The percentage increments aimed at elevating South Dakota's regional ranking to 1-3 are derived from the average teacher salaries in FY22 + the respective state aid index factors for each regional state legislature, thereby inflating the numbers to an estimate of the FY24 averages. The pay increase options include the 7% index factor because that is what South Dakota State Aid was already budgeted at in FY24. To illustrate, this approach operates on the assumption that if South Dakota had experienced a 26% higher target teacher salary in FY24, it could have secured the region's top ranking in average teacher salary. Ultimately, teacher salaries are a local decision set by school districts, and the "target teacher salary" is part of the State Aid formula used for budgetary purposes. This is the reason why historically there is a difference between the "target teacher salary" and the "actual" average teacher salary.
