local inspectors do inspections in the country.



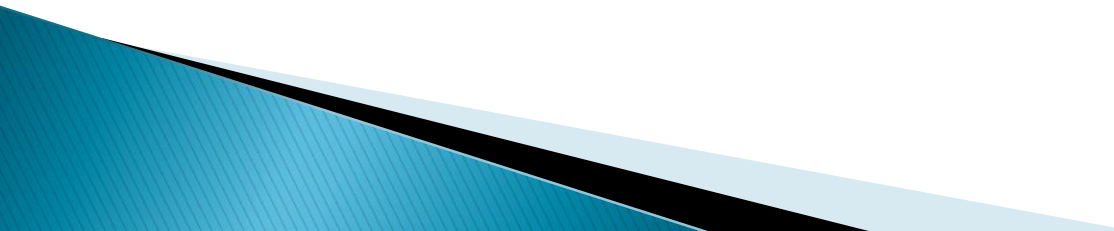
Local Inspections

Brand inspections are required when:

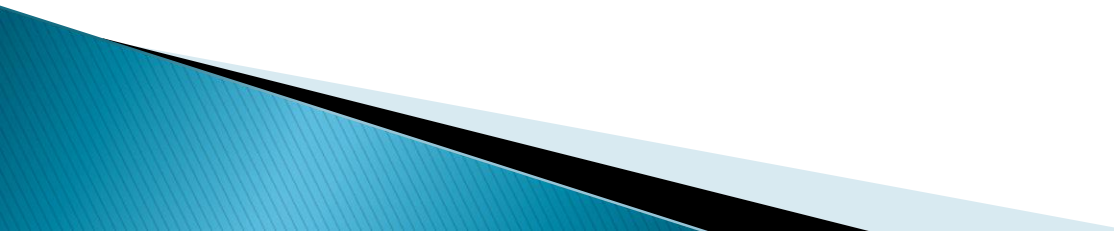
- ▶ There is a change of ownership
 - ▶ Leaving the brand inspection area
 - ▶ Slaughter commercial/home use
 - ▶ Lifetime horse permits
 - ▶ Rodeo permits
 - ▶ Inventory purposes
 - ▶ Violation inspections
- 



Proof of Ownership

- ▶ Owner's recorded and healed brand
 - ▶ A local inspection from in-state or out-of-state
 - ▶ Market clearance
 - ▶ Inspectors receipt
 - ▶ Bill of sale notarized or witnessed by two people other than the seller and buyer
 - ▶ An affidavit of ownership

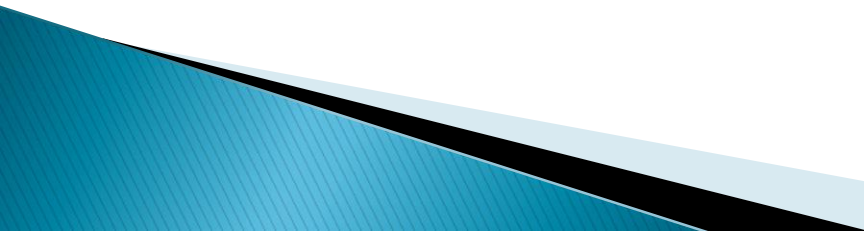
Grazing Permit

- ▶ Required for cattle imported for grazing or feeding bearing an out-of-state brand
 - ▶ Aids in the recovery of strays
 - ▶ Traceability
- 

Trail Permit

- ▶ Border of inspection area dividing property
- ▶ For trailing livestock only
- ▶ Designated area for movement of livestock without inspection

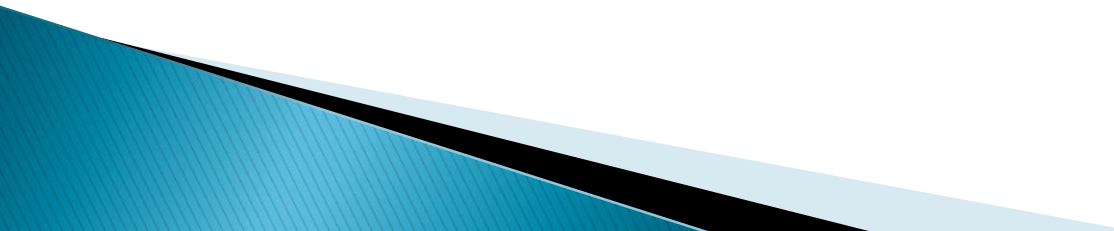
Shipper Permit

- ▶ Transport livestock to designated open markets to be sold.
 - ▶ Livestock is inspected prior to selling at the market.
 - ▶ Producers can call the 1-800 number at the Brand Board office to acquire a shipper permit number up to 48 hrs. in advance of shipment.
 - ▶ Producers can have any inspector give them a shipper permit 48 hrs. in advance of shipment.

Lifetime Horse Permit

- ▶ Allows the owner to travel out of the inspection area
- ▶ Reciprocity with other inspection states

Rodeo Permits

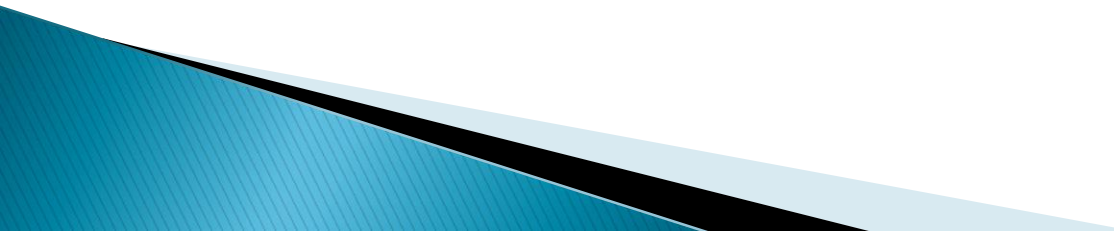
- ▶ Allows stock contractors to travel out of the inspection area
 - ▶ Reciprocity with other inspection states

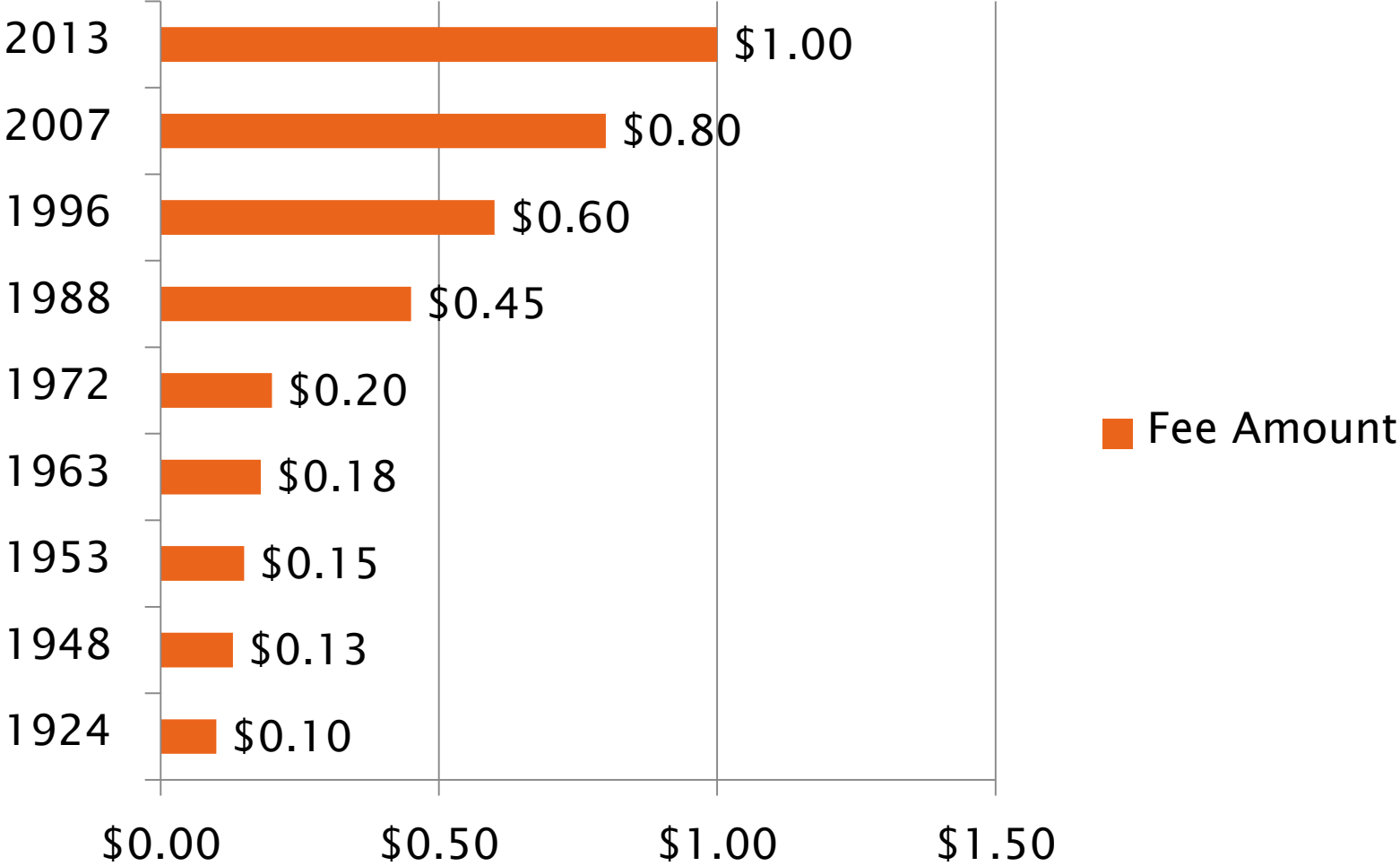

Inspection Costs

- ▶ Mileage at state rate – \$.42/mile
 - ▶ Local inspection – \$1.00/Head
 - ▶ Lifetime horse permit – \$20/Head
 - ▶ Rodeo permit fee – \$100 plus \$1.00/Head
 - ▶ Shipper permit – No Fee
 - ▶ Trail permit – No Fee
 - ▶ Grazing permit – No Fee

Inspection Fee History

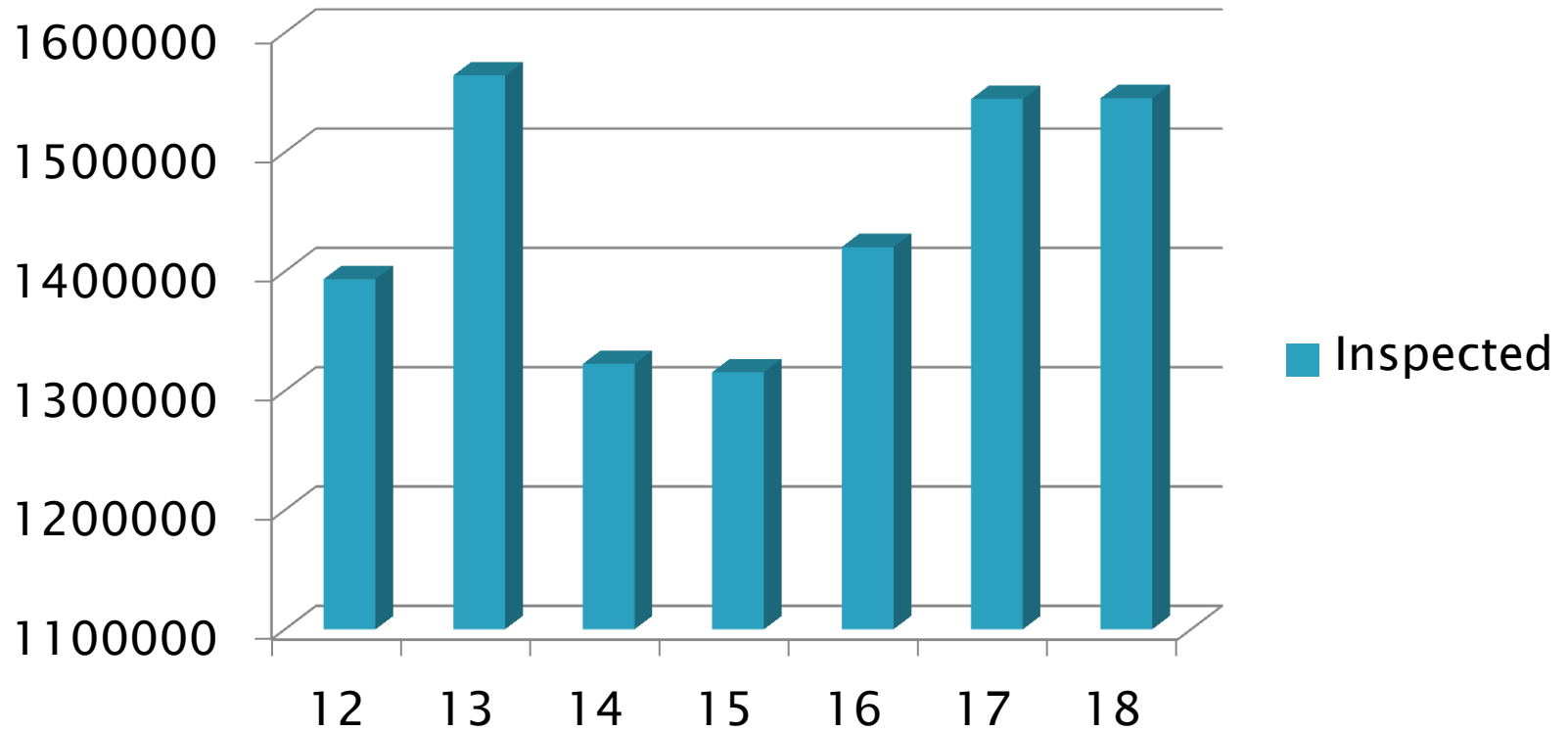


FY 2018 Recovered Strays
