# **ARPA Recipients**

- · States and D.C. (\$195.3 billion)
  - South Dakota \$975 million
- Counties (\$65.1 billion)
  - South Dakota \$172 million
- Metropolitan cities (\$45.6 billion)
  - Sioux Falls \$25.56 million
  - Rapid City \$13.03 million
- Non-Metropolitan Cities (\$19.5 billion)
  - South Dakota \$62 million
- Tribal governments (\$20.0 billion)
- Territories (\$4.5 billion)



# **Use of ARPA Funds**

- Support Public Health Response
   Fund COVID-19 mitigation efforts, medical expenses, behavioral healthcare, and certain public health and safety staff
- Address Negative Economic Impacts
   Respond to economic harms to workers,
   families, small businesses, impacted
   industries, and the public sector
- Replace Public Sector Revenue Loss
   Use funds to provide government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue experienced due to the pandemic



# **Use of ARPA Funds**

- Premium Pay for Essential Workers
   Offer additional support to those who have and will bear the greatest health risks because of their service in critical infrastructure sector
- Water and Sewer Infrastructure
   Make necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking water and invest in wastewater and stormwater infrastructure
- Broadband Infrastructure
   Make necessary investments to provide unserved or underserved locations with new or expanded broadband access



# Water and Wastewater Project Eligibilities

 Projects eligible under the Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund programs are eligible to receive ARPA funds.



# **SRF Project Eligibilities**

# **CWSRF Projects**

- All publicly owned wastewater treatment and conveyance
- Storm water
- Nonpoint source (NPS) pollution
  - Bank stabilization
  - Certain components of landfill projects
  - Agricultural BMP's
- Drainage and flood control projects are ineligible

# **DWSRF Projects**

- Most water
  - storage
  - treatment distribution
  - source development
- Domestic use
  - not primarily for industrial use
- Cannot fund projects primarily for future growth or fire protection
  - i.e. new housing developments

# **ARP vs. SRF Comparison**

### **Similarities**

- Project eligibilities identical
- Contractor procurement requirements
- American made iron and steel (ARP preferred vs SRF required)
- Wage rate requirements ??

### **Differences**

- Eligible recipients no limitations (ARP)
- Engineering procurement requirements (ARP)
- Environmental reviews (SRF)
- Grant funds not loans (ARP)



# **Important Dates**

- Costs incurred prior to March 3, 2021 are not eligible
- Funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024
- Funds must be fully spent by December 31, 2026



# **ARP Unknowns**

- Timing
- Fund distribution
  - State Water Plan process (DANR preference)
  - Direct legislative appropriation
- Amount of funds available for water and wastewater projects
- Use of funding by counties
- Contractor and material availability



# DANR Proposal for Distribution of State ARPA Funds

- Use normal State Water Planning process
- Projects should expect an SRF loan to be part of the funding package
- Projects likely to receive minimum percent of ARP grant funds
  - Retroactive to previously funded projects?



# **State Water Plan Process**

- Water, wastewater, and stormwater projects seeking DANR Funding must be on the State Water Plan
  - One-page application form
  - Preliminary engineering report or facilities plan (flexible on what is necessary)
  - Eligibility & Priority Point Selfassessment for DWSRF (drinking water projects only)




# **Application Timelines**

- State Water Plan Applications
  - October 1st
  - Amendment applications 1st of February, May or August
  - Projects remain on SWP for 2 years or prorated portion for amendments
- Funding Applications due 1st of January, April, July or October
