





CASA CASES ASSIGNED AND WAITING LIST




South Dakota Judicial Circuits and Counties CASA Coverage

Vision for Additional Funds

Three-pronged, multi-year approach
New program start-up (development)
Expansion of current programs
Marketing

New Program Development/Start-Up -Reserve \$500,000

- Support new program development (5th and 6th Circuit)
- Proposal will need to demonstrate sustainability
 - Matching Funds
 - Strategic Plan
 - Entire Circuit Coverage
- Developing new program board members will need to work with state association and National CASA
- Proposals will be accepted by the CASA Commission as needed

Expansion of Existing Program -Reserve \$400,000 to \$450,000

- Proposals with SMART goals (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, Time-bound)
 - Expanding into counties not served
 - Volunteer recruitment and retention
 - Tribal member volunteer recruitment and retention
 - Assist Tribal Court when CASA volunteer is requested
- Proposals due to the CASA Commission at set dates each year
- Report to the CASA Commission on expansion efforts/outcomes due at set date (matrix report with specific data)

Marketing - Reserve \$50,000 to \$100,000

- Proposals with SMART goals (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, Time-bound)
 - Greater consideration for collaborative marketing plans among the CASA programs
- Annual proposals due to the CASA Commission at set date
- Report to the CASA Commission on efforts/outcomes of the marketing project due at set date (matrix data)

Funding Timeframe:

Joint Appropriations Committee didn't set a time limit

Suggest Three - Seven Years (assess annually)

Expectations

- Annual reports, accomplishments and SMART goals matrix and outcomes to be submitted to the State Court Administrator's Office (State CASA Association)
- Reports will be submitted to the SD CASA Commission and available for the SD Legislators and Joint Appropriations Committee

* Funds will also support the expenses of existing local CASA program staff, boards, volunteers and CASA Commission to assist with expanding CASA programs and volunteers in South Dakota.
