## Challenges and successes

- The NEPA process was delayed due to the sequence of processing with FRA, SHPO and Corps of engineers.
- SHPO determined two of the three bridges are historical, requiring a memorandum of agreement (MOA). The MOA includes research of historical archives and special documentation including specific photos before the bridges are worked on or altered.
- Project was completed in December 2023 and currently in close out phase.
- Total project cost was $\$ 3,921,437$ (federal $\$ 3,137,890$ and match \$784,347.35)

## Challenges and successes

- Project was completed in December 2023.
- Project costs where higher than original estimates.
- RCP\&E and their consultant had issues with contract terms that had to be resolve prior of starting closeout phase.
- Total project cost was \$3,203,409 (federal $\$ 2,240,000$ and match $\$ 963,490$.

## Challenges and successes

- The project was re-designed to fit within the existing ROW, eliminating need to purchase extra ROW.
- Complete environmental processes are required due to construction on undisturbed ground even though it is next to the existing mainline.
- The original estimate was low plus inflation added to the cost. Extra federal funding was approved, keeping under $80 \%$.
- P.E. and NEPA were submitted to FRA for approval March 11.

- Project scope includes 87 miles of new CWR installment, 121 bridges, 11 turnouts, 122 crossings, and 4 new hot wheel detectors all in 165 track miles.
- Project was awarded November 2021 and must have a funding contract signed by September 2024.
- PE and NEPA were submitted to FRA for approval on September 12, 2023.

- The existing building for the mechanic pit was destroyed by a storm in May 2022.
- A new building will need to be built.
- PE and NEPA were submitted to FRA for approval November 21, 2023.

## Challenges and Successes

- Projects in waterways tend to require in depth environmental research and Hydrologic and Hydraulic (H\&H) Study.
- Extensive hydraulic, environmental and archeological requirements might overburden the budget.
- A request from RCP\&E to reduce the project scope will be submitted to SD Railroad Board for approval at a future meeting.
